From the Interim Pastor

"Quenching our Spiritual Thirst"

We had several good thunderstorms during the latter part of July this year. They were badly needed because the earth was parched and dry during the early part of the summer. I'm reminded of the first lines of Psalm 42:

As a deer longs for flowing streams, So my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God.

The Psalmist here reminds us that there are times when our spiritual lives are parched and dry. We thirst for the living water of God's love. Jesus describes God's love as "living water." (John 4:14)

The theologian John Sanford tells the story of when he was a little boy and his parents vacationed each summer at a farmhouse in Vermont. The farmhouse had no running water, but there was a well with a hand pump outside the kitchen, and that well never went dry.

Sanford tells how he grew up and the family stopped vacationing at this farmhouse. Years later, as an adult, he returned to that farmhouse. By then the house had inside plumbing and the old well was boarded up and dry. He recalls dropping a pebble down the well shaft, only to hear it rattle on the dry rocks below.

Sanford then went to a geologist and asked him how that well, which never went dry during his childhood, had dried up over the years. The geologist explained how a well is fed by thousands of tiny streams of water. As long as people draw water off the top, the streams flow to refill the reservoir of water. But when people stop drawing water from the well, the rivulets of water dry up.

John Sanford says that our souls work the same way. As long as we pray and practice an active spiritual life, the streams of living water continue to flow through our soul. But when we stop doing our spiritual exercises, these inner streams of living water stop flowing, and our souls get clogged up with sediment and stop working.

Personal devotions and regular church attendance are important spiritual exercises that will help God's living water flow continuously through your soul. Join us this Sunday, and bring a friend!

Consistory Minutes

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, August 15, 2016 by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report and June - August 2016 bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee reported that it has been a busy summer with lots of special events in and around the church. The hallway rugs by the offices have been replaced. The painting project will be finished in the next month. Most of these repairs were funded through a previously approved FOLG miscellaneous request, which is now running low. Backyard BBQ Bash is on Saturday September 10. Tickets can be purchased in advance to support a new raffle event; winners to be picked on September 10.

Mission Committee reported that we are no longer supporting the Daybreak meal and will begin serving breakfast at Zion UCC Reformed Church. Larry Pickens from Lehigh Valley Conference of Churches will be promoting Mission in January. Pill bottle donations are incredibly successful but will be ending after one year due to shipping costs. Harvest Home is September 18.

Church and Ministry Committee reported that a discussion was held with our seminary student, Ashley Werkheiser. She has graduated and is doing well on her path. She will assist in Worship on August 28 and will preach on September 4.

Welcoming Committee reported that a list of recent new members was received from Spring and Summer 2016, to connect with them and let them know about our church events coming up. Opportunities for new members to join our church will be increased to four times per year and classes will be held for 2 weeks. The next two opportunities to join our Church family will be in September and November.

Stewardship Committee reported discussed the following: E-giving opportunity, Fall kickoff for a financial fundraiser, and plans for follow-up on Faith Commitments.

Fellowship Committee reported that their meeting was held August 1st to plan the Church picnic, which was huge success. Next meeting is September 5, to discuss basket social.

Church World Service Kits Projects

THANK YOU, THANK YOU, thank you to all who supported Union UCC's summer mission project. Over \$1,000 was collected in July to help with costs of supplies and to aid in the shipping of 50 school kits, and 7 emergency buckets. The Thomas Family Fund of the Funds of Lasting Gifts provided \$800 to purchase supplies and to aid in the shipping of 65 hygiene kits.

These kits were assembled by members of the Mission Committee and their families and were delivered to the Church World Service campus on Aug 12. - We had five awesome dives and learned that GOD IS WITH US WHEREVER WE GO!

Holy Joe's Café: October's Mission Benefitting UCC Military Coffee House

During the entire month of October, **Holy Grounds will serve Equal Exchange coffee, a fair-trade brand of gourmet products**. Equal Exchange, the world's largest worker-owned coffee roaster, has partnered with a sister congregation, the First Congregational Church in Wallingford, CT, to provide coffee to the troops serving oversees. Started by a UCC military chaplain, **Holy Joe's Café offers men and women on active duty a place to come, relax, and talk with chaplains.** This "Coffee House and Café Ministry" provides our military personnel with a place where they can be emotionally and spiritually renewed and have a moment of peace as well as a cup of gourmet coffee. It opens doors to communication and allows troops to begin to heal their concerns and relieve their burdens related to the home front or their deployment.
