

A fully stocked food bank that provides a generous number of groceries, toiletries, fresh fruit, and vegetables, baked goods, milk, bread, eggs, frozen meats, and more to over 220 families a month.

EASTER MISSION OFFERING FROM SUSAN SMITH

As the days begin to lengthen, but the snow continues to fall on the valley, we are reminded that before we can enjoy the spring flowers, we must wait through a time of winter's rites. For our many neighbors who rely on food banks and soup kitchens, we will help them face these uncertain times through our Easter offerings to Lehigh Conference of Churches and Parkland CARES Food Pantry.

For sixty years, Lehigh Conference of Churches assists those most in need in the whole of Lehigh Valley through programs directed to the homeless, the hungry, and people with mental health concerns. Each year, the Lehigh Conference of Churches links 7,000 people in crisis to community resources through various programs, such as the Ecumenical Soup Kitchen, where they serve 36,000 meals – 1500 to children. In addition, their Daybreak Drop-In Center provides 25,000 hot meals to 300 community members dealing with mental illness.

Parkland CARES (Community Aid Reaching Every Student) Food Pantry began in 2018 as a supplemental food source for families within the Parkland School District. It began with 12 client families, and by the end of 2019, 100 families were being served. It has grown to serve food insecure families who reside within Lehigh County. Your generous donations will provide the much-needed help our neighbors seek. As we give to the least, we give to God.

And for the children with computers, but who didn't have a mouse for it – WOW! What a difference a simple \$1.00 item can make in a student's learning. Please know how much our students and teachers appreciate your help! Here are some quotes from the folks at Hays Elementary in Allentown, PA!

Teacher A: Today my student was able to copy and paste her writing ideas to her draft document. In the past this took many steps, but today she was delighted to see how quickly she could copy and paste with her mouse. What a difference! Thank you, thank you, thank you!

Teacher B: What a world of difference having a stylus has made for our Kindergarten and first grade students. We can interact virtually much easier and more flawlessly through shared screens. My students are beginning to understand the idea of a proper pencil grip to write! Thank you so very much!

Student A: "Mrs. _____, I picked up the mouse today and it's so great!"

Student B: "Miss_____, I love this mouse! I want to keep it forever!"

Student C: "Thanks for the mouse. I like it."

Student D: "My writing is getting better, don't you think? I am using [sic] this! (picks up the stylus and shows it to the teacher through her zoom camera)"


