RX Corner

Summer is an important time to highlight the importance of using sunscreen. While we usually think of the warm, summer days as the only time to protect ourselves from the sun's harmful rays, sunscreen should be used all year long. Sunscreens are safe and effective when used properly, but can't protect from all UV rays. These dangerous UV rays can still travel through clouds, so use sunscreen on cloudy and overcast days too. Wide brimmed hats, SPF lip balm, and wrap-around sunglasses are also helpful in offering full sun protection.

There are many types of sunscreen on the market, but the most important key is to use sunscreen liberally, and reapply every 2 hours. Broad spectrum sunscreens are recommended since they offer protection from both UVA and UVB rays. Sunscreens are rated and measured by sun protection factors, or SPF. For example, a product with an SPF of 50 means that using it will protect skin 50x longer than the time it takes for unprotected skin to burn. A sunscreen with an SPF of at least 30 is preferred. Higher number of SPFs do not last any longer than lower SPFs; any kind still needs to be reapplied approximately every two hours. There is no such thing as "all day protection".

Some more quick facts about sun safety to keep in mind...

- Use about a shot glass worth of sunscreen for good coverage- a bottle should be empty before the end of the summer if you are using it correctly!
- Check expiration dates on the bottle; ingredients lose effectiveness over time

Union UCC...in search of mission, vision and leadership

"If people can't see what God is doing, they stumble all over themselves. But when they attend to what God reveals, they are most blessed." Proverbs 29:18 [MSG]

Eight [8] Key Areas of Ministry & Mission and five [5] Core Values that transcend across and integrate with all Union's ministry and mission have been identified by the LPT. Key Areas include Christian Education, Evangelism, Member Ministries, Worship & Music, Governance & Structure, Facility/ Property/Grounds, Stewardship and Mission. Core Values include Extravagant Welcome, Open/Affirming & Diverse/ Inclusive, Spiritual Growth/Faith Development, Teaching God's Word and Fellowship. LPT Sub-teams for each of the Key Areas and have started working with existing Union UCC Committees which align with the Key Areas to begin jointly drafting a Plan for each Key Area, including the development of policies and procedures they may decide are needed. These Key Area plans will ultimately be integrated into a comprehensive Union UCC Plan for Ministry & Mission.

All of the work and output from the LPT during Phase 1 will remain in "draft" status as much of it will be shared with the congregation for their further input, review and refinement in our Phase 2 Congregational Forums which will be held in August and September, 2015. Dates are currently being planned.

Several items have emerged which are also being addressed during this process. Those items include our lower than average rate of financial stewardship giving, Pastoral compensation being below the minimum recommended PNE

Conference guidelines, the need to refine our Staff annual performance review process, and the need to evaluate, market benchmark, analyze and potentially recommend adjustments to Staff compensation. In addition, the Church & Ministry Committee has developed and recommended to the LPT a process for us to follow to explore more fully living out our Core Values of being Open, Affirming, Diverse and Inclusive and to revisit our policy on marriage equality. With broad based support from the LPT endorsing this process Church & Ministry will be taking this recommendation to Consistory in June for their consideration.

We are on schedule to complete Phase 3 of the process which includes recommending Consistory and the congregation approve relevant portions of Union UCC's Local Church Profile and Union's Plan for Ministry and Mission by the end of March 2016.

Please keep Union UCC, its staff, leaders and the entire congregation in your prayers.

Thank you to members of Union UCC who have made a difference in the lives of others in the local community, nationally, and around the world.

Every week **80 - 120 pounds of groceries** are collected to support the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. Every week **3 - 4 bags of toiletries** are delivered to Lehigh County Conference of Churches.
