#### Through the Search Journey at Union UCC Pastor Kris

You might be feeling that this time in your life feels like a wilderness or that the time we live in is a wilderness. Or maybe this time of preparing to call a new Senior Pastor feels a bit like a wilderness too. Lent is often described as a time of being in the wilderness as well. We will walk through this wilderness time, as people of faith and as a church, together and with God.

The pastors and church leaders have created a series of prayers and **devotions** that will be posted on our facebook page, sent as a weekly email, and printed for Sunday's bulletin during the six weeks of Lent. Include your church more intentionally in your Lenten wilderness experience. Add the church, the Leadership Planning Team, our staff and leaders to your prayer list each day; come to church for an additional activity or worship service to show your prayerful presence and support; contribute an additional Sunday's offering in order to keep us strong and healthy; and help and serve others through donations of time and money through opportunities offered here. Through these and other disciplines I know that you will grow in your understanding and awareness of God's love and grace in your life and in our church.

### From the Interim Pastor

#### "Lenten Reflections"

The Season of Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days.

In his book, *The Solace of Fierce Landscapes*, theologian Belden Lane explores the impulse that draws spiritual seekers into the wilderness. At the same time he is exploring wilderness spirituality, he is reflecting on his mother's long struggle with Alzheimer's and cancer, and he reflects on her experience in a nursing home as a kind of spiritual wilderness in itself. He concludes, "There is an unaccountable solace that fierce landscapes offer to the soul. They heal, as well as mirror, the brokenness we find within."

Jesus' experience in the wilderness... Belden Lane's reflections on wilderness spirituality... and his experience with his mother's life in a nursing home... all teach us the spiritual power of leaving the comfort of our lives to experience the presence of God in new and deeper ways.

Whatever wilderness experiences you encounter during this Season of Lent, may you discover the power of God's goodness and love in new and deeper ways.

### **Hospital Info Update:**

If you are in the hospital, please ask a family member, friend, or the hospital chaplain to call a pastor or the church office to let us know if you'd like us to visit. Please do not rely on the church code system to tell us since it has proven to be inconsistent with information. Our church code is 511 and if you are listed correctly, when we call the chaplain's office, you will appear under our number. Usually the pastors do hospital visits on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays hoping they will catch everyone at some point during their stay. We are more than glad to visit and pray with you, so please don't hesitate to call on us.



### **Funeral Luncheon Hosts**

Are you someone who enjoys organizing and hosting? We're looking for additional volunteers who would help families to host a catered lunch. We provide families with the names of caterers and their plans, or a family provides their own caterer. Our hosts assist with setting up, serving, and cleaning up during the meal. We would ask families to give a stipend to the hosts for their time.

We have about 1-2 funerals a month, sometimes less, sometimes more. Generally there would be at least two hosts on a team for each funeral. Hosts would need to be available during weekdays and occasional weekends.

### Tales From the Road

### Do You or a Family Member Suffer from a Brain Disorder?

Recent research has found that what we have long thought of as mental illness is actually a type of brain disorder that is not a lot different from Parkinson's disease or epilepsy. These types of brain disorders are more common than you think. Depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, and dementia are among the brain disorders that many of us have faced in ourselves or our families. We are not alone, as research indicates that approximately one in four Americans suffer from some type of brain disorder every year.

This type of brain disorder regularly disrupts a person's thinking, feeling, mood, ability to relate to others

and function, but with early intervention and proper support and treatment, outcomes can be improved.

#### Where to Get Help

Don't be afraid to reach out if you or someone you know needs help. Learning all you can about these brain disorders, often referred to as mental illnesses, is an important first step. Reach out to your pastor or primary care doctor for more resources.

God wants us to be healthy to head to toe. Get help now by talking to someone if you think you or a loved one has a brain disorder.

### **Consistory Minutes**

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2015 by President Carrington Smith.

The Treasurer's Report and January/February bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee reported that the Clothing Shed results for the year 2014 (March-December), 24,610 pounds of clothing collected provided income of \$1,968 for general fund. In addition there two collections for the preschool that provides them with income over \$1,000 each time. Collections are underway for 2015, the shed usually fills up once a month, providing about \$200/month. Keep your donations coming!

Snow and Ice have been keeping us busy the past six weeks, all cleaned up now, ready for the next two storms this week.

We have been taking care of lots of little things around the property. All of the light bulbs here in Memorial Hall have been changed. There are a few light bulbs in the main sanctuary chandeliers that need to be replaced; we are planning to replace all of the bulbs in the eight ceiling lights on Saturday March 7<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 am. Helpers are welcomed!

The grove pavilion is moving along well, construction stopped a month ago due to the snow, but still at 85% done. We need warmer days to finish the rest, and then finish with the ground and grass planting.

