Did You Know All About the Sanctuary Painting?

Text above the archway:

German: "Gott, Man lobet Dich in der Stille zu Zion." English: "God, One Praises You in the stillness of Zion."

Source: Psalm 65:1 A Farmer's Psalm

Artist: Rubens

Title: "Descent From the Cross"

The painting is a copy of the original and was painted and donated by Augustus Steckel in 1916.

The scene is of <u>Jesus</u> being removed from the cross after being crucified.

As the body is received in the arms of <u>John</u>, the foot just touches the shoulder of <u>Mary Magdalene</u>.

<u>Mary of Bethany</u> who is just behind Mary Magdalene, falls to her knees while <u>Mary the Mother of Jesus</u>, reaches up with outstretched hands as though to assist in the holding of the body.

Just above Mary the Mother of Jesus, the artist includes <u>Joseph of Arimathea</u>, holding the winding sheet with his right hand while with his left, he supports the arm of the falling savior.

At the upper left of the picture <u>Zaccheus</u> is leaning over the arm of the cross while Nicodemus is in a similar position on the right hand. Peter is descending the ladder. <u>John</u> is receiving the body of Jesus in his arms.




