From the Property Committee

Improvement projects are in the works for 2019. This year's main project will focus on our sanctuary. Painter's will begin in January and February by painting the pews on the main floor of the sanctuary and the woodwork along the walls, plus the window and door frames. The hymnal racks will also be stained and cleaned up.

Part two of the sanctuary project will happen this July or August as the rug will be replaced. The old rug will be removed, a new layer of quarter inch plywood installed in the whole sanctuary, and the new rug installed on the main floor and the pulpit. The pews will be moved and re-installed after the rug is installed. This will be a major project for Union UCC and long overdue. More details of this part of the project will follow in future news-letters.

Smaller projects, repairs, upgrades and routine maintenance will occur around the church campus as needed throughout the year. Stay posted.




