
PINT FOR PINT BLOOD DRIVE



Tales from the Road Rev. Dr. Patience D. Stevenson, Minister of Visitation Did You Know?

Dave and Dolly Mulcahy both grew up in Bethlehem, PA. Dave was born in 1939 and remembers when all his neighbors in downtown Bethlehem were outside in the streets celebrating the end of World War II.

Dolly was baptized, confirmed and married at St. Paul's Evangelical and Reformed Church (now Trinity UCC). Dolly even had perfect attendance in Sunday School for 12 years! Dave was raised at Grace Lutheran across the street from his home on East Broad Street in Bethlehem.

They met through mutual friends in 1957 and married in 1961. Together they raised their three boys and are delighted to have six grandchildren.

Dave joined the U.S. Navy after graduating from Liberty High School in Bethlehem at the age of 17. Dave served in the Navy for 10 years. He worked for Lockheed in New Jersey for 24 years. After retiring Dolly and Dave built a home in North Whitehall. Dolly went back to school at age 40 after staying home to raise their 3 boys to become a Medical Technician and worked at St. Luke's and a private lab in Easton until her retirement.
