Your Lenten Discipline and Your Church

The season of Lent is the 40 weekdays from Ash Wednesday until Easter that Christians use to prepare for Easter. Traditionally it is a time of penitence (reflection, regret, repentance) and fasting (giving up certain foods or giving up certain activities), as a way to reflect on Christ's suffering, death and resurrection. We sometimes call these things that we do a Lenten discipline.

Here at Union UCC we have shared a variety of expressions, traditions and experiences of Lent through the years. In the most recent past, Adult and Children's classes and gatherings would be offered on Wednesday evenings. This year, many of those leaders and participants will be involved in the Leadership Planning Team with Rev. Bill Metzger as we go through the process of preparing for the search for a called pastor. This group has agreed to meet about twice a month.

As a result, the staff and leaders thought it might be best not to have our Wednesday Lenten offerings and instead focus our Lenten discipline on the Leadership Planning Team process. We're asking all of you to do the same. Prayerfully think about your Lenten discipline and see how you might include our church in that discipline in a bigger way this year.

- Would you consider adding additional prayer time in your day and week and include our church, the Leadership Planning Team, our staff and leaders in your prayers?
- Would you be willing to commit to coming to church for an additional activity or worship service already on the calendar as a way to show your prayerful presence and support?
- Would you be willing to contribute an additional Sunday's offering as part of your offering in order to keep our financial situation secure and strong?
- Would you be able to add helping others to your list? See the many donations and opportunities we are always gathering in addition to your Lenten offering envelope which will go to Allentown's Rescue Mission supporting men who are homeless.

My prayer is that as we move from the stars and light of Advent, Christmas and with one another moving toward the empty tomb and cross of Easter.

"Pre-Lenten Reflections"

The Season of Lent is traditionally a time of introspection and reflection. It's a time to take stock of our lives and examine where we are in need of new life and resurrection. Consistory Minutes

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, January 19th, 2015 by President Carrington Smith.

The Treasurer's Report and December/January bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee reported that there is a need for a snow thrower and a salt spreader. The total cost would be \$500.00. A request was made and approved to take the money from Memorial Fund to pay for these items.

Christian Education Committee reported that all classes are going great. The Advent workshop in December went well. This year's Lent Workshop will be scaled down to one day, instead of a program lasting 4 weeks. There was a new law passed in regards to background checks and mandated reporting. Changes definition of a mandated reporter - it is now anyone that comes in contact/responsibility for a child. This changes requirements for background checks. New law requires new clearances every 3 years. Paid employees caring for children are required to submit following information: PA state criminal check, PA child abuse clearances, and FBI fingerprinting. Volunteers are required to do the PA state criminal check and PA child abuse clearance. If volunteers have not lived in PA for 10 years, they will also need the FBI fingerprinting. Christian Ed is looking to increase this item in the budget to cover the cost of this expense for staff and volunteers.

Mission Committee reported that Blanket Sunday is coming up. Souper Bowl Sunday is February $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$. Looking for donations of soup. This year's Lent offering will be given to Allentown Rescue Mission.

Church and Ministry reported that their big topic-Marriage Equality- should be brought up as a major topic during a consistory meeting in the future.

Evangelism Committee reported that dates for the next new members' class are February 15th, 22nd, and March 1st at the 9:15 hour. Tailgate Party is on February 1st. Admission is free with a soup or monetary donation!

Stewardship Committee reported that a lot of offering envelopes still need to be picked up.

Worship Committee reported that Pastor Kris would like us to consider a 4th service on Christmas Eve (earlier in the afternoon). This is topic to talk about later on. A request was made to approach FOLG for 2 CD players for homebound members. This request was approved.

Happy 25th Birthday Neffs Preschool


In 1990, the Union Church formed a committee to research a need for a weekday preschool program. There was some opposition to this as some people believed the church should not be involved in this type of business and others were concerned that this would affect the Sunday School attendance in some way. There was enough interest that the preschool plans went ahead and the first classes began in September, 1990. The first teachers were Bonnie Glose and Sally Simitz. Thirty four children attended the first year. The preschool was under the auspices of the Union Church for the first ten years. During the 2000/2001 school year, sponsorship of the preschool was transferred to the UCC Church when the congregations separated facilities.

