BLANKET SUNDAY RESULTS

Donations for Blanket Sunday this year totals \$2,120 for Church World Services. Thank you for supporting this yearly event to provide warmth, comfort, and love to people around the world when disasters strike.

During 2019, Church World Services provided over 59,000 blankets to families around the United States (a record amount). Over 5,000 blankets were distributed to families in various countries in Africa, Latin America, the Caribbean Islands and Europe.

Elizabeth Frank, from CWS, states "Church World Service was only able to respond quickly to recent hurricanes and natural disasters because of generous congregations and groups who help to provide resources for blankets, and CWS kits. People come together to help families in need. This outpouring of love was inspiring".

Union UCC's recent support during Blanket Sunday will help CWS prepare to help families when the next natural disaster occurs.

FROM THE FINANCIAL LEADERSHIP TEAM

Good news....Union UCC is the recipient of a federal loan under the Paycheck Protection Program established under the recently passed CARES act. The intent of the Program is to help small businesses, including organizations like the church, to sustain their ongoing operations and keep their staff employed. Importantly, the act allows for a portion of the loan to be forgiven as long as the proceeds are used to cover eight weeks of payroll costs and other costs like utilities and rent. For Union UCC, it is estimated that approximately \$50,000 of the loan proceeds related to our payroll and utility costs (about 70% of the total loan) can be forgiven....a huge help in keeping our staff employed during these critical few months.





Tales from the Road Rev. Dr. Patience D. Stevenson, Minister of Visitation

I miss each of you. I miss seeing you at church and visiting with you in your homes. You are constantly in my prayers. I look forward to when we can see one another face to face again.

I am so grateful that our collective season of isolation is occurring during this beautiful season where we can be outside or at least look out a window. I have been trying to spend a lot of time outside weeding and watching my perennials starting to show their faces. I even rode my bike for the first time since my knee replacement in October.

By the time you read this, the 50th anniversary of Earth Day will have passed. If you haven't already, take a look at some interesting opportunities celebrating this wonderful day all around the world. Find some ways to celebrate yourself or with your family. Find a chair in your backyard. Sit long enough and frequently enough that you become familiar with the birds and other wildlife that live near that space. Maybe you will notice plants that are showing their first tentative shoots. Perhaps you'll notice a bird returning to your area for the first time this season, or if you're lucky, watch a bird building its nest. If you are not able to go outside, try to sit by a window where you can observe a tree or a birdfeeder or some small corner of God's creation.

Perhaps commit to some new way of caring for creation. During this lockdown I have been trying to be more intentional about my composting. I have been trying different methods to make speedy compost since my usual compost source at the Bethlehem Yard Waste Center is currently inaccessible. I am reading lots of articles about composting and watching composting tutorials on YouTube. I welcome any of your suggestions.
