



## From the Interim Pastor

"What do the ashes mean to you this year?"

I am at the point in my life where I believe that the best spiritual insights come not from doctrine or dogma. The best spiritual insights come from asking the right questions.

A student once asked his teacher, "Why do you rabbis always answer a question with another question?"

The rabbi replied, "What's wrong with a question?" Perhaps the really important questions in life don't have answers. Or, as the poet, Rainer Maria Rilke writes:

"...be patient toward all that is unsolved in your heart and try to love the questions themselves... they are like locked rooms or books waiting to be read." (Letters to a Young Poet)

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of blessing ashes and placing them on the heads of participants while the pastor/priest proclaims: "Repent and believe" or "Remember that you are dust

and to dust you shall return..."

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season, a season in which Christians prepare for Easter in a variety of ways:

- Spiritual disciplines and special religious services;
- Bible Study and prayer;
- Repentance and asking for forgiveness;
- •Etc., etc., etc.

Many Protestants, including our German Reformed ancestors, object to the ritual of ashes because they believe it is "too Catholic."

It is only in the last 25 years or so that we UCC folk have observed the distribution of ashes. The pastors here at Union UCC will be offering ashes in a variety of ways this year.

The question I leave with you: "What do ashes mean to you this year?"

## Consistory Minutes By Deidre Bilger, subject to approval

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, February 20, 2017, by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report and the January – February 2017 bills were presented and approved.

**Property and Maintenance Committee reported** repairs are completed and everything is being maintained and is operating smoothly.

**Christian Education Committee reported** the Gertrude Hawk and pierogie fundraisers are going well. Supporters have the opportunity to buy Smidgens boxes to donate to KidsPeace. The Lent workshop will be held on March 12. **Mission Committee reported** Souper Bowl donations collected 350 cans of soup for the Northern Lehigh Food Bank and \$130 for the Lehigh Conference of Churches. Blanket Sunday has collected over \$1,200 and is anticipating reaching their goal of \$1,500. The Pint for Pint Blood Drive will take place on March 19 from 8am to 1pm in Memorial Hall. The Lenten Self-Denial offering will be split between the Northern Lehigh Food Bank and the Allentown Rescue Mission. The Urffer Fund, which is expressly for youth, will go to sponsoring two children in Africa. All 2016 mission donations were tallied and totaled \$55,353 which was an increase of over \$7,000 from 2015. Thank you to our generous Congregation!

**Church and Ministry Committee reported** they are working on completing the Union UCC Policy and Procedures manual and will present it to Consistory at the March meeting for review and approval. Consistory has accepted Mike Baer's resignation after 10 years of service with us.

Consistory approved a search committee seeking his replacement.

Welcoming Committee reported the annual Souper Bowl Tailgate party was a success; the committee reviewed the event and discussed potential improvements for next year. The meeting was attended by several Confirmands. Stewardship Committee reported the review of the 2016 e-Giving Campaign has been completed, and we experienced a \$23,000 increase through the Faith Commitment Cards. They continue to review current e-Giving Campaign. Fellowship Committee reported they donated \$342 to a family in need for Christmas; this effort will continue again next year. The annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper will be held on February 28 at 6:00pm. The annual Easter Egg Hunt is being planned for April 8. The Committee is looking to add to its membership; please feel free to join. Worship Committee reported upcoming opportunities

Worship Committee reported upcoming opportunities for worship: Communion on February 26, Ash Wednesday on March 1. In addition to services at noon and 7pm on March 1, ashes and prayer will be available in our parking lot at 8am and 5:30pm. Other worship opportunities include: March 5 for the first Sunday in Lent; March 12, guest speaker Rayna DuBose; April 2, Healing Service; April 9, Palm Sunday; April 13, Maundy Thursday; April 14, Good Friday and April 16, Easter.

The next regular meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory will be held Monday, March 20, in Room 101.

# Mission Committee

Lenten Self-Denial

The Northern Lehigh Food Bank is the recipient of one half of this year's Lenten Self-Denial offerings. The NLFB was organized many years ago by the many local churches in the Northern Lehigh area, Union UCC is one of those churches (Union Lutheran is also a member). The food bank serves families in the Northern Lehigh area, and also members of the member churches, who may live outside the designated area.

The NL Food Bank currently **serves over 200 families,** which includes children, adults, and seniors, some may be your friends or neighbors. Qualified clients visit the food bank once a month, on their designated day, to shop for food to supplement their monthly food needs, based on their family size.

Members of **Union UCC provide over 10,000 pounds** of food yearly to the food bank, yet this only represents a small percentage of what is needed to provide food to over 200 families a month. The food bank also receives food from other churches, service organizations, scout troops, and private food drives. Yet these donations still do not provide enough.

Monetary donations to the NL food bank are necessary to fill that gap to provide enough food to those 200 families each month.

**Monetary donations provide funds** to purchase additional bulk food through Second Harvest Food Bank, to provide for operating expenses to continue the ministry of the food bank, to provide for repairs and upkeep for the walk in cooler, walk in fridge, and other smaller freezer units and more.

Your gifts to the Lenten Self Denial offering will greatly improve the ministry of the food bank, and make a difference to the lives to all who are served.

The Mission Committee has designated the Allentown Rescue Mission to be the recipient of the Lenten self-denial offering. Using a Christ-centered approach, the mission works to tackle the root causes of homelessness. Since 1961, the mission has been located at 355 Hamilton Street near center-city Allentown. On the average, more than 800 individuals are served annually. It offers services to homeless men through several programs. They include:

**The Gateway Center:** This 48-bed facility is an emergency shelter. Stays are limited to 14 days and it is considered a gateway to other services for the homeless.

**The Christian Living and Values Program:** This residential program works to restore homeless men to God and the community. It includes transitional housing and housing assistance, meals and clothing and life skills education. Daily Bible study and pastoral counseling addresses spiritual issues.

The Life Recovery and Treatment Program: The state Department of Health has licensed this program as a medically monitored drug and alcohol rehabilitation facility. Emphasizing spirituality in recovery, the program offers traditional drug and alcohol 12-step meetings, psychiatric services, anger management and relapse prevention. The mission helps men who complete the program to move forward with paid employment and low-cost housing.

**Clean Team:** Men can find paid employment on the mission's team that provides clean-up services for businesses ranging from sports facilities and malls to offices.



What a wonderful blessing to our kids and to those they hoped to help.


Spring is coming and plans are underway for some improvements to our church property. Caring for the three buildings, which make up our whole main church property, and were built in 1872, 1957, and 2003, takes continuous work and planning.

Some years the improvement projects are seen by everyone, while other projects are hidden from view of the public, but necessary in the care and upkeep of our large property. One of the projects this year will be seen daily by many, while the other project will be seen more by birds than people.

Project one will be to finish upgrading the basement stairway entrance to the kitchen and fellowship hall. The concrete steps will be resurfaced with special concrete epoxy products, the front edges striped with yellow paint, and the walls will be given a second coat of paint.

Project two will be to rebuild the brick chimney on the back of the 1872 sanctuary, still in use daily with the oil burners. Scaffolding will be built at the rear of the nursery, and then up the back of the church to reach the chimney. The mason's will tear the old chimney down, and rebuild with new brick, in the same design as the old one.

Both projects will be performed by the Haas Masonry Crew and will "enhance our church property for years to come. Funding for both projects are possible through earnings from the Funds Of Lasting Gifts Endowment Plan. Blessings to all who provide for the continued care and maintenance of our church property.
