We're adding youth **Natalie Ondrey and Mollie Jarrett**, and young adults **Jason Klinger**, **Ashley and Ben Anderson**. **I will cochair with Dave**. We hope to meet in December to start the process and will keep you informed as we move through it.

My office hours will remain the same. Tuesday through Fridays I'm generally in the office every morning and most afternoons. I'm here for evening meetings, which vary from week to week. And of course, I'm here on Sundays. When I'm not here, I check my cell phone and email regularly. If you want to talk or meet, I'm always glad to do that. I'd just appreciate a call or an email first, so that I can be sure that I'm available for you and that it's not a bad time for me.

I'm still "Pastor Kris", "PK", or "Kris". No new name necessary, unless you're looking for or need extra points. My contact information is still the same as well. I will change the email eventually and will let you know when that happens.

I ask that you continue to keep the pastors and staff, the leaders and Search Committee in your prayers. You are certainly in our prayers.

Thank you to all the brave participants of the Oxfam Hunger Banquet on Nov. 6. You came to learn about the more than 2.2 billion people living in poverty, the nearly 795 million people suffering from chronic hunger, and the more than 8,000 children that die from malnutrition or a related, preventable illness each day. You were willing to open your hearts to the pain and distress that the knowledge of poverty imparts.

Our rich and bountiful planet produces enough food to feed every woman, man, and child on earth. You now know that hunger is about power. Its roots lie in inequalities in access to resources.

You experienced the reality that some of us are born into relative prosperity and security, while millions—through no choice of our own—are born into poverty. When you got your tickets, you drew your lot at random. Twelve of you experienced the fortune or misfortune of gaining or losing your socioeconomic status. A few of you enjoyed a filling, nutritious meal of Caribbean chicken stew, mixed vegetables and coconut rice with red beans. More of you ate rice with beans, a meal with a complete protein profile, but simple in palatability. Most of you had plain rice, an incomplete and bland meal, while seated on the floor.

Thank you to all the brave participants of the Oxfam Hunger Banquet. You were a group of almost 40 members who were willing to walk with the Mission Committee through a moving and meaningful representation of economic disparity. You raised nearly \$400 to

benefit Oxfam America, a global movement of people working together to end the injustice of poverty. With 70 years of experience in more than 90 countries, Oxfam helps people save lives in disasters, build stronger futures for themselves, and hold the powerful accountable.

#### **ADULT Bible Study WORKSHOP**



## Consistory Minutes By Deidre Bilger, subject to approval

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, November 21, 2016, by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report and the October – November 2016 bills were presented and approved.

**Property and Maintenance Committee:** cleaning, repairs and painting have been made to the outside stairwell leading to the basement kitchen entrance. Koren plumbers have cleaned the grease traps, opened up the drain line from the basement door and repaired two toilets. Approval was obtained to accept a donation from the Wehr Family to provide funds for the replacement of the food stand in the grove. Approvals were obtained from Consistory for several other projects including additional plumbing expenses, grove expenses, and replacement of the church brick chimney.

**Christian Education Committee:** the Children's Church Heifer Project mission curriculum started in November and will be the first Sunday of each month. A Bible journaling class has started and we are hopeful the class grows in size. Trunk or Treat and the annual hoagie sale were successful; the hoagie sale tithed \$50 to the General Fund. The committee will be sponsoring two Pathways families this Christmas.

**Church and Ministry Committee:** the Associate Pastor Search Committee has been identified and includes two young adults and two youth to participate on the committee.

**Welcoming Committee:** a new marketing strategy will be initiated for increasing membership. The request for funds for these outreach opportunities was presented and approved by Consistory. The committee is arranging to distribute Christmas Eve Services signs, and planning for the annual "Souper" Bowl party on February 5, 2017.

