The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, June 20, 2016 by Vice President Aften Hamm.

The Treasurer's Report and May/June 2016 bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee reported that at we experienced a large fuel oil savings this past winter and will be pre-buying next season's oil in July. A relay switch failed in the Memory Room and was repaired. The septic tank is being cleaned as well as new rug ordered for the hallway by the church offices. We look forward to Vacation Bible School using the entire property. We will begin to advertise Blues Nite Out in August.

Christian Education Committee reported that Vacation Bible School will be held the week of June 27 and 122 children are registered to attend. Only 3 people have signed up to help with

CWS Kits - Summer Mission Collection

Union UCC's Mission Committee is organizing a new summer Mission Project to support Church World Services (CWS) Kits program. CWS kits are small packages of supplies (hygiene, school, or emergency) assembled by volunteers and shipped to families and communities around the world after natural disasters or to developing countries

In July, donations of cash will be accepted by the congregation, allowing the Mission Committee to purchase needed supplies to make 48 school kits. Additionally, \$800 of earnings from the Thomas Family Fund, part of the Funds of Lasting Gifts endowment fund, will be provided to member Graham Smith, son of Carrington and Susan Smith to purchase supplies to assemble 50 hygiene kits. On August 12, a group of nine Union UCC members will be traveling by bus with volunteers from other local UCC churches to the CWS campus in New Windsor, Maryland.

All of the kits made from our church, through your donations and those from the Thomas Family Fund, and kits from the other churches will be taken along on the bus to give to CWS. The bus load of volunteers will give a day's worth of labor to make more kits, and prepare them for shipping around the world.

Your support of the CWS Kit program makes a tremendous difference in the lives of so many people both here at home and around the world. Each Kit represents a person whose life will be changed because of the simple items contained within.

Church World Services also oversees and organizes the Blanket Sunday program and the Crop Walk. More information can be found on their website - http://cwskits.org/

John's paternal grandfather was a Swedish immigrant who became a Methodist pastor who served churches all around the state of North Dakota during his ministry. Then, John grew up as a son of a U.C.C. minister. John's Dad served churches in New England, Pennsylvania and Tennessee during his ministry, and John has loved being U.C.C his entire life. He was baptized, confirmed, married and ordained in the U.C.C. John's Dad is now deceased, but his Mom is still living (at age 80) in Bethlehem PA. John has two brothers, two sisters, and two step-brothers.

John met Kris at Penn State University, and they were married at St. John's U.C.C in Slatington in 1988. Kris worked while John went to Lancaster Theological Seminary. Then, after John was ordained in 1991, John pastored a U.C.C. congregation in North Tonawanda, NY while Kris commuted to divinity school in Rochester NY.

John's and Kris' daughter, Hannah, was born near Buffalo, NY in 1993. However, Hannah has grown up, since age 3, at Union U.C.C. Hannah graduated from Parkland high school and Vassar College and is now working a farm apprenticeship at a small, organic family farm in New Milford, CT.

After pastoring the New York congregation for five years, John served as Associate Pastor at St. John's U.C.C. in Emmaus PA from 1997-2003. Since then, John has been working with foster children at Pinebrook Family Answers in Allentown.

John loves spending time with Kris, Hannah and their dog Roscoe. He also loves walking, family gatherings, annual college reunions, politics, travel, and hiking on the Appalachian Trail and in state parks with Hannah. He also loves trying to be as green and environmentally friendly as possible.

John has served as a helper with VBS and as a teacher in the Adult Sunday School class. Plus, he is a current member of the Mission Committee. In addition, John has served on PNEC's Nominating Committee as well as a delegate to the 2007 General Synod of the U.C.C.

John loves the U.C.C. because he believes that the U.C.C is correct in its reading of the gospels as radical, life-transforming lessons of welcome and inclusion for absolutely everyone. Plus, he loves the U.C.C.'s focus on social justice and care for the poor. At Union U.C.C., he enjoys the support and friendship of kind, loving decent friends, neighbors and colleagues. He believes that Union U.C.C. has a huge heart for missions, and he is very proud to be a member here. He also loves to drive by the church to see a full parking lot, and it is especially exciting for him when he doesn't even know why the parking lot is full. He is so glad to know when the church building is being used seven days a week.

John's favorite church memory also occurred at one of the hardest times in Kris' and John's lives -- Hannah's bout with leukemia from 1998-2000. John remembers that the people of both Union U.C.C and St. John's U.C.C. in Emmaus carried Kris, John and Hannah through that time with boundless love and care. For this tremendous kindness all those years ago and for this award today, John wants to thank all of the people and pastors of Union U.C.C.



Did you Know? Priscilla Greiss was born in Northumberland County, Pennsylvania. She was the fourth of five children in a farm family. Priscilla was educated in a 2 room school house until she attended middle and high school in Milton, Pa. She graduated from Penn State University with a degree in Home Economics and Extension. Priscilla met her husband, Alan, at State College. Following her graduation, Priscilla and Alan were married and relocated to the Lehigh Valley. Together they found their new church at Union UCC, where they raised their four children, Karen, Sharon, Deborah and Keith. Priscilla sang on the choir for 30 years and Alan served 2 terms in Consistory.

Following graduation from Penn State, Alan was hired to manage the farm on the grounds of the State Hospital on Hanover Avenue in Allentown. Within a few short years, Alan and Priscilla bought their own 45 acre farm in the Slatington area. Soon they bought the adjacent 100 acre farm (a purchase made while Priscilla was in the hospital delivering their youngest child). Alan worked full time for Eastern States, which became Farm Bureau and then Agway until he became a credit manager for Farm Credit Services. He farmed after work hours and weekends until his retirement in 1995 when he became a full time farmer. Over the years they raised Black Angus cattle, pigs and even some chickens.

Priscilla was responsible for the "truck patch" on their farm. She grew sweet corn, string beans, cucumbers, peppers and tomatoes. Their sweet corn was so popular that their regular customers would line up at 9:00 AM to get the freshly picked corn, though she didn't open her produce stand until 10:00 AM. Priscilla also found time to can and freeze much of her produce for the family. Her children fondly remember the pickles, corn relish and jellies. Priscilla was an adept seamstress. She made many outfits for her children, curtains and even Barbie clothing. She knitted and did cross stitch projects as a hobby.

In 2013 Alan and Priscilla sold their farm to a neighbor and moved to Fellowship Community. They were married nearly 60 years when Alan died in June, 2015. In addition to her four children, Priscilla has 11 grandchildren and 2 great granddaughters.
