Sanctuary Guidelines Worship Fall 2021 (Starting September 12)

We will open the church at 7am, with worship services at 8am and 10:30am. Please go to the welcome tables at each door for your bulletin and to share your offering (and to pick up Communion) before entering the sanctuary.

Masks are required for worship on Sundays, church group meetings, and all events and gatherings inside the building for everyone over the age of 3 regardless of vaccination status.

Pews will be marked to allow for 3 feet of distancing. Please sit in open areas only.

The balcony will be open.

On Communion Sundays, we will continue to use the prefilled communion cups of grape juice and a gluten free cracker. Please use the ziploc bag to take your garbage with you.

For now, there will not be congregational singing.

Music will be provided by soloists and instrumentalists.

Please gather with others for conversation outside of the building.

The pastors will greet you outside on the porches.

We hope to evaluate and edit these precautions when vaccination rates continue to increase, COVID (and variant) numbers continue to decrease, and guidelines are updated for churches and our region. There is no guarantee of complete safety from transmission of the COVID-19 virus, but we will continue to do our best to keep our members, friends, and families as safe as possible. We are grateful for the love of this church family and for God's love which sustains and carries us during this challenging time.

General Guidelines:

STAFF and OFFICES

- The building will be locked at all times. The staff is requesting that when anyone comes to the building during the week that they call, email, or schedule their visit ahead of time. Please use the South entrance and we will let you in. If you need to enter on the North side for accessibility, please call or email us to let us know to meet you there.
- We are also requesting that everyone, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask when they enter any of our offices.

MEETINGS

- Those vaccinated and comfortable may remove their masks.
- Those who are un-vaccinated must wear masks.
- In the building: Food and Beverage may be brought by the individual for the individual, no sharing or "common" food/drink.

COMMON AREAS

When you are in our church's Hallways, Lobbies, Seating areas, Gathering areas, classrooms, bathrooms, and sanctuary:

- Those vaccinated and comfortable may choose not to wear their masks.
- Those un-vaccinated must wear masks.

MUSIC PROGRAMS

- All Singers, regardless of vaccination status, will continue to wear masks during worship and practice.
- Anyone working with the Children's Choirs, regardless of their vaccination status, will wear masks at all times.
- Those sitting in the choir loft will maintain at least a one-seat-separation between singers.
- String Instruments, brass, and woodwind instruments may resume in worship as solo and small groups. Precautions for instrument covers and best practices being used in schools will be utilized.
- Chime Choir may continue. Masks are required for rehearsals and performances.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH PROGRAMMING

- For all youth events, we are asking that **adults** who work with our children **wear masks** regardless of vaccination status.
- We are asking our vaccinated youth who are assisting with programs to wear masks.
- We are asking our un-vaccinated youth to wear masks as age appropriate (> 3 years).

*All of this is pending on current COVID guidelines from CDC, State and the practices of local schools, hospitals, and businesses. There's always an asterisk now!

Please take this time to thank Rev. Patience with best wishes, words of gratitude, and stories about how her ministry has been meaningful to you and your family. We have been blessed by her presence of leadership as a pastor and we look forward to receiving your words of appreciation as well as the chance to celebrate her work here.

History of the Pastor Of Visitation Position

When Pastor Thomas Thomas was called here as pastor in 1984 he was the only pastor on staff for this large church. A few years later he and the church leaders realized that an Associate Pastor position needed to be created in order to cover all of the pastoral responsibilities for this growing and healthy congregation. Union UCC called a few part-time associates in the transition and then called Janice Dey as the first full-time Associate. She served here for nine years. In this interim several part-time pastors helped Pastor Thomas who focused on pastoral care. After a 2-year interim, Rev. Kris Snyder-Samuelson was called as the Associate Pastor.

Shortly after she began her work here, she and Pastor Tom realized that the church had grown in its focus on children and youth ministries and now needed to focus on their ministries with older adults. They created the Pastor of Visitation position to help meet those needs and Pastor Kris created the Helping Hearts and Communion Ministers groups to support the position and the care being provided to our adults.

In September of 2006 Rev. Dr. Patience Stevenson was called as our first Pastor of Visitation. She has been serving in a variety of ways averaging 10 hours a week with a focus on caring for our members on our visitation list, supporting and organizing our Helping Hearts and Communion Ministers, leading our Golden Times monthly senior adult gathering, sharing hospital visits and general member care with the other pastors, officiating at funerals, assisting in worship monthly, and preaching quarterly. She also helped to organize our Green Team and our care for God's creation efforts.

We look forward to building on the wonderful foundation of pastoral care, programming, and spiritual nourishment that Rev. Patience has provided to so many of us.



