
# Please bring:

# SIXTH STREET SHELTER

Our church grove has been enjoyed by many this summer. Recent events include VBS week, Messy Church, Youth Group Hangouts, Girl Scout Summer Camp, outdoor worships, the Lion's Festival, Blues Nite Out, our church picnic, many church member family gatherings, and the upcoming Backyard BBQ Bash.

# FAMILY PROMISE UPDATE— OUR NEXT HOSTING IS OCTOBER 27 THROUGH NOVEMBER 3

From July 28 through August 4, Union UCC hosted three families through our collaboration with Family Promise of Lehigh Valley. With a three-month old infant and a two-year-old toddler, as well as a trio of elementary-aged kids, our volunteers were forced into "active duty!" It was a pleasure being immersed into the energy and imagination from the group of guests. Our volunteer cooks provided fantastic meals, which fed all 9 guests and any volunteer helpers that socialized with the families during the mealtime and evening hours. Our overnight volunteers helped get the families settled for the evening and were entrusted with keeping a quiet and safe environment in which the families slept, as well as made sure they were on their way in the mornings, with lunches packed and breakfast in hand. During this week, a few overnight volunteers expertly dealt with a plumbing issue that provided a little more excitement to an otherwise uneventful evening.

As we continue to provide loving hospitality as Jesus calls us all to do, we invite any members from the congregation to volunteer with us. Children are welcomed and encouraged to join parents with hosting our guests. We have an engaged group that coordinates all aspects of hosting these families, and a dedicated group of volunteers that makes each week a success; but we still need additional volunteers to keep this wonderful outreach strong and viable. 

# Holy Envy Finding God in the Faith of Others By Barbara Brown Taylor

"In her college class on world religions, Barbara introduces her students to other religious traditions and accompanies them on field trips to a variety of venues of worship. Both she and her students ponder and debate how the knowledge and insights they have gained raise important questions about belief, and explore how different practices relate to their own faith. Inspired by these intellectual and spiritual discussions, Barbara turns once again to the Bible for guidance, to see what secrets lay buried there.

Throughout *Holy Envy*, Barbara weaves together stories from her classroom with reflections on how her own spiritual journey has been challenged and renewed by connecting with people of other traditions--and by meeting God in her communion with them.

At the heart of her odyssey is her trust in God and knowledge that God is always with her. Barbara contends that it is the Lord who pushes her beyond her comfortable boundaries and calls for her to "disown" her version of the divine--a change that ultimately deepens her relationship with both the world and with God."

# Tales from the Road

Rev. Dr. Patience D. Stevenson, Minister of Visitation Did You Know?

Richard W. Gemmel was born on July 17, 1941. Richard was baptized and confirmed at Union UCC. Richard's confirmation class was the 200<sup>th</sup> class of confirmands at Union UCC!

Richard graduated from Parkland High School in 1959. He went on to earn a Ph.D. in Chemical Engineering from Temple University. He also was Co-Captain of the soccer team at Temple University.

Richard worked as a Chemical Engineer for RCA Victor, in Camden, NJ, in the RCA Victor's Space and Defense Division for 10 years. Richard's proudest achievements involved his work on the Apollo 11 Space Mission. Richard assisted in the development of the circuitry for the Apollo 11, lunar landing and first lunar walk. Richard also approved all the circuitry that was used in both the televisions and television cameras which made it possible to watch the astronauts as they positioned the American flag on the lunar surface.

Richard was often sent to RCA's Studio A and B in Nashville, TN, to troubleshoot any problems that arose in the recording of music. He also worked on the circuitry of RCA's Spectra 70 computers.

Richard returned to the Lehigh Valley, and along with his partners, Joseph J. Hartmann and Lila M. Gemmel, opened and ran the former Ballietsville Inn for 26 years. Richard retired in 1997. Dr. Gemmel also was an Antique Dealer from 1970-2000.
