**Family Promise Update** Pastor Kris and the Mission Committee Family Promise enables communities to work together to address the needs of homeless families by securing temporary shelter through host congregations, providing meals donated by host congregations, and comprehensive services offered through local governmental and privately funded aid groups.

Here are some of the ways that we will need help – as we know of now:

- Steering Committee helping to organize the various pieces needed.
- Donating, Preparing Serving Supper, Breakfast, Bagged lunches
- Hosting families for a few hours in the evening helping them with directions in the building, visiting with those who want to visit, helping with homework, playing board games, etc.

### **Consistory** By Deidre Bilger Subject to Approval

The monthly meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory Meeting was called to order on Monday, March 19, 2018, by President Aften Hamm.

The Treasurer's Report and the February 19 – March 16 bills were presented and approved.

**Property and Maintenance Committee -** 13 volunteers changed bulbs in the sanctuary to new LED bulbs and also cleaned pews, woodwork and polished brass. A maple tree which fell in the grove during the March 2 windstorm was removed. There was no damage to any grove buildings; a new tree will be planted in the same location in the Spring. Upgrades to the security camera system have been completed. A cleaning service is filling in to clean the property while Ori is healing from his hip operation. Maria and AJ are doing extra duties during this time. Everything else is in good shape, preparing for Easter, and then a Saturday spring outdoor cleanup day. Look for emails to help.

Christian Education Committee - hosted the Messy Lent workshops and are planning Vacation Bible School.
Mission Committee - Lenten Offering will be split equally between the Bethany Children's Home and Meals on Wheels of the Lehigh Valley. Pint-for-Pint blood drive and soup sale will

be benefitting Miller-Keystone Blood Center. Family Promise is still working to secure a day center. May collection of items will go to Nurse-Family Partnership of St. Luke's University Health Network. Pastor Kris received a letter stating that the Sixth Street Shelter, the only shelter that keeps families together, is very close to running out of funding and closing. One Great Hour of Sharing will be in May. Offering envelopes have changed the wording from "Benevolence" to "Mission".

**Church and Ministry** -Jeffrey Mensendiek, on mission work supporting Christianity in Japan, will be joining PNEC and Union UCC. Due to his mission work and time abroad, a motion to accept Mr. Mensendiek as a member was presented and approved.

**Welcoming Committee -** discussed the work of the Committee, a recent Penn Southeast Conference workshop, an article and the success of the recent Souper Bowl Tailgate celebration.

**Worship Committee -** while it did not meet, the committee expressed thanks in advance for their service for Union Easter Services.

The next regular meeting of the Union United Church of Christ Consistory will be held Monday, April 16, in Room 101.

#### **Easter Mission Offerings**

The Mission Committee has selected **Meals on Wheels** of the Lehigh County, and **Bethany Children's Home** in Womelsdorf, PA to receive this year's Easter Mission Offerings. You are truly making a difference in the lives of people in the local community.

#### Meals on Wheels of the Lehigh County

Their mission is to serve seniors or adults with disabilities who are primarily homebound and unable to cook or shop for themselves. Their services include meal delivery, well-being checks, friendly visits, grocery shopping, and linking clients to other services to help them live independently and stay healthy in their own homes.

Sixty six volunteers deliver meals and smiles to 465 clients each weekday. Volunteers are so important, 69% of clients state that the volunteer is the only person they see all day, 36% state that the volunteer is the only person they see all week.

Last year, over 165,000 meals were delivered by over 850 volunteers. New delivery volunteers are always needed - call Dawn at 610-398-2536.

#### **Bethany Children's Home**

Located on a beautiful campus in Womelsdorf, PA, Bethany Children's Home helps children and youth reclaim their lives from trauma, abuse, and neglect. In 2017, they helped close to 300 children, coming from 20 counties in Pennsylvania.

Their mission is to provide a safe place of nurture, protection, and supportive care to aid their residents in their self understanding, growth, and healing toward a brighter future. Founded in 1863, Bethany Children's Home provides a home to youth to gain an education, to have a place for music therapy, arts & recreation, spiritual services, social services and more.

Their mission is active and vibrant all year long in improving the lives of children and youth from age 7 - 20, a true blessing to brighten their future.





### **Rev. Jeffrey Mensendiek**

Dear members of Union UCC. Greetings from Japan, where I have been working for the past 28 years as a mission coworker for our UCC Common Global Ministries. The Penn Northeast Conference is one of the conferences that I visit while back on home assignment once every four years. When on home assignment I usually introduce the witness of our partner church in Japan (known as the Kyodan), and share perspectives of God's mission as seen in the context of East Asia. Five years ago I had the pleasure of visiting you church for a small group gathering. As of this spring, I have asked that my clergy standing be transferred to Penn Northeast Conference, and after consulting with both Rev. Tom Thomas and Pastor Kris, have decided to seek membership at Union UCC.



