

This December 31 marks not only the end of another year, but also the end of a decade. In the preschool, we mark the end of the first half of our school year. The students have settled into the routines of classroom life and have started making friends with their peers as they practice sharing and taking turns. At Neffs UCC Preschool, we focus as much time on teaching self-help skills and social skills as we do early literacy and early math skills. The holidays are an excellent time to help reinforce these skills at home and in the community. If you have a young child in your life, it is never too early to model and reinforce manners such as saying "please' and "thank you". You can have your young child help you "write" a thank-you card for a Christmas present by either drawing a picture for the person or having the child try to sign his/her name at the bottom of a letter you have written and read to the child. 
