From the Interim Pastor

"Putting an end to childish things..."

"When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways."

I Corinthians 13:11

Last month I had the opportunity to participate in the "Preschool in the Park" program. Annette Wilcox, our new preschool director, her staff, and members of the Preschool Board welcomed new parents and preschool children to a morning of activities in our church grove.

It was interesting to observe the preschoolers and parents as they got out of their cars and walked toward the pavilion where Mrs. Wilcox was registering them. Some of the children were excited and ran to see what was going on. Others were more cautious and held their parents' hands as they walked timidly toward the pavilion. One or two preschoolers were downright terrified and clutched tenaciously to their mother's waist, resisting every step. I think the parents had similar reactions, although they put on a good front and were more experienced in covering up their uncertainties.

After the children were registered the teachers and helpers broke them up into small groups with activities from storytelling to crafts to planting flowers to playing games to painting the sidewalk with water. It was fascinating to see how these preschoolers overcame their initial anxieties once they got involved in their activities. Their little personalities emerged and they were filled with new life. The one little boy who was so shy at the start couldn't stop talking with excitement!

Going home that day I began to think about how we Christians are just as timid when it comes to spiritual matters. We are reluctant to talk about our faith. Some of us are afraid to pray in public. Some are downright terrified to attend any adult education classes because we feel too uncertain of ourselves and what we believe.

Believe it or not, that's the way it should be! The Apostle Paul reminds us, "Now we speak and think and reason like children... Now we see in a mirror dimly... Now we know only in part..." (I Corinthians13.9-12) We aren't supposed to have all the answers.

But we are supposed to seek opportunities to grow in our faith. We are supposed to educate ourselves about the Bible. We are supposed to practice praying together. And this is why we come to Church. We come to Church not to find all the answers, but to grow in our relationship with God.

We at Union UCC are blessed to have many different opportunities to grow in our faith: Sunday worship, Bible studies, adult education programs, mission projects, social activities....

We can be just as excited or timid, just as resistant or uncertain, just as stubborn or unwilling to come to Church as those preschoolers coming to "Preschool in the Park." But I'm here to tell you that if you let yourself get involved here, your little personality will emerge and you too will be filled with new life. Give us a try!

Consistory Minutes

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, August 17, 2015 by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report and July/August 2015 bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee reported that Vacation Bible School used the entire property in fine fashion and was a great event for all. Usage of the grove this summer has gone very well; everyone is enjoying the new pavilion and surrounding grounds. There are plans to plant at least three new trees next Spring. In the basement kitchen, the old pass through doors have been removed, new roll-up doors will be installed next month, and a new grease trap has been installed. Two week-long summer music and acting camps were held and went well.

Christian Education Committee reported on The Safe Child Policy as well as the possibility of having committee

co-chairs to share in committee responsibilities.

Mission Committee reported that school supplies are being collected, the Northern Lehigh Foodbank is being supported and that Vacation Bible School was successful again this year.

Church and Ministry provided the Open & Affirming Ad Hoc Team's recommendation on how to approach the Open & Affirming process. Church and Ministry presented the Senior Pastor Search Committee nominees. Also presented was a final listing of inactive members that will receive a letter indicating they will be removed from the Church register.

The next regular meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory will be held Monday, September 21, at 7:00 p.m. in Room 101.

LPT Sub-teams, working with existing Committees, have developed outcomes, goals and plans for each Key Area for the next 3-5 years and developed a **draft Union UCC Plan for Ministry & Mission for your review and refinement at 2 Congregational Forums on Sunday, September 27th, at 9:15-10:15 AM and 11:45-12:45 PM in Memorial Hall. We want and need your input so please plan to attend these Forums!**

The **Search Committee** was established by Consistory, 8/17/15, and includes Sue Ondrey, Ardith Kuhns, Teresa Dalrymple, Donna Christman, Dave Fleming [Chair], Carrington Smith, Phil Wehr, Don Penrod, Aften Hamm & Dennis Foster. They will soon begin developing Union's Local Church Profile, utilizing input from the LPT and the Congregation. The **Search Committee will be installed** in worship on September 27th, 2015. **In September we will continue to gather input from the congregation on the pastoral skills, leadership attributes and expectations you have for your next Sr. Pastor. Please respond to those requests - we**

encourage, want, need and appreciate your input. Thank you.

