Three additional persons, Marilyn Hill, Susan Neal and I, have been nominated to serve a second consecutive three-year term on Consistory. Additionally, Deb Wenner has been nominated to continue to serve our congregation as a Trustee of the Funds of Lasting Gifts. These members have freely chosen to offer their service and leadership talents to God's church and God's mission here at Union UCC.

Let us pray that the presidential campaign becomes kinder and gentler in the process of choosing a new president. And let us pray that our Search Committee finds a suitable candidate to be our next Senior Pastor.

Senior Pastor Search Committee Report By David Fleming, Chair

The year-long work of the Leadership Planning Team (LPT) under the excellent facilitation and leadership of Pastor Bill has been completed and the team produced two major documents for our congregation to use as we move toward the New Year and the eventual calling of our next Senior Pastor. The Plan for Ministry and Mission and the Congregational Profile will be voted upon at the December meeting of Consistory and will be brought before the Congregation at the Congregational Meeting on January 24th.

The Search Committee has been meeting bi-weekly with our consultant, Len Kesselring from the PNEC Search & Call Committee, to work on finalizing the profile, reviewing the expectations for leadership, and preparing interview questions. In the upcoming weeks we will be preparing for the "mock" interview with a local pastor, developing the advertisement/posting for the position and finalizing the congregational profile for distribution around the United Church of Christ.

It is our hope that we will begin the actual search soon after the Congregational Meeting on January 24th.

Pastor profiles from the entire UCC denomination will be accepted, screened and reviewed for consideration. While this process will remain confidential, (names and information about the candidates) I will continue to communicate to the congregation where we are in the process.

Once pastor profiles are selected by the committee, candidates will be invited to interview, references will be checked and a final candidate (one only) will be recommended by the committee to Consistory. Consistory would then vote to approve the recommendation and recommend to the congregation that the final candidate be invited to come for a "trial sermon" and a weekend "meet and greet", if necessary, where a congregational vote will be taken at the end of the service. That vote will be conducted by our PNEC consultant.

If the required number (percentage per our Constitution) of votes is affirmative the congregational leaders would extend a call to the pastor on that date. The pastor would then accept or reject the call. Hopefully he/she would accept and then we would have called and received our next Sr. Pastor. That is an abbreviated scenario that we plan to follow as prescribed by the UCC, PNEC and our own Constitution and Bylaws.

It is impossible to predict precisely how long this process will take but I would estimate that we would be searching, interviewing and investigating candidates in February/March and it is my hope that we will have the search completed this coming spring.

As I stated, I will keep you informed as we follow this path, led by God with a certain faith that we will discern who God is calling to be our next Senior Pastor.

The committee thanks all of you for your continued prayers and support.

Happy New Year to all. The Christmas Season has come and gone here at Union UCC. A big thank you to all who helped to make Christmas festive and meaningful to all who passed through the church doors and entrance-ways all month long.

Meanwhile the compressor for the double door refrigerator in the basement kitchen failed on November 28. With further research, due to the age of the fridge, the best decision would be to purchase a new unit, rather than the costly replacement of the compressor. The consistory provided a prompt response to purchase a new commercial refrigerator, utilizing funds from the Memorial Fund. The new unit is up and running to serve the needs of our chefs, cooks, and bakers who use the kitchen.

The property committee is also working with the technology committee to upgrade and improve the wi-fi network to all three floors of the church property. New wiring and electrical outlets will be installed this winter to make these improvements. This project is being funded through the Funds of Lasting Gifts.

Union UCC is blessed to have the Memorial Fund and the Funds of Lasting Gifts to allow for the projects listed above to happen, especially in emergencies like the failure of the fridge. Give thanks to all who have provided to these funds to enhance the mission and ministries of Union UCC.


