Spiritual Opportunities

In the typical "Battle for Christmas" banter, we hear a lot about keeping Christ in Christmas, and preserving Christmas as a Christian "holy day." "Jesus is the reason for the season," and all that.

As a pastor, I think the bigger battle is not a cultural crusade about spelling or terminology. The greater battle is for Christians to see the deeper spiritual opportunities that the Seasons of Advent and Christmas offer. Too often we ourselves get caught up in the busyness of the season and miss opportunities for deeper spiritual growth.

The seasons of Advent and Christmas offer us ample opportunities to embrace the spiritual practices of waiting, patience, hope, and joy. These are wise practices but they come to us during a time when many of us are overwhelmed with obligations and extra work.

Instead of caving in to the stress of the holidays, let us stop briefly during Advent and the twelve days of Christmas to refresh our mind, body, and soul. Take a few moments each day to think about how God is present in your life. Read the birth narratives of Jesus as recorded in Matthew 1:18-2:23 and Luke 1:26-2:20. Attend a Bible Study or Adult Class at church, as well as weekly worship.

May this year's Advent and Christmas seasons bring you to a new awareness of God's presence in your life.




DO YOU HAVE UNWANTED HOLIDAY DECORATIONS?

Mission Committee Announces Advent Offering Recipients

The Mission Committee has identified two projects to receive the proceeds from our advent offering. The projects, one local and one an international project led by church in the Penn Northeast Conference of the United Church of Christ, bring God's love in the form of aid and services provided.

Guatemala Project

The Penn Northeast Conference of the United Church of Christ has been building an ecumenical, congregational relationship with the Ecumenical Christian Council of Guatemala, specifically Concejo Ecumenico and the church in rural Quetzaltenango and Monte Margarita, Guatemala over the past several years. The group leading this project has become known as Los Amigos de Guatemala. Our member Kathi Fuellhart was part of one the mission teams that visited Guatemala during this process. The multi-purpose facility and clinic will promote good health and education for all the people of the rural area surrounding Monte Margarita. The facility will also be used for community meetings, a place for business minded people to share ideas, and whatever else fits the needs of the villagers.

The partners realized some basic needs had to be met before the dreams of their collaborative ministry project could continue. There would be a need for electricity to be grounded, and the polluted, ground water to be cleaned in order to better live out the vision of God continuing to still speak within what some from both countries might definitely call, unexpected places. The village was so remote, plumbing to run water to it was available but the water is not potable. It is not an easy task to provide clean water in the village. The ground is broken and they are ready to start building.

Lehigh Country Conference of Churches Emergency Shelter at Alliance Hall

Beginning on November 1 and continuing until April, the Lehigh County Conference of Churches operates an emergency shelter at Alliance Hall, 534 Chew St. It can be accessed by homeless individuals and families seeking overnight accommodations and relief from the cold. It is what is called a seasonal warming center, open only during the coldest months. The shelter is open from 7 p.m to 7 a.m. daily. Users sleep on cots in Alliance Hall's gymnasium. In addition to offering a warm place to sleep, some medical services are provided once a week.

This year the Mission Committee will be collecting cold weather accessories for local families living at the 6th St. Shelter in Allentown. We are asking for donations of new hats, scarves, gloves, mittens, and socks in men's, women's, and children's

The collection will begin the Sunday after Thanksgiving, November 29th and will run during the month of December. This will assure that the shelter will receive them in time for the colder winter months ahead.

Count your blessings. Help us to spread the warmth by helping to warm the hearts, heads, hands, and feet of our less fortunate neighbors this holiday season. Donations can be put in the collection boxes under the

mission tree in Memorial Hall.

Since 1984, the Shelter has been providing temporary housing for Lehigh Valley homeless families with children. Today the Sixth Street Shelter proudly offers 19 individual family apartments. It is the only shelter in the Valley to offer homeless families the privacy and security of a furnished apartment with a complete kitchen. The philosophy of the Sixth Street Shelter, in keeping with the broader mission of the CACLV, encourages those it serves to accept responsibility for themselves.

Operation Project Food Bank

Thank you to everyone who volunteered their services to distribute food at the Northern Lehigh Food Bank during the month of November. Thank you to everyone who donates food, groceries, toiletries, and cash donations to the food bank throughout the year, either in the shopping cart, through the VBS mission campaign, during the Harvest Home collection, or the annual Boy Scout collection. YOUR help is greatly needed and appreciated by all of the families that the NL food bank serves in the local community.

