

Tales from the Road

Rev. Dr. Patience D. Stevenson, Minister of Visitation DidYou Know?

Ruth (Schneck) Purner was born at home in South Whitehall Township. She grew up on what was then Main Street in South Whitehall Township (now Huckleberry Road) with her brother and sister. Ruth graduated from the first class of Parkland High School (the building that is now the middle school.) In May, 1959 Rev. Urffer officiated at the wedding of Ruth Schneck and Earl Purner at Union UCC. They have one daughter, Melissa, and one granddaughter, Katherine.

Ruth worked at the Lehigh County Courthouse for 20 years, serving as Deputy Clerk of Courts during part of that time. Following retirement from the courthouse Ruth cared for many young children in her home while raising her own daughter, Melissa.

Ruth was raised at the Union Church in Neffs. Not uncommon at the time, Ruth's father belonged to the Lutheran congregation and her mother belonged to the Reformed congregation. Ruth was baptized by a Lutheran pastor, Rev. E.S. Kidd, confirmed and married by Rev. Urffer, a Reformed pastor. Ruth has maintained her membership at Union UCC for the entirety of her adult life. Ruth served on the Consistory, Fellowship Committee, and the first Pictorial Directory committee in 1978. She also assisted in collating and folding bulletins for 35 vears!

Unintended consequences of pesticides and herbicides include killing beneficial insects, pollinators and their host plants. To help rejuvenate Monarch butterfly populations, plant milkweed, the only food for their caterpillars. Plant in a sunny spot where you don't mind it spreading or can contain it. Nearby flowers like purple coneflower, butterfly bush, zinnias and others attract & feed the butterflies that will lay eggs on the milkweed. A caterpillar feeds about 2 weeks then forms a chrysalis on a neighboring plant. In about 2 more weeks, a butterfly emerges. Every September/October, the year's last generation of Monarchs migrates to Mexico to hibernate all winter then journeys back north to produce the 1st generation of the I next year. Last fall, we found over a dozen chrysalises in our garden. If you want free milkweed seeds or plants, let me know.



"In her college class on world religions, Barbara introduces her students to other religious traditions and accompanies them on field trips to a variety of venues of worship. Both she and her students ponder and debate how the knowledge and insights they have gained raise important questions about belief, and explore how different practices relate to their own faith. Inspired by these intellectual and spiritual discussions, Barbara turns once again to the Bible for guidance, to see what secrets lay buried there.

Throughout Holy Envy, Barbara weaves together stories from her classroom with reflections on how her own spiritual journey has been challenged and renewed by connecting with people of other traditions--and by meeting God in her communion with them.

At the heart of her odyssey is her trust in God and knowledge that God is always with her. 


