#### FROM THE PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Just a reminder - Part two of Union UCC's 2019 sanctuary upgrade project will begin this July. This includes the removal and replacement of the rug along with installation of a layer of 1/4" plywood under the new rug and pad.

The project will begin on Thursday July 11 with the moving of the pews, split between Memorial Hall, the nursery and hallway. On Monday July 15 the old rug will begin to be removed, followed by installation of the new plywood and the new rug, which will take 5-6 days. Once completed the pews will be brought back and installed in their proper place in the sanctuary. Completion date is expected to be July 25.

Due to this project, worship services on Sunday July 14 & 21 will be held outdoors in the church grove at 10:30 only, there will be no 8:00 services. Please mark your calendars, reminders will follow. In case of rain, services will be held downstairs in Fellowship Hall at 10:30. Thank you for your patience during this major project, a long time in the making.

The new landscaping in the front of the church sanctuary and Memorial Hall has been completed and is looking great. A wonderful new addition to our beautiful property. Thank you to Emery Landscaping of Schnecksville for their design and installation of all the plants, shrubbery and mulch. Enjoy.



#### WHERE SCHOOL MEMORIES BEGIN!

The preschool hallways and classrooms may be quiet during the summer month, but that does not mean learning has to come to an end. Summer is the perfect time to give children some "structured freedom"- keeping the children in safe and supervised settings, but allowing them to explore new areas and new types of play. Children learn best through hands-on interactions

with their environment, including their own home. If you are looking for simple ideas or boredom busters, internet sites such at Pinterest can come to the rescue. Many of the ideas that can be found online are inexpensive and easy to implement at home, just keep these tips in mind:

- 1. Always supervise children when using art supplies
- 2. Consider the age-appropriateness of any activity: if it involves small parts that could become a chocking hazard, or requires chemicals for a science experiment, do not attempt if your child still puts everything in his/her mouth.
- 3. Worried about a mess, put down a plastic table cloth from the dollar store as a drop cloth.
- 4. Children love to create; gather recycled items such as magazines, toilet paper tubes, material, stickers, etc... and set up a Creation Station.
- 5. Simply rearranging your furniture for an afternoon gets children looking at a room differently, and what once was used as a castle now becomes a boat for pretend adventures.


8/29 Gladys Kuhns 6307 Niset Court Slatington, PA 18080 The fiscal year 2019-2020 budget, in an amount of \$492,000, was approved by the congregation at the June 9 Semi-annual Congregational Meeting. This approval completes the annual budget process that starts in March with meetings among the Financial Leadership Team. This is followed by a presentation of the draft budget to the Consistory in April and final approval by the Consistory in May.

The new budget also includes earnings from a portion of the Funds of Lasting Gifts to support ministerial salaries, the Golden Times program, evangelism activities, special financial mailings, Christian education curriculums and special worship guests. These planned expenditures will require approval by the FOLG trustees to ensure fund guidelines are being met. Regarding general operating expenses, the budget includes funding for a full staff including one additional office staff. This additional staff is being funded from savings during our period of interim ministry from past years. Additionally, the budget includes a 2% salary increase for staff while other "controllable" expense categories were held at or below the past year spending levels.





Worship Theme for the Summer Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. — Philippians 4:6

We will go on a "journey" of prayer through the summer, based on both personal devotion through the week and corporate celebration of our journey together in worship.

We will learn about prayer beads. The tradition of using a string of beads or rope knot is an ancient tradition as well as being a ritual action shared by many faith traditions around the globe. The common connection is the ability to give structure to personal prayer devotion. It offers a way to remind and revisit various areas of focus and concern. Repeated rituals can be powerful as they help shape our habits.

This summer, we are invited to pray "All My Days" (our theme song) and to make a habit of prayer wherever you are. Each Sunday in worship we will focus on one of the steps of the prayer beads but you are encouraged to pray any and all of these prayer areas all summer long. We will also share the week's prayers and scripture on Facebook so that we can stay connected to each other even when we're apart.
