What Is Forgiveness?

Our Sunday morning adult education class has been studying Barbara Crafton's series, Embracing Forgiveness. Together we have learned some new things and affirmed some things we already knew about forgiveness. Forgiveness is not a feeling. It is a commitment of our wills toward making one step toward forgiveness. Feelings may follow. Forgiveness is not forgetting. When we forgive someone, that does not erase our history or change the event that caused the hurt, but it does allow us to move forward with far greater freedom into the future.

Sometimes forgiveness is more about ourselves than the perpetrator of the hurt. If we carry a hurt around with us, our own lives can be diminished. Often the person helped the most by forgiving is us. Sometimes the hardest person to forgive is ourselves. Forgiving ourselves can open us up to forgiving others.

If we have a hard time even thinking about forgiving someone, a good place to start is simply praying the person's name. Trust that over time God will bring forgiveness.

Ultimately, God does not command us to forgive others without empowering us to do so. Learning a habit or spiritual practice of forgiveness takes commitment, openness to God, and a desire for the best for ourselves and others.

With God's help, forgiving 70 times 7, or times without number, no longer seems impossible.

She was a member of the children's choir and participated as a Sunday school teacher's assistant for the kindergarten class. In 1984, Veronica entered the confirmation class with Pastor Tom during his first year as a pastor at Neffs. After high school, her and her future husband John assisted Sunday school classes for grades 4-7 followed by classes for pre-K. John and Veronica also enjoyed spending time helping out in the Little Lambs Nursery during church services. She married John at Neffs in 1993, their daughter Shelby was baptized in 1995 and confirmed in 2008.

As a member today, Veronica's biggest church contribution comes from being a member of the fellowship committee, where she runs the annual church basket social. She is the wedding coordinator for non-members who wish to have their ceremonies at our church. Most recently, Veronica joined the church's chime choir which is directed by Edie Fella.

Veronica works as an office manager for two family medical practices: one in Schnecksville and one in Allentown. She loves scrapbooking, reading, taking walks with her dog Comet, and going to the Iron Pigs games.

"My favorite church memory comes shortly after Pastor Tom started at Union UCC in 1984. Upon his arrival, Pastor Tom was immediately challenged with having to confirm two combined classes of confirmands, one of which I was a part of. During our cleaning assignment, many things went awry - including a church window being accidentally broken, a flower vase broken during a Frisbee incident and a confirmand's finger being pinched in a door. Needless to say, our class immediately tested Pastor Tom's patience and we were all sure we would make him think twice about why he decided to take this job at Neffs UCC! Pastor Tom handled everything we threw at him and earned our admiration with the understanding and calmness he displayed during those first few months at the church."

Operation Project Food Bank

Fighting HUNGER is a full time job for food banks all around the country. Union UCC is one of twelve local churches that sponsors the Northern Lehigh Food Bank, located in Emerald, directly across the street from the Washington Township Municipal Building.

Every week food bank volunteers spend time working at the food bank, stocking shelves, unloading trucks, organizing donated fruits and vegetables, picking up food donations from local warehouses, performing office work, and ultimately helping families gather food on distribution days.

Sounds like a lot of work. Well it is. There is much work needed to help Food Bank Director Dale Bryfogle in the daily and weekly operation to provide food to over 300 local families each month, over 1,000 people of all ages.

Union UCC is responsible for helping on distribution days every November, but there are opportunities to help year round. Volunteers are welcome every Tuesday from 9-12 noon to help stock shelves, every Sunday from 2:30 - 5:00 to organize fruits and vegetables and stock shelves, the first three Thursdays from 3:45 - 7:00 and the last Saturday from 9 - 12 noon to help distribute food to local families.

Currently eight Union UCC members help year round at various times during the week, and are hoping for more members to help. Everyone has a great time working together for a common goal. Please consider volunteering as your schedule permits, contact Phil Wehr or Wilbur Romig for more information.

One Great Hour of Sharing

One Great Hour of Sharing, part of our Church's Wider Mission, is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ. Our church will observe One Great Hour of Sharing with a collection on May 31. Envelopes will be distributed in the bulletin on May 17 and 24 and a speaker will share information about the great work funded by One Great Hour of Sharing at services on May 17.

