I've thought a lot about why people go to church since I've come to Union UCC as your Interim Assistant Pastor. Many of you have shared your answers to this question through our Stewardship Moments during Sunday worship. You have been a true inspiration to me and to one another.

As I begin my last month as your Interim Assistant Pastor, I want to thank all of you for renewing my faith and helping me discover the value of a vibrant, dynamic congregational life. You have blessed me more than you will ever know. Thank you.

All good things must come to an end, or so the saying goes. Well, this is the case with the current food stand in the church grove. After serving two churches and the former Union Church Sunday School for over 60 years, the food stand is nearing the end of its life. This summer will be the finale season for us to utilize the food stand, and it has served us well for these past decades. While the food stand may leave, the memories will last for years to come.

Here is the good news. Once the old stand is torn down, a new food stand will rise up to take its place. After a lengthy time of review and thought, a new, enlarged food stand was designed. With input from the Property and Fellowship Committees and other members, a revised plan was then approved by the consistory. Gone will be the head hitting wooden doors, gone will be the decades old freezer, gone will be the crumbling floor and foundation, gone will be the tight aisles for people to pass.



Coming soon will be roll up doors at the serving windows, a new freezer, wider aisles and working spaces, large outside overhangs, concrete exterior sidewalks, more storage space, and a working sink with drain tank. The outside design of the new food stand will compliment the existing stage and picnic pavilions, and will complete the puzzle of grove upgrades and improvements which began back in 2008..

Tales from the Road

Janet Bachman was born at home in Fogelsville on December 31, 1930, making her father very happy, because her arrival gave him another tax deduction (in addition to a wonderful daughter!) Janet grew up with one sister and one brother in Fogelsville. She was baptized, confirmed and married at St. John's Reformed Church (now UCC) in Fogelsville.

Janet attended nursing school at Haff Hospital in Northampton. After graduation Dr. Haff asked Janet to continue at the Haff Hospital. Janet worked as a nurse primarily on the maternity ward for two years following graduation. After Donald and Janet were married, Donald wanted Janet to learn how to help on the farm, so Janet put her nursing career on hold. In 1980, when Janet was 50 years old, she went back to work as a nurse for 11 years in the Miller Building at Phoebe Home. Janet and Donald's daughter, Jayne, began her career in nursing as a candy striper at the old Osteopathic Hospital in Allentown, now part of St. Luke's Hospital. Jayne graduated from the nursing program at Lehigh Carbon Community College in 1991 and went on to work at Cedarbrook Nursing Home for 15 years as a certified nurse's aide and for 24 years as a nurse. After retirement, Jayne has become a private nurse for her parents.

Janet met Donald Bachman at a square dance at the Fire Hall in Fogelsville while in nursing school. Janet was very impressed with Donald's square dancing skills. Donald was equally impressed with Janet and wanted to take her home that

evening. However, Janet's father said no. That didn't stop Donald, as he asked Janet for a date the very next day. Their courtship led to marriage on July 11, 1953. Donald and Janet had five children, Donald, Jr., David, Douglas, Jayne and Daniel. They bought a farm on Copeechan Road in 1962. There they raised chickens for eggs, potatoes, corn, wheat and soybeans. After working on the farm for 45 years Janet and Donald sold their farm in 2007.

Donald was baptized and confirmed at Union UCC, so Janet became a member of Union UCC following her marriage. She and Donald were very active members of Union UCC. They raised their children in the church and both sang on the choir.

Janet and Donald moved into Fellowship Community in April 2016. They were married 63 years when Donald died in December, 2016. They have 6 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.
