WEATHER ALERT BOXES FROM LEHIGH CONFERENCE OF CHURCHES FEED HOMELESS COMMUNITY

Severe inclement weather may force various services in the Lehigh Valley to cease and providers to close. To still provide services to the unsheltered, and encourage the unsheltered to prepare for such weather, the Lehigh Conference of Churches is enhancing their outreach efforts.

When inclement weather is forecasted, the Street Outreach Team will visit the encampments in the area to warn about the weather and encourage the encampment residents to seek temporary housing in one of the area shelters.

The team will also provide them with a "Weather Alert Box" that includes shelf-stable food, such as read-to-eat tuna or chicken packets, fruit cups, juice boxes, bottled water, beef jerky, granola bars, etc.

If the Conference Kitchen should have to close due to weather, the boxes will also be handed out prior. **On behalf of the Conference, we will be collecting shelf-stable foods throughout the Winter.**

A letter from Maria Beltz, Custodian:





Registration forms will be available starting March 27. Please register by June 5th.



Staff Updates From Pastor Kris, Consistory, and Church and Ministry Interim (Temporary) Plan for Pastor of Visitation Ministry

The Pastor of Visitation Committee made this recommendation which Church and Ministry and Consistory approved at their meetings in February. Since posting the Pastor of Visitation position in November, we have not received any appropriate resumes of applicants. Pastor Kris and the search committee created an interim plan for 6 months starting Feb 6 (with 30 days' notice given by either party) while they reinvest in reaching out to potential permanent candidates. **She has approached members Carrie Beleno and Susan Glosan to serve in the following ways:**



Carrie Beleno – previous educator and school principal, Reiki Master, owner of healing center. Has led women's retreat days and meditation sessions here. Currently on Helping Hearts as a volunteer. Currently doing Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at St. Luke's starting in January (training required for chaplains and those seeking ordination). She's Interested in getting more experience and helping the church. 4-6 hours/week

Focus on Visitation list, hospitals/follow up, call list – shared with other pastors and other interim. Special focus – organizing Helping Hearts and Communion Ministers for Easter Flower and Communion and coordinate

Golden Times program in May and June

Emergency assistance as needed/negotiated with other Pastors

Funerals – assist for experience, cover only as needed/negotiated with other pastors Assisting in worship as time allows.



Susan Glosan – currently Moravian Seminary student, chaplaincy program. Needs to fulfill some pastoral care visits for classwork this semester. Has been active here in a variety of ways as musician, acolyte coordinator, and preacher. Interested in getting more experience and helping the church. 4-6 hours/week Focus on Visitation list, hospitals/follow up, call list – shared with other pastors and interim

Special focus – preaching 3 times/once a month (April, May, June) Emergency assistance as needed/negotiated with other Pastors Funerals – assist for experience, cover as needed/negotiated with other pastors Assisting in worship as time allows.

Financially this plan fits within the realm of what Consistory already approved for the permanent position in terms of hours and budget. Our main goal is to support Pastors Kris and Kayli in their work as well as continue to provide ongoing pastoral care for our members.

A reminder about boundaries with former pastors:

As a pastor who is no longer serving our congregation, Rev. Patience and all previous pastors serving here, are no longer available for pastoral care at Union UCC. She cannot visit you in the hospital or at home, attend worship or events, or officiate at funerals. This is part of the boundaries established and carried out by the Penn Northeast Conference, the UCC, and the best practices of pastors as they move through these transitions. Appropriate boundaries also preclude her from seeing you as clients in her private practice.




WHERE SCHOOL MEMORIES BEGIN!
