#### **Valley Youth House**

Starting in the Lehigh Valley in 1973 as a single shelter, Valley Youth House ensured that vulnerable, abused and homeless young people in the community had access to shelter and counseling. They were more than just a roof and beds, they were committed to building a solid foundation for every individual who came through their doors.

The same dedication drives Valley Youth House today, as they have grown to over 250 residential sites throughout Pennsylvania. For over forty years, their mission to improve the lives of young people in the community remains the same.

#### Habitat for Humanity of the Lehigh Valley

The Habitat mission is to offer families in need a hand up, not a hand out. They strive to walk along side them as they realize the dream of home ownership. Each family contributes 250 hours of sweat equity to help build their home and the homes of their neighbors.

Stable, affordable housing is critical to education, health, and economic success to families and the community. Habitat's unique home ownership program allows hardworking, low income families to build and buy a home, working "hands on" building their home and side by side with volunteer members of the community. Over 120 homes have been built in the Lehigh Valley since 1989.

#### FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

On Oct 11, 12, & 13, Union UCC hosted a mobile packing event for Feed My Starvina Children, organized and planned by church member Eliot Lightner. There were six packing shifts during the three day event. Close to 500 volunteers were busy packing meals in Memorial Hall, or helping with set up or clean up, with some volunteers working multiple shifts.

By the end of the last shift on Sunday, the volunteers had filled, other churches and groups from weighed and sealed 16,848 plastic bags with rice, soy, dried vegetables, and vitamin mix. The provide nutritious meals, hope bags then filled 468 boxes, which and love to children and families

made 13 full pallets of finished product. Each plastic bag of finished product makes for 6 meals, which translates to a arand total of 101,066 meals packed during the three day event, meeting the goal.

#### ALLENTOWN CROP WALK

On Sunday Oct 13, John Snyder-Samuelson, Teresa Dalrymple, Dion Henninger, Steve Kareha and his two daughters represented Union UCC by walking in the annual Crop Walk. A beautiful fall day provided an opportunity for 248 walkers from 24 Lehigh Valley congregations to walk and raise money for Church World Service and Lehigh Conference of Churches, who in turn help to feed the hungry in the local area and around the world.



### Tales from the Road

Rev. Dr. Patience D. Stevenson, Minister of Visitation Did You Know?

Hilda Rosina Paul Nagel was born on October 23, 1920 in a townhouse in Ironton. She was the youngest of 7 children. Hilda's father got a job at Trexler Orchards in Orefield. At that time some of the employees were able to live in homes on the Orchard property. Hilda's family lived for a number of years in such a home. Her father's supervisor made an unannounced visit to their home one day. He was so impressed with the care Hilda's family was giving their home, garden and property that he had electricity installed as well as an indoor bathroom with running water!

Hilda remembers helping her family dig a hole in the dirt near the house where they would store vegetables for the winter. There were two spring houses on the property as well. They kept a number of food items in the spring house to keep them cold. In one spring house they could pick watercress!

Hilda's mother was a wonderful cook and baker. She always had time to stop for a cup of tea if a visitor came to the door. She sewed dresses for Hilda and her sister, always out of matching fabric. The grocer who delivered produce to their home would bring bolts of fabric for Hilda's mother to inspect and possibly purchase.

Hilda was baptized in the Catholic Church, but when her family transferred to Union Reformed Church, she was confirmed there. Hilda often baked for the church, and became famous for her paper thin Christmas cookies and hickory nut cake. She and another member, Norma Procopio, would spend hours cleaning all the historical artifacts in the memory room.

Hilda married Kermit on March 22, 1941. Together they raised one child, Ann Nagel Fortney. Ann and her husband, Jim, blessed Hilda and Kermit with a grandson and eventually a great grandson.

Hilda maintained her lovely home and garden in Orefield until just a couple of years ago when she moved to Fellowship Villa.