**Fellowship Committee:** the Advent luncheon will be held December 4, and the annual Shrove Tuesday pancake supper will be held on February 28

**Worship Committee:** upcoming opportunities to worship include: November 27 Communion, December 4 Jazz ensemble, December 11 Children's music program and Christmas carols on December 18. The sanctuary will be decorated for Christmas on Saturday, November 26.

The next regular meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory will be held Monday, December 19, in Room 101.

#### Tales from the Road

Willard Ruch was born on December 16, 1912 to Francis and Lottie (Bertch) Ruch at home in Ruchsville, PA. The town of Ruchsville was named after Willard's grandfather, Jacob Ruch. Willard had 3 older brothers, Allen, Harold and Clarence, one younger brother Stanley, and a younger sister, Arlene. At 103, Willard is the only member of his generation still living.

Willard was raised in the Lutheran church in Egypt until his marriage, when he joined Union UCC. Willard married Marie Hoffman on June 6, 1936 at Union UCC. Marie and Willard had two children, Dorothy Ruch Lakatosh and Ernest Ruch. Willard has 6 grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren and 5 great greatgrandchildren. Willard loved his wife, and appreciated her loving ways and great cooking. Marie made sure that Willard knew how to cook, teaching him many recipes once she was diagnosed with cancer. Willard and Marie had been married over 65 years when Marie died of cancer in 2001. Marie's legacy lives on, as Willard does the majority of his own cooking to this day. He certainly appreciates his daughter Dorothy's weekly cakes she bakes for him.

While Willard had to give up his driver's license this past summer, he still

drives his tractor and mows his own grass and rides his bicycle! (He showed me a picture his neighbor took of him riding his bike this summer.) He's looking forward to the battery powered chair that should arrive around Thanksgiving that will allow him to be more mobile in his neighborhood. Get ready, Egypt!

Willard worked at Mack Trucks from 11/14/1940 to 1972. He became indispensable to the government during WWII because of his work on vehicles manufactured by Mack Trucks for use by the military. He was a very hard worker, arriving by 7 a.m. in the morning to prepare to start his shift at 8 a.m.. He remembers his work at Mack Trucks fondly.

Willard used to sharpen blades and repair lawnmowers for his neighbors as a hobby. He enjoyed many seasons at a cabin in Pike County. He has fond memories of teaching his grandchildren to fish at the nearby lake.

I had the privilege and pleasure of interviewing Willard for this article just days before his death. We will miss you, Willard!

#### Mission Committee

The Mission Committee has chosen Habitat for Humanity of the Lehigh Valley and the Lehigh County Conference of Churches to be the recipients of this year's Advent self-denial offerings. Representatives of these organizations will speak at services during December.

Habitat for Humanity of the Lehigh Valley states that its mission is to transform lives and promote positive and lasting change within the community by improving the housing conditions of a significant number of households in a number of communities in the Lehigh Valley. One of the ways they accomplish this is by bringing volunteers together to build homes and help families be able to access affordable housing. Since its founding, the Lehigh Valley organization has grown to a full-time home building operation that has completed over 90 in Easton, Bethlehem and Allentown, assisting families in need of safe, affordable and decent housing. Habitat is a faith-based organization and its Web site states it was "founded on bridging theological differences by putting love into action. Everyone can use a hammer as an instrument to manifest God's love."

The Lehigh County Conference of Churches unites Christians through community service, ecumenical ministry, and advocacy for social justice issues, while administering programs that meet basic human needs and provide a path to stability for the Lehigh Valley's most vulnerable residents. Programs touch the lives of more than 14,000 individuals each year. These programs include:

- the **Ecumenical Soup Kitchen**, which serves 36,000 meals per year 1,500 of them to children,
- The **Daybreak** Drop-in Center, which serves more than 300 people struggling with mental health issues. The center serves 25,000 hot meals and 500 health screenings annually, among other services.
- **Pathways** Housing Services, which helps to find shelter for 2,200 individuals facing homelessness each year, and
- **Hope Program**, which helps 30 individuals struggling with the dual impacts of homelessness and mental illness.
