

## **Climate Change Distress**

Are you feeling overwhelmed by frequent scientific reports on the seriousness of climate change or the natural disasters that are occurring more and more often? You are not alone. Many people complain that they are feeling more anxious as a result of both the scientific predictions for the future as well as the natural disasters that are more severe and frequent.

Here are a few suggestions from psychologists:

Take meaningful action. Maybe you're not ready to join a climate strike, but you could commit to reducing your consumption of red meat by limiting yourself to once a week, turning down your heat at home by one degree, carpooling to one event this month, etc....

Take a deliberate break from the news so you can regain your energy. Focus on only a few issues.

Take care of yourself by maintaining your healthy routines.

Drop judgements – about yourself and others.

Connect with others. Share your concerns with others who will support you.

Join the Union UCC Green Team. We meet every other month and strategize ways that we as individuals, families and a church can take meaningful action for change. Please watch the newsletter and bulletins for the April meeting date.

Join a larger climate action group such as Pennsylvania Interfaith Power and Light or 350.org.

Of course we have an added resource in prayer.

In particular, we may feel helpless as we watch or read the news regarding the overwhelming wildfires in Australia that are harming so

many people and animals. Taking small steps can benefit you and those humans or animals who are suffering. In addition to prayer, if you are able to donate money there are many reputable organizations that are assisting humans and wildlife, such as the Australian Red Cross and the World Wildlife Fund. If you are a machine sewer, or able to crochet or knit, there is a Facebook site that is gathering various items to assist in the rescue and recovery of injured animals, **Animal Rescue Craft Guild.** Look on their Facebook page for patterns with their specific fabric and yarn requirements and encouraging stories and pictures of animal rescues.

There are many helpful articles available online about this topic, most notably from the Australian Psychological Society (which I believe was written prior to the current wildfire crisis.)