Union UCC also donates 250 - five pound bags of potatoes for their annual special distributions at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. This donation is made possible through Mission Discretionary spending of the general budget, through your direct extra gifts provided to the Benevolence envelopes in your yearly packet. Please continue to support the Benevolence envelope which allows the Mission Committee to provide funds for this project and other mission needs through out the year.

Our Church's Same-Sex Marriage Policy

From Pastor Kris

As part of this interim time in our church's life, we set as one of our priorities to revisit our church's policy on same sex marriage for these reasons: it is now legal in our country to perform these weddings, Pastor Thomas asked us to review this policy before we call our next Senior Pastor, and the Leadership Planning Team (LPT) claimed as one of our core values to be a church that is open, affirming and inclusive.

The LPT created an Open and Affirming Ad Hoc Team to work on a recommendation to Consistory and that recommendation was presented to the Consistory in October. The recommendation was to change the policy so that same-sex weddings could be performed in our church by our pastors under our church's care. At our November 16th meeting the Consistory approved this recommendation by a vote of 14 voting yes and 6 voting no. Pastor Bill shared this result with the congregation in worship on November 22nd.

As Pastor Bill has said, we all hope that regardless of where you stand on this issue that you know that your pastors and leaders believe that God's church here at Union UCC is big enough for all us. This is not the first time we have disagreed on an issue and it certainly will not be the last time. This family of faith has been through many big and small disagreements throughout our 260 year history and God's spirit and love has helped us grow, kept us strong, and united us as the body of Christ.

I am proud of our leaders, pastors, staff and members for the hard work, energy, and prayer they have given to this. They modeled for us what it means to disagree with grace, love and respect. Keep praying for each other as we move through this time of healing. Your pastors are here for you, even when, and especially when we disagree. Please call on us.

The Leadership Planning Team [LPT] held its final meeting on November 10th, 2015. In that meeting they unanimously endorsed the Draft of Union's Plan for Ministry & Mission, Rev-5 with Addendum and the Search Committee's draft Union UCC Profile. Both of these documents will be presented to Consistory at their November 16th, 2015 meeting, asking for their endorsement and recommendation to the congregation for adoption at the January 24th, 2016, semi-annual congregational meeting.

The Financial Leadership Team continues to focus on the Fall Stewardship Campaign. That campaign officially started on Stewardship Sunday, November 15th, 2015 and will conclude with Faith Commitments Cards being returned through Sunday, January 10th, 2016. All the Committees and small groups of the Church are fully engaged in implementing their Plan for Ministry and Mission.

The **Search Committee continues its work** with our PNEC representative, Len Kesselring, to prepare for review of pas-

toral candidate resumes and interviewing pastoral candidates.

The search for Union's next Senior Pastor is ahead of schedule and planned to commence in February 2016!

Thanks to each of you for your Christian leadership and discipleship, your commitment to the work of our intentional interim ministry, and, your faith filled commitment to the ministry, mission and gospel of Jesus Christ through Union UCC!




Union United Church of Christ - Narrative Budget

The following is a summary of the church's total income and expenses for the current fiscal year.

Contributions, Special Offerings and Gifts



Where our Stewardship Giving Goes



- Regular **Weekly Offering** are gifts received through envelopes and plate offerings and comprise the majority of our income (61%)
- Interest and dividend earnings from the **Funds of Lasting Gifts** (FOLG) target specific needs per bequest guidelines and comprise an important portion of the church's total overall income (14%)
- **Special Envelopes,** including holiday giving, comprise 8% of our income while gifts received through the special **Benevolence** and other mission envelopes are about 3% of our income
- **Miscellaneous** contributions include building rent and donations, interest earnings, and other gifts and comprise 4% of our income
- Program giving includes gifts from our education programs such as Sunday School and Preschool (3%)
- Fundraisers, although a small percentage (2%), are an important component of our income

- Worship and Music in our weekly and special services comprise a significant portion of overall spending (23%)
- Our **Member Ministries** seeks to nurture, support and connect members in a variety of programs and ministries through numerous groups and committees (13%)
- Christian Education provides a variety of educational programs, events and activities for all ages to learn about Christian faith and comprises 12% of overall spending
- Our **Mission** giving is focused on helping those in need, both in the local community and the world. Our support includes OCWM, local mission agencies and food banks, and other mission projects (9%)
- Governance and Structure includes managing our staff and participating in the PNEC (5%)
- Evangelism is focused on sharing the good news of the Gospel and comprises 5% of our spending
- Spending on Facilities, the church building and property, is significant at 28% of overall spending but is critical in maintaining the church, its properties, and office equipment