You might wonder what it means for me to seek membership at a local church such as Union. One of the standing requirements in the UCC is that clergy who work in non-parish settings enter into a four-way covenantal relationship (known as "A Four-Way Ministry Covenant") between the ordained minister, the calling body, the local UCC conference and the local church where the ordained minister is a member. This implies an intentional relationship between the four parties that will strengthen, support and sustain the ministries of all the partners that share in this covenant. This is one way in which the conference and local church can provide spiritual support for a person such as myself working overseas. Though I have spent most of my life outside of the United States, I hope that my connections to both PNEC and Union UCC will be an enriching one for us all.

My ties to Pennsylvania run deep. My mother grew up in Lancaster PA, and my uncle, Stan Dunn, was a pastor in the Allentown area for many years. I grew up as a son of missionaries in Sendai, Japan, which was the place where many graduates of Lancaster Theological Seminary focused their mission efforts starting in the mid-1880s. Our partners in the Sendai area know the UCC, and are particularly grateful for the ties that we have enjoyed for over 130 years. Seven years ago when the great earthquake, tsunami and nuclear disaster rocked the whole nation of Japan, I was working in Sendai and was blessed to be able to live through that experience with our partners. In a time of crisis, our relationship made all the difference. As churches around the world reached out to support the survivors and find ways to monitor the dangers of the nuclear disaster, I was honored to be able to work alongside our partners in their relief efforts. I saw firsthand how our OGHS dollars made a direct impact on the lives of the survivors. I continue to update the situation in northeastern Japan through my personal blog: (http://jeffreyfromjapan.blogspot.com/)

From April of this year I will be working as chaplain and associate professor at Oberlin University in Tokyo (a UCC related school whose founder was educated at Oberlin College in Ohio). My basic role will be to teach introductory classes to Christianity to incoming freshman, to lead chapel services, and to work to maintain the Christian identity of the university. Christians in Japan are 1% of the population. Though Oberlin is a Christian institution, most students have had no contact with Christianity. It will be my role to help them understand Christianity, and through the Christian emphasis on campus to open their horizons to their neighbor, society and the world. I also hope to make periodic visits to the Sendai area, to visit friends and churches, and to keep the relationship alive between the Kyodan, UCC and Disciples churches in the US.

I am married to Kazuko Ikawa from Kyoto, Japan. We have three children; Hana (daughter, 18), Tomo (son, 16) and Stella (daughter, 11). I was born in Buffalo, NY, and went to Japan at the age of two. I graduated from Bucknell University, Received a master's degree from the Pacific School of Religion, and was ordained at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis. My calling is to be a bridge between cultures, and to be a sign of God's love and healing presence in this broken and divided world.

# Feed My Starving Children by Eliot Lightner

Last October my son Everett and I took part in a Feed My Starving Children mobile meal packing event. My hope was to show him the importance of giving back as well as to help him appreciate how lucky we are for all that we have. I had no idea of the impact the event would have on me.

Before the meal packing began, we were told that on average 6,200 children die each day from hunger related causes. That is one every 14 seconds. Each one of these deaths is preventable because there is plenty of food it is just not where it is needed most. FMSC is a Christian nonprofit organization working to feed the children most in need. Every meal is packed, paid for, and distributed by volunteers. After hearing this, we were all ready to get started.

Packing a meal involves placing scoops of rice, soy, vitamins and minerals, and dried vegetables into a funnel. A bag at the base of the funnel collects the ingredients and then is heat sealed. This scientifically developed formula helps to treat and prevent malnutrition. There were several of these work stations trying to pack as many meals as possible. Before I knew it we were told time was up. After a brief cleanup we came together to hear the results. We packed over 67,000 meals! That is enough to feed 184 children for a year.

After the event I could not stop thinking about it. Never have I felt like I was part of something that made such an impact in the lives of those in need. I wanted to bring my experience to others so I started to tell people about my experience and my desire to bring an event to the Lehigh Valley. Everyone was very supportive so I contacted FMSC to see if it would be possible. It makes me so proud to say that on **the weekend of October 12th of this year we at Union UCC will be hosting the first ever FMSC mobile pack event in the Lehigh Valley**. Please consider getting involved. Together we will turn hunger into hope for children in need.
