

Dementia is a set of symptoms that include memory loss, difficulties with thinking, problem solvir or language.

On a visit to a different parishioner, she and several of her "housemates" were singing Christmas carols. They knew the tunes and the words and sang out with vigor. Although each of these people suffere with some type of dementia, it was clear that they were experiencing great joy in sharing familiar carols with each other.

In Proverbs 29:18 [MSG] we read..."If people can't see what God is doing, they stumble all over themselves. But when they attend to what God reveals, they are most blessed."

The work of our Intentional Interim is underway! In November and early December 2014, forty nine lay leaders and staff members were asked to identify and nominate individuals within Union UCC who have a heart for Christ's church, demonstrate healthy leadership and who they believed would be a valuable member of the Leadership Planning Team [LPT] and this process. Responses to this invitation will be tallied the week of December 15th, 2014, and we are expecting 55-70 staff and leaders to be serving on the LPT. Thank you to all who have agreed to serve on the LPT.

From January to July 2015, I will assist and guide the LPT and Union UCC through Phase 1 of discerning your future ministry and mission, nurturing healthy church leadership, doing the work of the intentional interim and drafting portions of your Local Church Profile which will be used to search for your next permanent Senior Pastor. The LPT will be identifying your congregational gifts & graces, modeling how we are called by



Happy 2015! Many people will make New Year's resolutions on January 1st. The beginning of a new calendar year signifies a time of change, renewal, and a fresh start. No matter what your resolution is, it is tough to stay committed throughout the year. Below are some tips to help keep you on track, stay motivated, and accomplish your goal.

- · Start small- Set a measurable, realistic resolution that you can tackle over a specified time. If you plan to exercise more, schedule a few walks with friends or sessions at the gym three or four times a week. A mad seven-day stretch will burn you out faster and be harder to stick with.

- · Talk about it! Telling your family and friends about your goals allows them to encourage you, offer ongoing support, and help you avoid triggers and bad habits. Or, share your struggles and successes among a support group. Tackling a goal together makes the process less intimidating and helps keep you accountable.
- **Reward achievements** when you reach a portion of your goal, find a small way to celebrate your accomplishment. Recognizing your progress will help keep you focused and remain excited about the overall goal.
- **Remember you are human** No one is perfect, and keep in mind you'll have better days than others. A bad day (or week) isn't a reason to give up. Resolve to recover, learn from your mistakes, and get back on track. A resolution is a marathon- not a sprint!
