From the Interim Pastor

I'm always amazed where the Spirit leads me on my spiritual journey. This year during the Lenten Season, the lectionary called me to preach a sermon entitled, "What If Lazarus Had Had a Living Will." This led to some serious discussions among our members about Estate Planning and end of life issues.

As a result, I found myself reading *Being Mortal* by Atul Gawande. Dr. Gawande is a practicing surgeon who examines the limitations of medicalizing our understandings of aging, frailty, and death. He concludes that our mortality consists of more than just clinical problems to be overcome. Rather, the goal of life is to find meaning and live as rich and full as possible, given the circumstances of our mortality.

Discussions are never easy about mortality, aging, and the reality that most of us will experience significant physical and mental decline as we age. Nevertheless, our Christian faith can serve as an important resource for us to face these realities. The Apostle Paul had it right when he wrote:

"Though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is renewed day by day."

II Corinthians 4:16

My years of ministry in a nursing home setting taught me much about the importance of spiritual growth during the last years of our lives on this earth. I had countless spiritual elders who taught me over and over again that our ultimate goal is not to live on this earth forever. Our ultimate goal is to live in full communion with God. If we can learn this message, as difficult as it might be, then we can live rich and full lives right to the very end. Thanks be to God!

Consistory

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, April 18, 2016 by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report for the March/April 2016 bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee reported that the gutters were cleaned, along with minor slate repairs, and the sanctuary AC units were cleaned. Two requests were presented and approved by Consistory. One, a request for funding from Funds of Lasting Gifts for replacing rug in the main hallway of the New Beginning addition, at an estimated \$3,000. Two, a request for funding from Funds of Lasting Gifts for five small painting project around the church, at an estimated \$8,000. Consistory approved funding for both projects. Additionally, Hall and Room Usage policy was presented and approved by Consistory.

Christian Education Committee reported on the recent hoagie and Gertrude Hawk candy sales. Candy donations were made to Bethany Children's Home in support of the Boys' and Girls' Cottages. Vacation Bible School is being planned and the curriculum is entitled Deep Sea Discovery. Mission Committee reported that the Lenten Self-Denial collection totaled \$2,433, half of these donations were sent to Meals on Wheels and half to Turning Point. Toiletries for

Tots donations are continuing through May. Sunday, May 1 is the Hunger Walk to benefit the Northern Lehigh Food Bank.

Church and Ministry Committee reported that the review of the Policy and Procedure Manual continues. Natalie Ondrey accepted the position as our new Setup Person for Coffee Hour. The Committee recommended additional vacation time be allotted to Pastor Patience and Ron based on seniority and past church practice.

Evangelism/Welcoming Committee reported that they will be promoting a new tag line: Spread the Word – We are a Welcoming Church. The videos posted to Facebook have been a huge success. Sunday, April 24 will be a Welcoming Service. The Committee will have a table at the Country Fair to sell geraniums.

Stewardship Committee reported that work continues on the Faith Commitment letters that are being sent out. Fellowship Committee reported that some of this year's Confirmands attended the April meeting. Their year-end dinner will be discussed at the next meeting.

Worship Committee did not meet.

Fighting HUNGER is a full time job for food banks all around the country. **Union UCC plays an important part in serving the Northern Lehigh Food Bank**, located in Emerald, directly across the street from the Washington Township Municipal Building.

Every week food bank volunteers spend time working at the food bank, stocking shelves, unloading trucks, organizing donated fruits and vegetables, picking up food donations from local warehouses, performing office work, and ultimately helping families gather food on distribution days.

Sounds like a lot of work. Well it is. There is much work needed to help Food Bank Director Dale Bryfogle in the daily and weekly operation to provide food to over 300 local families each month, over 1,000 people of all ages.

Union UCC is responsible for helping on distribution days every November, but there are opportunities to help year round. **Volunteers are welcome** every Tuesday from 9-12 noon to help stock shelves, every Sunday from 2:30 - 5:00 to organize fruits and vegetables and stock shelves, the first three Thursdays from 3:45 - 7:00 and the last Saturday from 9 - 12 noon to help distribute food to local families.

Currently eight to ten Union UCC members help year round at various times during the week, and are hoping for more members to help. Everyone has a great time working together for a common goal. PNEC Annual Meeting

Leslie and Steve Strack represented Union UCC at the 54th Annual Meeting of the Penn Northeast Conference (PNEC) on Saturday, April 9th in Northampton, PA. Rev Kris Snyder-Samuelson, Rev. Allan Kramer-Moyer, and Phyllis Hamm were also in attendance. The theme of this year's meeting was "Be the Church." Each UCC church in the Conference designates delegates each year to attend and represent them at the Conference.

The purpose and function of the PNEC can be summarized as follows:

- •assists member congregations with locating and selecting pastors on a permanent, interim, or supply basis
- •provides conflict resolution resources for member churches
- provides support and guidance for the development of seminary students and newly licensed pastors
- •functions as a conduit for member church contributions to the OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission) missions and ministry

There were presentations given on two major Conference level ministries that OCWM supports:

- •Planning and construction of a medical clinic in Guatemala They have collected about \$90,000 and need \$30,000 more. Once built, they will be sending medical teams there about once a year. If any healthcare professionals are interested in medical missions, visit the PNEC website for more information.
- •PNEC Disaster Response Ministry team Two new tool trailers were purchased and filled with \$22,000 worth of hand tools and power equipment. These trailers will travel to locations needing disaster relief/recovery on the East Coast. They traveled to Columbia, SC in January. In addition, the 2017 PNEC Budget was voted on, and there was also a vote on the Clergy, Youth, and Lay delegates for the General Synod. Pastor Kris gave a good presentation on our own church's Youth Sleep-Out for Homelessness."

One Great Hour of Sharing, part of our Church's Wider Mission, is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ. Our church will observe One Great Hour of Sharing with a collection on May 22. Envelopes will be distributed in the bulletin on May 15 and 22 and a speaker will share information about the great work funded by One Great Hour of Sharing at services on May 22.

The United Church of Christ is one of eight Christian Denominations who partner, together with the Church World Service, to develop materials and share costs associated with raising funds. Sharing the cost of these kinds of thing keeps administrative costs down. Ninety cents out of every dollar raised is used directly for mission programming. Each denomination receives its own funds.

Under One Great Hour of Sharing, 138 countries receive aid from the United Church of Christ for disaster assistance, development and refugee needs. That includes the United States, where aid goes to people touched by disaster or in need of a helping hand for a better life.

Search Committee Update

The Search Committee participated in a "mock" or practice interview with a local UCC pastor recently which helped us prepare for the actual interviews and we have met with our Conference Minister who brought us our first group of ministerial profiles.

Ministerial profiles from the entire UCC denomination are now coming in (nearly a dozen thus far). We have begun screening, reviewing and ranking them for consideration. While this process will remain confidential, (names and information about the candidates) I will continue to communicate to the congregation where we are in the process.

Once ministerial profiles are selected for further consideration, by the committee, candidates will be invited to interview, references will be checked and a final candidate (one only) will be recommended by the committee to Consistory. Consistory would then vote to approve the recommendation and recommend to the congregation that the final candidate be invited to come for a "trial sermon" and a weekend "meet and greet", if necessary, where a congregational vote will be taken at the end of the service. That vote will be conducted by our PNEC consultant.

We will work as quickly and prayerfully as we can. It is not known how long this process might take. We will search and interview as long as needed until we find the best candidate whom we feel God is calling to be our next Sr. Pastor.

Let us all continue to pray that we will discern God's will for our faith community.


