

Consistory By Deb Wenner Subject to Approval

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, January 15, 2018 by President Brad Hackett.

The Treasurer's Report and the December 2017- January 2018 bills were presented and approved.

Property and Maintenance Committee is requesting from FOLG for the following annual requests: \$2,000 for care & maintenance of the elevator,\$1,000 for gutter cleaning & slate repair, & \$6,000 for miscellaneous property repairs or upgrades as needed for 2018. Also FOLG for the following projects:\$10,000 for paving & drainage near the food stand in the grove, & \$15,000 for the grove project, to include costs of the holding tank, sidewalks, and electrical upgrades to the exterior lighting.

Christian Education Committee ran 3 missions for the Christmas season: Holiday Hope Chest Boxes, the Be a Hero program, and Reverse Advent baskets. The Advent workshop & brunch went very well. They will be holding Lent Messy Church Workshops Wednesday nights 2/21–3/14. There will be a selection of themed crafts each week, dinner and a short reflection/devotional time..

Mission Committee - 2017 mission giving totaled \$68,031, an increase of over \$12,600 from 2016. Over 30 baskets were filled for the reverse Advent mission, gifts were purchased for 75 children served by Bethlehem Salvation Army, & 298 cold weather accessories, were delivered to The 6th St. Shelter. Family Promise meeting. on Sun., March 4th @ 11:45 we will have our own organizational meeting on Family Promise. Souper Bowl Sunday is Feb. 4th. Money collected will go to L.V. Conference of Churches and the canned soup to the Northern Lehigh Food Bank. The Rev. Dr. Larry Pickens will preach that

day. Blanket Sunday is Feb. 25th. Pint for Pint Blood Drive & soup sale is tentatively scheduled for March 25th. Lenten Self Denial offering will go to Bethany Children's Home & Lehigh County Meals on Wheels.

Church and Ministry -Pastor Patience may be needing some time off. We intend to continue to pay her during that time. Dave DiPalontonio program year paid ½ year by church & ½ year by Youth Group Fund. Youth Group will fund the rest of this year, & they will reevaluate in the future. \$3,000 was requested from FOLG for worship guests.

Welcoming Committee - Souper Bowl Sunday luncheon will be held Feb. 4th after the 10:30 service. New member sessions will be held Feb. 11th and Feb. 18th at 9:15 in the Memory Room.

Stewardship Committee is requesting \$1500 for Golden Times, \$2000 for welcoming outreach & publicity, & \$1000 for continuing education for Pastor Kayli & Kathy Bonsell from the FOLG.

Estate gifts were given by the George family, Baer family, & Lillian Casselberry. Using these gifts to replace the rug, paint, & touch up the pews in the Sanctuary were discussed.

Fellowship Committee – will meet on Feb. 12th to prepare for Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper which is being held on Tues., Feb. 13th. They will begin Easter Egg Hunt preparation in March.

The next regular meeting of the Consistory will take place Monday, February 19 at 6:45pm in Memorial Hall.



New Years Resolutions, Anyone?

Another new year has begun and like many people I am reflecting on the year behind me and considering things that I could do to make my life better in the year ahead. You know what I'm talking about ... New Year's Resolutions! I've made them before: lose weight, exercise more, save more money, increase my charitable giving, etc. I'm going to encourage you to add making yourself happier to your list of resolutions. It might sound selfish, but I believe God would have us experience more joy in our lives. Also, if we make ourselves happier in general the greater challenges we have in life will become much easier to manage. Recently I read an article in the New York Times entitled 4 *Easy(ish) Steps Towards Happiness You Can Take Today*. Let's take a quick look at these steps.

1. Conquer Your Negative Thinking

As human beings we have evolved to focus on the negative. If we overlearn a bad situation, we're more inclined to avoid those situations in the future or react more quickly. But, as we all know, that isn't always helpful in a modern world. When something bad happens, we tend to overanalyze and have trouble getting our mind off it.

The trick to avoiding those spirals and rabbit holes of misery is to acknowledge and challenge our negative thoughts. Rather than try to bury them, we should own those thoughts and ask ourselves a few questions, like, "What is the evidence for this thought?" or "Am I basing this on facts or on feelings?" A little self-investigation can help us get over the thoughts that just we can't get out of our heads.

2. Forgive Yourself

This one is really simple: Go easy on yourself. If you're compassionate and supportive of other people, why shouldn't you give yourself the same luxury?

This can be a difficult concept for those of us who tend to beat ourselves up over perceived failures, so try to for this exercise you can use to practice self-compassion. Write yourself a letter of compassion just as you would to a neighbor or friend who has experienced a hardship. The concept is the same, only the recipient is you.

3. Money Helps, But Only to a Point

An often-cited study from a few years ago boldly named the amount of money at which happiness peaks: \$75,000 per year. Another recent (but less rigorous) examination put that number at \$100 million. Still another study said lottery winners are no happier than the rest of us. Interesting!

The truth is, we're plagued by the constant craving for the next thing. A more helpful way to look at this idea is to find purpose and meaning at work. Rather than focusing on work as a means to earn money, try to find genuine satisfaction and purpose in the work you do. Studies have shown this is possible in every type of work.

4. Buy More Time

If given the choice between buying material things and buying services that save you time, you might want to think about the timesavers.

In two surveys cited in the NYT guide to happiness, researchers found that people who spent money on conveniences like ordering takeout for dinner or getting a cab were happier than those who didn't.

So what does that mean for you? If you can afford it, buy yourself some extra time. (Yes, this is permission to order a pizza for dinner tonight.)

So, these are four steps towards happiness that you might consider taking during 2018. Thank you Tim Herrera of the New York Times!


