SABBATICAL NEWS FROM PASTOR KRIS

She's going on a sabbatical again? Yes, I am. I know it seems like I just did this. Let me explain. Union UCC has been very generous and supportive of our full-time pastors by honoring the recommendations of the Penn Northeast Conference guidelines by providing the time to take a 3-month sabbatical for every 5 years of ministry. I was due for my recent sabbatical 2016 but postponed it due to all of the transitions going on. I took 1 month in the Summer of 2018 and one month in 2019, postponed the last month in 2020 due to COVID and will now take that last month this summer in 2021. (Next year I'll be taking the next 3 months of a sabbatical again, thank you!)

I will be away May 10 through June 7. I will use this time to do some reading, planning, and spending time refreshing my spirit. During this time I won't be providing pastoral care. Pastors Kayli and Patience will be available to you. See the worship schedule for some of our guest preachers to enjoy. I trust you will behave while I'm away and not work Pastors Kayli and Patience too hard.

I will continue to hold you in my heart and in my prayers. This year of crazy COVID has multiplied the blessings in my life as your pastor.

FROM THE PROPERTY COMMITTEE BY PHIL WEHR

What a beautiful spring season around the church property this year for all to enjoy. All of the flowers in the grove are having a good blooming season this year. Many walkers and photographers enjoyed the thousands of daffodils in full bloom during the middle of April. God's beauty is abundant, bringing joy to all.

Good news, the replacement of the slate roof on the south side of the church is complete. Diirner & Sons of Ephrata, PA, have done a great job in the removal and replacement of thirty square of slate and copper flashings where needed. Jake Diirner was very pleased with the final outcome of their work, stating that having a nice flat roof to work on provides for a nice finished slate roof. Thus our 150 year old sanctuary roof is still sturdy and ready to withstand the elements for decades to come.

Bad news, a concrete retaining wall on the north side of the church collapsed in late December. The wall has been leaning for a number of years, and fully collapsed, pushing the air conditioning units off of their bases. This project of replacing the retaining wall, and replacing the 16 year old AC system became a priority for 2021.

Good news, the financial leadership team and the consistory approved a financial plan to fund these two very important projects. The project would require funds available from the Funds of Lasting Gifts endowment plan, the Marilyn Peters Estate Gift, and \$30,000 in the Reserve Fund being held from the parsonage sale over 20 years ago. Union UCC is blessed and grateful to have these funds available to make major improvements and investments to our church property, so future generations of families may worship and serve God here in Neffs, PA.

By the time you read this newsletter both of these projects should be completed. We thank Laudenslager's Heating and Cooling for their work on replacing the air conditioning units in the ceiling of the sanctuary and the outside units. An air purification system has been added to the new AC units. We thank Simock Construction for the removal and replacement of the retaining wall, and all of the extra work required for a very labor intensive job in a tight area of the church property, and also the extra work and thoughtfulness to protect and keep stable the foundation of the church sanctuary.

Enjoy the summer, looking forward to seeing everyone in our grove for Sunday worship services.


- Approval of funds from FOLG to support Thank you mailings from FLT

We will be gathering next year's acolytes (current 6th graders) sometime in the future. Keep an eye on your mail to sign up!







You may remember hearing Earl Ball's wonderful accordion playing when he shared his musical gifts at a Golden Times luncheon in 2015. Earl Ball is an ordained UCC minister. He has pastored churches in Bangor and Easton, worked in the UCC headquarters in Manhattan, before intensive training to eventually become the Director of Pastoral Care and Bioethics Chairperson at a Bucks County Hospital for 20 years.

Fully retired from active Ministry since 2011, Earl owns ten(!) accordions in his restored 1871 downtown Easton home.

The last few years he has played throughout the Lehigh Valley, in Manhattan, and dozens of senior residences in New Jersey. He takes requests, plays all types of music and promises a fun time!

Earl says "An accordion is an instrument you can hug, when hugging is so rare these days due to covid 19."

Did you know that if you reduce the amount of lawn you mow you can help the environment? You can reduce run off of water (thereby reducing water pollution) by increasing permeable, no mow plantings such as meadows, flower beds and container gardens instead of lawn. You can install a rain barrel (and empty it into your garden between rain events.) Pick up debris around storm drains, which will prevent this debris from ending up in our local streams and rivers and eventually the ocean (which is where the water from our storm drains goes). Planting a variety of native and non-invasive grasses, deep rooted plants and trees supports wildlife and pollinators as well as preventing run off.

Eliminating use of pesticides is key to reducing water pollution and supporting local wildlife and pollinators. For more suggestions to support our environment check out the Nurture Nature Center in Easton (www.nurturenaturecenter.org.)

Tales from the Road

Rev. Dr. Patience D. Stevenson, Minister of Visitation Did You Know?

Doris Bittner Marsteller grew up on a farm in Schnecksville. She lived in half a double and her grandparents in the other half. They raised hogs, chickens, steer and cows on their farm. They had a butcher shop on the farm for the pigs, where they made their own scrapple and sausage. They had many red chickens, which laid brown eggs. They grew strawberries, potatoes, corn, wheat, hay and straw. Every fall they would bring in 10-12 men to pick the potatoes. The family would convert the butcher shop into a bunk house for the men to stay in during the potato harvesting season.

The milk from their cows was stored in the milk house on the farm and was sold to Lehigh Valley Dairy, who would send a truck every day to pick up the milk and pasteurize it.

While Doris had chores on the farm she never milked a cow or drove a tractor. She helped to clean the vegetables for the family truck patch and would occasionally help to pick potatoes. She helped gather eggs and pluck the chickens. Doris helped her mom peddle sweet corn twice a week in nearby Shankweiler Manor.

One benefit of living on a farm was that Doris had many cats. One kitten in particular used to walk her down the driveway to school and would wait for her at the end of the driveway when she came home on the school bus. Doris attended Schnecksville Elementary and was in the first class of Parkland Jr/Sr. High.

Doris's Mom ran the Schnecksville 4-H club for 25 years. Doris began her membership in 4-H learning to cook. She eventually learned to sew. Doris had many entries in the Allentown Fair with her sewing. Doris remembers participating in the Dress Review, where all the counties in Pennsylvania would compete for the best sewing projects. As a junior in high school Doris came in 8th out of a group of over 60. She made an olivegreen print dress with pleats across the bodice. She modeled the dress with white gloves, patent leather shoes and purse. Doris's mother's 4-H scrap book is on display at the Lehigh Valley Historical Society in Allentown.

In addition to her 4-H commitments Doris was involved in many activities while in high school. She was a majorette for a year, gave a speech in the Oratorial Contest, participated in the District and State Chorus for two years and was elected Lehigh County Peach Queen twice.

During her senior year in high school Doris participated in a work/study program at Air Products. Two weeks after graduation Doris drove to her first full time job at Air Products in her 57 Black and White Chevy. While at Air Products Doris met Dave Marsteller. They courted for 2 years, married in 1963 and had their son, Doug, a year later.

Dave grew up in Bethlehem and eventually left Air Products to work at Bethlehem Steel, where he worked for over 20 years. When Bethlehem Steel closed, he worked for SKS Bearings until retirement.

Doris was baptized and confirmed at Neffs Lutheran Church, while Dave was raised in the Moravian Church in Bethlehem. After being members in a couple of other Lehigh Valley churches Doris and Dave joined Union UCC in 2002. Doris sang in many church choirs, including at Union UCC and is well known for her fantastic cooking.