The property committee request permission to remove one more pine tree, damaged by Hurricane Sandy, remove the small candy stand, and install one new light pole. Request was made and approved for these items. February 22<sup>nd</sup> there will be a Lent Celebration. Families will make a resurrection garden and share a meal of pizza and desserts. On March 21<sup>st</sup>, the committee will participate in Hoagie Making. This is the biggest fundraiser for this group for the year. Orders are being taken now.

**Christian Education Committee reported that on**





### IMPORTANT SAFE CHILD NEWS FOR OUR VOLUNTEERS

Protecting our children from child abuse is a community responsibility.

On October 22, 2014 House Bill 435 was signed into law becoming Act 153 of 2014. This PA law requires comprehensive criminal and child abuse background checks for all paid employees and volunteers who work with or around children. We are currently reviewing the requirements and preparing a compliance procedure which is as straight forward and efficient as possible for all of us at Union UCC.

All staff will be required to complete an online tutorial, <u>Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse</u>, complete a PA criminal record check, complete a PA child abuse history check, and complete a fingerprint record check.

All volunteers will be required to complete the online tutorial, the criminal record check, and the child abuse history check. (A fingerprint record check is only required if the volunteer has not lived in PA for the last 10 years.)

Barb Korastinsky has agreed to be our Safe Child Coordinator. We are preparing packets with step by step instructions for our staff and volunteers.

These checks are now required for everyone that works with or around children. This includes schools, sports teams, girl scouts, boy scouts, clubs, etc.. If you are employed or volunteer for another entity requiring these items, it is not necessary to complete the items again. You need only submit copies of the documents for your files.

We hope to have the majority of checks completed by September 1, 2015. Packets with detailed information, websites, and step by step instructions will be available for all volunteers by March 1, 2015.



### Union UCC...in search of mission, vision and leadership

"If people can't see what God is doing, they stumble all over themselves. But when they attend to what God reveals, they are most blessed." Proverbs 29:18 [MSG]

"Relying on the grace of God we will do our best to live the fruits of the Spirit, love, joy peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control [Galatians 5:22-23a], remembering that is Christ's church founded as a spiritual community over 250 years ago. We are His servants and stewards and our words and our behaviors communicate many things."

This is the current opening statement of the draft Covenant for Christian Leadership. The Covenant will capture how we are called to behave as leaders and members of the church, the "body of Christ" and will be refined and revised until the members of the LPT are comfortable signing it. Their signature will mean that relying on God's grace they will do their best to model this behaviors. The draft Covenant also addresses topics such as, encouraging other points of view, voicing disagreement with respect, not talking negatively about others [Galatians 5:19-21], how we are to behave when we have offended someone or

been offended by someone [Matthew 5:21-24, Matthew 18:15-20] and recognizing the variety of gifts and graces we have [1st Corinthians 12].

During March and April, the Leadership Planning Team will be utilizing their cumulative responses to the Miracle Question and what I call "seed starter" sentences and Bible **Study responses** [see February's newsletter for further definition] to identify Key Areas of Ministry and Mission for Union UCC. For each of these Key Areas we will develop draft goals or objectives for the next 3-5 years and then begin to draft Union UCC's Plan for Ministry & Mission.

Please visit our Union UCC web site where Tara has added a link to a page that contains an overview of the process we are following as well as other pertinent documents related to our work and ministry together.

As we "attend to what God reveals" during this process, please keep Union UCC, its staff, leaders and the entire congregation in your prayers.

### **RX** Corner

National Poison Prevention Week is recognized March 15-21. While it is always important to keep an eye on the safe storage of hazardous household products, this designated week highlights the importance of year-long safety and everyday tips to keep our loved ones safe. Read below for some interesting facts about Poison Centers.

Poison Control Centers...

- Can be reached at 1-800-222-1222.
- Offer free, confidential medical advice 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.
- Can communicate with callers in more than 150 languages.
- Are staffed by nurses, pharmacists, toxicologists, physicians, and other specialists certified in poison information.
- Have all the latest information related to household products, foods and beverages, chemicals in the workplace and home, environmental toxins, drugs and medicine, and animal and insect bites and strings.

- Responded to 3.1 million calls in 2013; 2.2
  million of those calls were about poison exposures, ranging from carbon monoxide to snake bites to poisonings. More than 87% of these poison exposure calls came from patients that could be treated at home.
- Aren't just for parents whose children get into the cleaning cabinet. Although children under 6 years of age account for half of the poison exposure calls, adults accounted for 92% of all poison-related deaths reported.
- Are a valuable tool for medical consultations; 18% of calls come from health care facilities. Patients managed with Poison Control expertise experience shorter hospitalization on average.
- Save the US \$1.8 billion per year. For every one dollar invested in the poison center system, \$13.39 are saved in medical costs and lost productivity.