We are ahead of schedule to complete the final Profile and final Plan for Ministry & Mission and request Congregational endorsement at the January 24th, 2016 semi-annual Congregational Meeting. The Search for your next Senior Pastor will commence in February 2016, 2 months ahead of our original schedule!

The children in the front never knew what to expect would fly off the stage....from ping pong balls, to balloons to toilet paper!
- We enjoyed celebrating Pastor Kris's 50th birthday with her!
- We ended our week with a celebration in the grove, where the children sang songs they learned during the
 week, experienced a science demonstration by Mr. Bill from Mad Science in the Lehigh Valley, and enjoyed
 yummy ice cream sundaes (donated by Lisa Blose and Friendly's).

Children's Church

September 20th – Children's Church opens it's doors during the 10:30 worship service. Three year olds through sixth grade join us after Children's Time in the sanctuary. 1st-6th Grade move to Room 7 for a large group lesson, songs and prayer, and then we move to grade level classrooms for age appropriate activities. Preschoolers and Kindergarteners meet and stay in room 100. Parents meet their children at their classrooms after the worship service. Grade levels are combined to support the "Safe Child" policy and to ensure a sufficient number of volunteers for each classroom.

5th and 6th Grade - Room 4

We will use the WHIRL curriculum for the second year. This curriculum is lectionary and includes videos and leaflets. PARENTS: There are many great ideas in the leaflets to explore during the week. Our Preschool/K classroom will use 'Lil K, a "Blue's Clues" for Sunday School video program.

Open and Affirming Ad Hoc Team Recommendation Approved by Consistory

At their June 15th meeting Consistory authorized the Open and Affirming [O&A] Ad Hoc Team to develop a recommendation on how to approach the O&A process. The O&A Ad Hoc Team presented their recommendation to Consistory at their 8/17/15 meeting and Consistory approved it. The key points of the approved approach/process are to request Consistory revisit and address the marriage equality policy this Fall, to offer a variety of educational opportunities on this topic in September & October, to provide two [2] Congregational Forums on October 4th to engage the congregation in hearing and sharing perspectives with Consistory & Church & Ministry members, and, to provide Consistory with a proposed revised policy on marriage equality in October, requesting they vote on it in November. The more comprehensive O&A process remains a priority but will be deferred until a Senior Pastor has been called. More information on the approach and process will be provided in a congregational mailing, in early September.

General Synod Report By David Fleming

United Church of Christ's 39th General Synod in Cleveland

The theme of the 30th General Synod of the United Church of Christ was "Finding God in Unexpected Places."

I had the honor of substituting for our ailing Conference Minister Alan Miller and leading the Penn Northeast Conference delegation of 25 lay and clergy delegates for the five day event (7 days for some of us). Also part of the delegation were Phyllis Hamm as a lay delegate and Aften Hamm as a visitor.

As was the case at my previous 11 General Synods over the last thirty years, General Synod is a time when the national church gathers and we see a larger glimpse of God's Church. General Synod was filled (and I mean 12 hours a day filled) with worship, music (including a jazz vesper service at the Amistad Chapel at our National headquarters), dance, great preaching, excellent and provocative keynote speakers, missionaries, workshops, special events, resolutions, pronouncements, exhibits, fellowship, and fun.

Our delegation spoke on the floor of Synod on several occasions and Rev. Dr. Jane Hess and I led the entire Synod in a moment of prayer for Alan Miller. We were also known as the "bubbles" delegation as we all had a week's supply of bubbles which we spread throughout the convention hall like living water many times each day.

The Rev. Dr. John Dornhauer was elected to be the next President and General Minister of the United Church of Christ.

