From the Interim Pastor

Lent as a Season for Spiritual Growth

Lent is a season for self examination and spiritual growth. For Christians, spirituality is all about our relationship with God. We can develop our spirituality through reading the scriptures, through prayer, and through personal devotions and corporate worship.

I personally believe that the Bible is our greatest resource for spiritual growth. As we read stories about our Hebrew and Christian ancestors, we discover how God is present in our lives. The stories of how God called Moses to lead the Hebrews through the wilderness into the Promised Land; the stories of how God called prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah and Micah to proclaim justice and mercy in their respective generations, the stories of how Gold's wisdom was revealed to David, Solomon, Ecclesiastes, etc, and the stories of how God's love became manifest in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ... these stories help us discover how God is still speaking in our lives, calling us to recognize the cost and joy of discipleship.

The Bible suggests that there are four basic stages of spiritual growth.

1. The development of an **identity**: who are we and whose are we? Biblical resources such as The Torah, the 10 commandments, Jesus' Beatitudes (Mt 5), and

- the Great Commandment: "Love God and love your neighbor as yourself (Mt 22:37) These passages help us understand who and whose we are.
- 2. The challenge of accepting the cost and joy of discipleship. The Hebrew prophets challenge us to be responsible to live according to God's commandments (Isaiah 61:1; Micah 6:8), and Jesus calls us to repentance and responsible living (Lk4:18).
- 3. We discover **wisdom**. We develop an understanding that life is a mystery to be experienced, not a problem to be solved (Proverbs 9:10; Ecclesiastes 3:1-11); and Jesus offers us the wisdom of his parables (Mt 13:34).
- 4. We are asked to give ourselves up to God. Jesus' Gethsemane prayer, "Nevertheless, not my will, but thy will be done," (Mk 14:36) becomes the guiding principle of our life.
- 5. Why not make this Lenten Season a time to grow your spirit? Join us for regular worship, attend our Wednesday evening Lenten programs, attend one of our Bible studies or Sunday morning adult classes. Come and hear how God is still speaking here at Union UCC.

Consistory Minutes

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, January 18th, 2016 by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report and December/January bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee—The upgrades to the WiFi Network have been completed. Selig Electric ran many new wires, and installed all of the new boxes. Jeff Herbine and Gary Yencho provided many hours of volunteer labor. They will be providing more information on the network at a later date. A proposal has been given for the purchase and installation of assistive wireless equipment for the sanctuary. The unit will be of great help to those with hearing difficulties, and bringing us closer to ADA compliance. Several requests were made and approved from Funds of Lasting Gifts:

15,000 to fund the services of the Vision Consultant as approved in 2014. Amount to be reimbursed to the Reserve Fund account, source of all bills paid.

From the property committee:

\$2,000- for annual expenses associated with the elevator

\$1,000- for annual gutter cleaning and slate repair

\$5,000- for miscellaneous property repairs, emergency or others during 2016

\$3,000- for the cost for upgrades to the wifi network

\$3,000- to purchase new assisted listening devices and equipment for the sanctuary.

From the Worship Committee:

Christian Education Committee - Hoagie Sale and Gertrude Hawk Fundraisers starting- sponsor a box a smidgens for a young person in the Bethany Children's Home. Faith and Family Night- at the Phantoms on April 9th. During the week of

Mission Committee - February 7th is Souper Bowl Sunday. Blanket Sunday- February 14th and 21st. Lenten Self-Denial will go to Meals on Wheels and Turning Point. The Advent Self-Denial offering was \$2,729.00. There will be a Blood and Soup Drive (Sunday March 13th). Anyone who gives a pint of blood will get a pint of soup. Proceeds from the soup will go the Miller Keystone Blood Bank.


