The Sanctuary will be open for prayer during the day, stop by anytime. **7:00pm** Worship with Communion and a Tenebrae Service

Tenebrae is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness" and is a Christian religious service celebrated during Holy Week, before Easter. Tenebrae is distinctive for its gradual extinguishing of candles while a series of scriptures are read. The purpose of the service is to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the passion of Christ, and it is left unfinished, because the story isn't over until Easter Day.

## From the Interim Pastor

#### "Spring Flowers"

Its customary to celebrate Easter with flowers: lilies, hyacinths, tulips... and by Easter Sunday this year the grove will most likely be blooming with daffodils. Spring flowers remind us of new life, beauty, and the goodness of creation.

During this Lenten Season I've had the opportunity to experience the beauty and goodness of creation through several occasions in the life of our congregation.

- One of the members of the congregation took it upon himself to get a few folks together to renew an old tradition of baking "raised cakes," and baked 65 raised cakes to benefit the church, including taking a few of the cakes to older members who used to help bake these cakes but can no longer help;
- Another of our members won a catered meal for 20 people and donated the entire catered meal to the Daybreak program and fed 30 handicapped individuals in inner city Allentown:
- One Sunday during worship four of our high school seniors told stories about how Union UCC was an important part of their lives, while other youth sang, danced, and led us in prayer;
- Another Sunday the members of Union UCC donated 34 pints of blood and \$600 to the Miller Memorial Blood Bank.

Each of these events was beautiful in its own way. Each one was a reminder of the new life, beauty, and goodness of creation. Each one was as lovely as an Easter flower. I wonder what other spring flowers might grow here at Union UCC during this Easter Season!

## Consistory Minutes By Deidre Bilger, subject to approval

President Brad Hackett called the monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting to order on Monday, March 20, 2017 at 6:47 p.m.

The Treasurer's Report and the February – March 2017 bills were presented and approved.

**Property and Maintenance Committee** -The elevator and organ were serviced. Work pending: Oil burner cleaning, scaffolding to be built for chimney work in March/April, outside basement stairs to be completed at when pre-school is over for this year, April 1 will be spring cleanup day, May 13 - Men's Group cleanup day, Phil Wehr presented plans for new food stand in grove.

Christian Education Committee - Gertrude Hawk fundraiser and pierogi enabled purchase of Children's Bibles, support bus trips, and helped purchase supplies for Lent Celebration. There is no Sunday School on Easter. The Lenten Workshop had attendance of about 80 people, and a great mix of adults, children and families.

**Mission Committee reported** -Pint for Pint Blood Drive was a success with 34 people donating blood, \$600 to Miller Keystone. Two lunches are being offered to members of Daybreak through the Mission Discretionary Fund. Winston's

Restaurant in Allentown matched that donation.

**Church and Ministry Committee -** they have completed a revised Union UCC Policy and Procedures Manual and Dave Fleming presented it to Consistory for discussion and review., it will be voted on for approval at the April Consistory.

**Welcoming Committee -** Three ideas were presented to spread the word of Union UCC.: Facebook "check-ins" at Worship, magnets, advertising on Google and Bing.

**Stewardship Committee -** they reviewed the budget at their last meeting.

**Fellowship Committee -** Shrove Tuesday was a success with approximately 150 people attending, and \$197 in donations. Easter Egg Hunt is planned for April 8, donations will be in the foyer.

**Worship Committee reported that** the following dates are on the calendar for Worship: April 2, Healing Service; April 9, Palm Sunday; April 13, Maundy Thursday; April 14, Good Friday and April 16, Easter.

The next regular meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory will be held Monday, April 17, 2017, in Room 101.

## Blanket Sunday Results

Donations for Blanket Sunday this year totals \$1,530 for Church World Services. Thank you for supporting this yearly event to provide warmth, comfort, and love to people around the world when disasters strike.

Union UCC is one of over 8,000 congregations across the U.S. which holds a CWS Blankets event.

For over 60 years, CWS has worked in partnership with local communities to identify their needs and access the resources they need to build the foundation for a more viable future, including:

- Blankets, tents, food and other emergency supplies in the wake of a disaster
- Tools and seeds for refugees returning home.
- Wells for families living in drought prone areas to provide clean, safe water.

During 2016, CWS services provided over 4,500 blankets in 17 US states, including 250 blankets in Pennsylvania, to help families after disasters or to protect the homeless. Over 5,000 blankets were provided to communities in Central America, Serbia, Africa and countries around the world.

Both services included scripture, prayer, ashes and communion.

We also added 'drive by' ashes. At 8-8:30am Rev. Patience and I each stood in one of our parking lots. We put a sign up that said "Free ashes, Free Prayer." We had 5 people come by at 8am. At 5:30-6:30pm Pastor Allan helped me repeat this. We had about 30 people come by during that time. Several members of our church and community said how much this offering meant to them, especially if they weren't able to attend one of the worship services.

Our pastors and staff will continue to make worship meaningful and relevant on Sundays and by adding more worship experiences and styles. Our hope is that you will find God's spirt of hope and renewal by sharing in a favorite worship tradition or a new time or style or worship.

Ruth was born June 16,1924 in Egypt and grew up in a large family. As a family of nine, two parents, four boys and three girls, they had family prayers when "the whole clan" was together. They said grace before meals and all went to church. Ruth's mother said "You go to church on Sunday. First Sunday School, then church." They caught the trolley in Egypt and were taken to Neffs to church. Once married, each of the children's spouses also went to church. Ruth's older sister, Irene, was a member of the Union Lutheran church, and drove Ruth to church every Sunday before she went to the Lutheran services. Ruth's father worked at Mack Trucks. The family always had large family picnics in the summer, and walked to the movies in Northampton for an 'outing.'"

The schoolhouse was across the street from their home and the children attended school until 8th or 9th grade, some went on to attend Whitehall High School. Ruth liked sewing and crafts, but she did not like math or geography. After her schooling was finished, Ruth worked in a sewing factory. She even made her own bridal gown and all the bridesmaid's dresses. In Ruth's young adult life, she taught Sunday School to the younger children. Ruth's parents were always faithful and generous stewards in their giving at church and Ruth continues that family tradition today.

Ruth's favorite hymn is "Bringing in the Sheaves," and one of her favorite memories is people carrying in the sheaves as they walked from the back of the church to the chancel rail. Another favorite memory is going to church with her parents and siblings—one time, as a young child, her sister, Irene, was running back and forth in the aisle, and her mother said, "No" but Irene kept running. Her mother had to take Irene into the hallway to discipline her.

Ruth says she felt God's strength and approval as she cared for her husband until his death, and afterwards the church's steadfastness gave her comfort and peace. She loves her church is because it is the only church she has ever known; she knows she is loved when she is there. After hearing the sermons, she always feels her faith is strengthened, despite knowing her faith has always been strong.

She leaves us with her words of wisdom, "Praise the Lord and go to church."
