Habitat's unique home ownership program allows hardworking, low income families to build and buy a home, working "hands on" building their home and side by side with volunteer members of the community. Over 120 homes have been built in the Lehigh Valley since 1989.



Our adult classes will be sending Christmas cards to churches in Japan again this year. "Christians in Japan account for 1% of the population. Many churches are quite small. In many of the prayer requests you will find a deep concern for the future survival of the church." We have been asked to pray for and partner with these churches:

Kakuda Church with Rev. Shigeo Komatsu Membership: 6, 41 children in Kindergarten They are located near Sendai where radiation levels are high. <u>Their prayer requests</u>: We want to declare to our neighborhood that the church is here for you and that seekers will come to our worship and be led into the faith.

Sendai Kitasanbancho Church with Rev. Shiro Sata Membership: 100 They recently installed a projections system to help their older members hear and understand the sermon better, it's been helpful. <u>Their prayer requests</u>: For a life centered around worshipping God, for service to society, for the nurturing of faith and for young and old to be brought together to strengthen each other's faith.

<u>Dual Member Status Approved by Consistory</u> Dual membership is available to people who wish to join our church but who want to also maintain membership at another church. Dual members will have the same rights and duties as a member. According to our Constitution members are required to commune and donate yearly. We look forward to continuing to welcome new members into the Christian journey with our faith family here at Union UCC.

<u>New Member Sessions</u> Pastor Kris and our church leaders invite you to gatherings on **February 9 and 16.** We meet during the 9:15 hour in the Memory Room (Room 200) on the second floor. This is a time to get to know each other and ask questions. You will be welcomed as members in worship on **Sunday, February 23rd.** Attendance is not required to join.