At General Synod, there are resolutions regarding various issues. The resolutions that are passed by synod speak to congregations and not for them. It is up to each congregation to examine the resolution and decide for itself an appropriate course of action. As part of the Penn Northeast Conference Delegation, I was assigned to the resolution entitled: A Call for Peace, Justice, and Reunification in the Korean Peninsula. That resolution passed.

The other resolutions that were passed by the ${\bf 30}^{\rm th}$ General Synod are: Developing Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged Congregations for Mental Health

A Call for the UCC to Take Actions Toward A Just Peace in the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

A Compassionate Response Just And in the Wake Of The Shooting At Emanuel A.M.E. Church in Charleston, SC

Dismantling Discriminatory Systems of Mass Incarceration in U.S. **Dismantling the New Jim Crow Laws**

Reaffirm Commitment to Full Equality for LGBT Persons Responsible Stewardship of the Outer Space Environment **Resolution Urging Socially Responsible** Investment Practices Transition from Fossil Fuels to Renewable Energy

Rev. Molly Baskette's Friday night opening worship sermon and the keynote Saturday morning by Pulitizer Prize winning columnist Connie Shultz really set the tone for an uplifting and inspiring Synod. On Sunday, Rev. Dwayne Royster challenged us to "Change the Damn World." The worship experiences were powerful, engaging and spirit filled. They represented the diversity of the UCC in terms of their varied styles. During worship especially, we realized the UCC motto "That they all may be one". Holy Communion is always one of the highlights of General Synod. Sunday afternoon, as 4,000 people gathered at the Lord's Table to be fed, we experienced the "body of Christ" in a new and diverse way.

As one of or delegates so aptly put, "The United Church of Christ continues to be a prophetic voice, continuing to seek justice, and equality for all people and spreading God's love for all people throughout the world.

Mission Trip to Africa

Ashleigh Albert went on a mission trip and journey in July to Malawi, Africa where she worked with Grace Community Church and School in the small village of Chikeuse. Read below an excerpt of her account that gave in church.

Many people have asked me if I was scared. The answer is no, it's incredible what can happen when you just have faith in God. Arriving there went without a hitch, but as soon as I stepped out of the airport, I was faced with the reality that the poverty we view on TV does not even begin to show what it really is like in a 3rd world country. It's difficult for pictures to even encapsulate it without truly seeing it for yourself. I have learned so much from these people. Helping in the school, and with all their church events. I had this predisposition that these people would be so unlike me. Unable to understand who I was, my position in coming. But that's so untrue. They're just like us. They have the same worries as us, and they just want to feed their families. They just have a tougher time doing it. That's why it was so touching to experience parts of their life for a brief time.

One man gave me a 5 pound bag of beans. This man grows them for his livelihood. This was probably a week's income, he gave to me as a guest. While I helped a child write some numbers at school, they simultaneously taught me. Each morning I helped at Grace Community School. At the beginning, I observed each of the teachers. After I had shadowed and helped them instruct, upon Wanda's request (the woman I was staying with) I gave each of them teaching suggestions.

Grace Community Church has all sorts of afternoon sessions. I was given the unique opportunity to give some a couple times. I gave the congregation a talk on love at our fellowship meeting, the youth group a talk on being satisfied with what we have, and taught the evangelism meeting a lesson on salvation.

There were times when Wanda and I were without water, and electricity. There isn't any hot water. This happened even at her apartment, considered 'luxurious' compared to everything else. It is not easy for them. The woman really do carry water on their heads, miles and miles. You can see them walking almost any time of the day. One of the most memorable parts was how appreciative they were, even of the simple things I offered. They said time and time again, it is so wonderful you've come. I couldn't escape the question, "when are you coming again?"

I thank the Union UCC youth group and those of you who have individually sponsored my journey from the bottom of my heart. To date, I raised \$2240 in scholarships for the new school that Wanda is working to start. Just \$100 will pay for one child's supplies, books, and all other fees for an entire year. That's 22 kids. That is Christ's love in action.