The United Church of Christ is one of eight Christian Denominations who partner, together with the Church World Service, to develop materials and share costs associated with raising funds. Sharing the cost of these kinds of thing keeps administrative costs down. Ninety cents out of every dollar raised is used directly for mission programming. Each denomination receives its own funds.

Under One Great Hour of Sharing, 138 countries receive aid from the United Church of Christ for disaster assistance, development and refugee needs. That includes the United States, where aid goes to people touched by disaster or in need of a helping hand for a better life.



Lenten Self-Denial

The Allentown Rescue Mission, this year's recipient of the Lenten Self Denial Offerings, will be pleased with our collection of close to \$1,700 for their Mission.

\$600 of these offerings will provide bibles and materials for their Christian Living program, a residential program for the restoration of homeless men to God and the community. The balance of our offerings will provide for costs of meals and shelter at the Gateway Center, a 48 bed emergency shelter which is "Not just a bed and a meal ...but, A chance for a New Beginning".

Serving the needs of the homeless and needy in the Lehigh Valley for over 100 years, the Mission provides rescue, rehabilitation, and restoration for men in crisis through Christ centered programs based on accountability and compassion.

Union UCC...in search of mission, vision and leadership

The Leadership Planning Team [LPT] has identified eight [8] Key Areas of Ministry & Mission and five [5] Core Values that transcend across and integrate with all Union's ministry and mission. Our Key Areas include Christian Education, Evangelism, Member Ministries, Worship & Music, Governance & Structure, Facility/Property/ Grounds, Stewardship and Mission. Our Core Values include Extravagant Welcome, Open/Affirming, Diverse/ Inclusive, Spiritual Growth/Faith Development, Teaching God's Word and Fellowship.

Each of the Key Areas have been aligned with existing Union UCC Committees. LPT Sub-teams are being established to address each Key Area. After the LPT has drafted Key Area goals or outcomes for the next 3-5 years they will be reaching out to engage Committee members to work with them to begin drafting a Plan for each Key Area. These will ultimately be integrated into Union UCC's Plan for Ministry & Mission.

The LPT also drafted and shared the **preferred qualifi**cation criteria they would like to see possessed by the next Senior Pastor. Background, experience, years of service in ministry, education and character and leadership attributes were addressed. In addition the LPT developed and shared their responses to six [6] specific questions which are asked in the UCC Local Church Profile. These questions addressed important faith experiences and events in Union's history, Union's theological/faith stance, how Union UCC has addressed conflict in the past, lay leaders' connection with the larger UCC and relationships with prior Pastors. This information is being consolidated and will remain in "draft" status as it will be provided to the congregation for further refinement in our Phase 2 congregational forums which will be held later this summer.

RX Corner

Many people have had chickenpox at some point in their life, but unfortunately, the inactive virus (known as varicella zoster), remains dormant in the nervous system. In some patients, the virus becomes activated later in life; the result of the virus reactivation is shingles, also known as herpes zoster. Shingles is a viral condition that causes pain, rash, and blisters. It mainly develops in people over the age of 60 years and in those with weakened immune systems.

Pain is often the first sign of shingles, and can be intense. Other common symptoms include burning sensations, itching, and skin sensitivity. Shingles can occur anywhere on the body but most often occurs on one side of the chest/torso, neck, or face. A rash usually develops as a stripe of blisters that eventually break open, crust over, and heal. The virus can cause damage to surrounding nerves, producing constant, stabbing pain. A usual course

of shingles lasts from two to six weeks, but pain can persist if nerves are damaged. Most people only get shingles once in their life, but it is possible to get it more than once.

There is no cure for shingles, however prescription antiviral medications are given to promote healing and reduce the risk of complications. Topical medications, numbing agents, and skin patches are also often used to treat pain and discomfort.

Vaccination is the most effective way to prevent shingles and its associated complications. Zostavax® is an injectable vaccine that can be administered to adults ages 50 years and older. It is recommended for all adults over 60 years, even for those who have already developed shingles in the past.

Talk to your healthcare professional regarding your concerns about shingles or to find out if you are a candidate for vaccination.