Over the course of these twenty five years, preschools have become a necessary prelude to kindergarten. Neffs Preschool has stayed current and kept up with the trends. I-pads are now used as a supplement to enhance learning basic skills such as letters, numbers, motor skills, and social skills. In response to the issue of childhood obesity, an organized gym class has been added to the curriculum. Library time and an age appropriate lending library teach a love of reading. There are field trips, holiday celebrations, and a visit from Santa Claus. The students bring a stuffed animal for the annual Teddy Bear Clinic which helps familiarize the children to basic medical care and includes a visit inside an ambulance. Fire safety is taught and the children always enjoy their tour of a real fire truck. Monthly Chapel Time allows the children to visit the church sanctuary and to become familiar with the pastors and the Christian Education director. The preschool has both a website and a facebook page which is filled with photos of the students having fun at school. Over the years, the church has had many new members join because their children attended the preschool. Five years ago, the preschool established a \$250 annual scholarship for a graduating senior who began their academic career here.

Neffs Preschool functions under the auspices of the consistory but is managed by its own board of directors and has its own budget. It has contributed to numerous building improvements in the preschool area which included new bathrooms, painting, wall-papering, new ceilings, and lighting which also benefit the Children's Church and Sunday School classes who share the space. Playground equipment has been kept up to date and the preschool children as well as the community can enjoy the beautiful church grove.

The success and longevity of the preschool is a testament to the dedication of both the staff and board and is quite an accomplishment in a time when other area preschools are closing their doors.

RX Corner

This year's influenza season has made the news headlines more than once. The vaccine that was formulated, while effective for several virus strains, is not protective against all the circulating strains. Despite the media reports, influenza vaccines are still recommended for anyone that hasn't already received one for the 2014-2015 season. Other than hand washing, vaccines are the most important line of defense against the virus.

Antibiotics are not effective in treating influenza, since the flu is caused by a virus. Influenza can be managed through prescription antiviral medication, such as oseltamivir (Tamiflu ®). The mainstay of treating influenza involves symptom management. Since even antiviral medications can't cure the virus immediately, attention is given to specific symptoms and preventing discomfort. Many over the counter products are used; for example, acetaminophen (Tylenol ®) can be used to treat fevers, pseudoephedrine (Sudafed ®) can be used to treat congestion, or guaifenesin (Robitussin ®) can be used to control coughing.

It is important to read the labels of all medications before purchasing or using them. Many "cough and cold" or "cold and flu" formulations contain multiple ingredients, which could potentially lead to taking more medication than necessary for the symptoms you are treating. Only use products that are treating the exact symptoms you are experiencing. Additionally, make sure you aren't "doubling up" on medications that could be included in more than one product. The product name doesn't always indicate what the main ingredient is, but all ingredients will always be listed on the label, along with dosing instructions and precautions.

Ask your doctor or pharmacist for recommendations in treating your symptoms.

"If people can't see what God is doing, they stumble all over themselves. But when they attend to what God reveals, they are most blessed." Proverbs 29:18 [MSG]

The work of our Intentional Interim is underway! On Saturday morning, 1/10/15, Memorial Hall was "alive" with the sound of almost 60 members of the Leadership Planning Team [LPT] as we started the planning and visioning work of our Intentional Interim. We engaged in Bible Study, shared where we have experienced God's grace within the life and ministry of Union UCC and reviewed the entire 3 Phase process we are following. The LPT is comprised of ~60 staff and members who were nominated as individuals within Union UCC who have a heart for Christ's church, possess the following leadership criteria and who would be a valuable member of the LPT and this process:

Criteria for Christian leadership:

- emotionally healthy, stable, level headed and spiritually centered folks; who are well differentiated, have a pretty solid sense of their own assets and liabilities, know and keep boundaries and are able to rise above destructive anxiety and unhealthy emotional processes,
- 2. relying on God's grace, live the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, faithfulness, generosity and self-control [Galatians 5],
- demonstrate a contrite heart -- not looking to blame others but more interested in attending to their own functioning and having an interest in reconciliation, healing and hope, and,
- 4. willing to sign a covenant for how we are to model healthy Christian leadership and hold self and others accountable to it.

From those recommendations invitations were extended to about 80 staff and members whose responses were overwhelmingly positive and enthusiastic with ~60 leaders and staff members agreeing to serve on the LPT which will be meeting ~twice each month.

During January and February we will be answering and sharing our responses to the *Miracle Question* which asks..."If you could flip a switch on the wall and instantaneously a miracle would take place and Union UCC would look just like God wished it would... describe what you would see." We also are responding to and sharing our responses to what I call "seed starter" sentences some of which start with phrases like: The best churches..., I hear God calling us to..., My biggest fear is..., My strongest hope is..., I am proud that this church..., I am disappointed that this church..., My hunch is God wants Union UCC to become more... and we will begin to refine and develop a *Covenant for Christian Leadership* on how we are called to behave as leaders and members of the church, the "body of Christ".