An Interview with Jarod Pokorny about Permaculture

This spring Jarod Pokorny shared a presentation by zoom on Permaculture for our Adult Education class and our Green Team. It was so rich that I asked Jarod to give us a brief introduction to share in our newsletter. Don't miss Jarod's own gardening YouTube channel, *Terra-ble Gardening Videos*!

Initially, I was beginning to practice permaculture long before I actually knew what it was. I have always enjoyed spending time outdoors. Whether I was going on hikes or camping; I found I was most at peace in those natural areas. My family also had a garden when I was growing up. I enjoyed helping out with planting seeds, and gleaning the harvests when I was a young kid. Eventually, as I got older, I was inspired to create my own garden. As I prepared the plot of land I thought about how much I enjoyed spending time out in the woods. I thought it would be nice to bring that sense of sanctuary, I found in Nature, into my own backyard. If only I could figure out a way to combine that with the garden I was creating. I soon found that the natural world was all too eager to jump in and help. Days after planting I discovered a bunch of plants emerging that I had not planted. I figured out ways to incorporate certain wild plants into beds of cultivated species where the relationship could be mutually beneficial. After further research, I realized some of these wild volunteers were also edible, and that many wild plant species could be indicators of various soil qualities. As the years progressed and I continued to learn more and experiment, I eventually ran across this term of permaculture. I realized it was very close to the unconventional self-taught gardening method I had been using. As long as we allow Nature to lead by example, we will find our own way.

Recently, there's been a dramatic interest in gardening and home food production. I think it can be an awesome and rewarding endeavor, especially in the long-term. However, there's the catch...long-term. So, the question arises: How do we design a garden that is practical but productive and sustainable for the average homeowner? A garden that has minimal demands for long-term work, inputs and other costs? It seems that in order to accomplish this, we must look to the natural world. Ultimately, in our actions we want to leave the landscape better than we found it, exhorting a sense of regeneration upon the land, while also finding our own connection to the landscape, the Earth. Enter permaculture.

Look at a forest. It is a functioning ecosystem of a rich diversity of species: various trees, shrubs, perennials, vines, groundcovers etc. If I were an insect flying over a plot of land with an assortment of species grown in small patches throughout the area, I would likely bypass that area. Seeking out instead the plot that consists of many acres of a single crop. For this place will likely have a plenitude of food with lower levels of natural predators. Diversity can be vital, albeit challenging, to grasp. Neglecting this value can, as history points out, result in a brutal *denouement*, i.e. the Irish Potato Famine. In embracing diversity, we find greater strength. It is a concept we still have yet to embrace, not only in the farm field, but in our own lives, and society as a whole.

We share the land with every other living being on this Earth. Some old time gardeners would set aside a patch of land, away from the main garden, and they would fill this space with an assortment of

delectable crops or spare seed for some of the wild animals. Some people would plant turnips to feed the deer. Even for those of us who hunt, this can be a way to give back, and to ultimately help support a greater ecosystem.

What can a dandelion teach us about an area of land? The seed commonly requires full sun to germinate, and it can flourish where other plants wither and die. It sends down a deep taproot to access stores of water and nutrients where it is too far for others to reach. These nutrients then accumulate in the dandelion. When it dies back, these minerals become more accessible to shallow-rooted plants. The dandelion's taproot breaks up compacted soil and thus allows for better subterranean drainage. Once the dandelion has helped to rectify the land, the soil becomes more loose and fertile enabling other successive plants to enter in. The dandelion has done its job, no longer being needed in that area it is thus phased out. If the dandelion is not allowed to play its role in soil reclamation, then that responsibility falls even more directly on us. Generally when a volunteer plant appears in an area, it is usually for a reason. Learning these 'reasons' will enable us to read the landscape on a deeper level, aiding us in making more informed decisions when considering gardening, landscaping, presence of animal species, and so much more.

There is always so much to learn, provided we open ourselves to the opportunities to do so. Questioning our own opinions and judgements is hard and undesirable, however this is exactly what a permacultural perspective challenges us to do. By facing our own opinions, I think we are also facing a part of ourselves. And it is an aspect of ourselves that we must overcome in order to grow and develop into our full potential, along with the rest of the garden. For we too have a place in the landscape.

- 3... share our part in our mutual accountability for success, by actively participating in the discussion and decision-making process
- 4... keep an open mind as we listen to, invite and encourage other points of view and we will believe everyone is trying their best to have this church bring glory to God
- 5...respectfully ask questions for clarification, without intentionally offending others
- 6... feel free to respectfully disagree with issues and methods but will restate what we are disagreeing with first, without fear of ridicule
- 7... not knowingly participate in negative or derogatory conversations about others and will remind any brothers or sisters who try to engage us in these conversations that we do not do that as people of faith [Galatians 5:19-21]
- 8... try to avoid defensive reactions and will speak only for <u>ourselves</u> unless being asked to bring an issue to leadership on behalf of another person or group
