Reflecting the Sacred

The shiny additions to our Advent and Christmas visuals remind us that we are called to reflect the sacred each and every day. "Incarnation" is a word that means that God's presence came to dwell among all people, and we believe this happened in a special way in the birth of Jesus. All creation has always been imbued with the Creator's brilliance. This season, we will remember the call to shine with this holy light.

When you arrived here this morning, you received a cotton ball with olive oil on it. For those of you worshiping with us at home, please take a moment to grab a little olive oil from the kitchen or some lotion from your bathroom cabinet.

Crossing the Threshold

Leader: All of creation is imbued with the presence of the Christ Mystery. It is a "Christ Mirror." When we say this, we don't say that all things are God, but that God is in and through all things. The Creator's very DNA was set in motion as day and night, earth and sky, flora and fauna, creatures and humans inhabited the earth. And God called it all inherently "good." The earth upon which we walk is a Sacred Place. Our homes, our

communities, our church, even the technology that enables us to be connected is reflecting the sacred creation, providing spaces for us to encounter divine joy. We come this day so very grateful for it. This day we celebrate Sacred Space in our Advent journey.

As we have done in the first two weeks, we'll take a moment to turn our memories and imaginations to the Sacred Spaces we have known. I invite you to get comfortable where you are sitting. If it helps to ground you, place both your feet on the floor. I invite you to open your hands upward in your lap. Close your eyes if you are comfortable doing so and take a deep, intentional breath in and out. If your mind is buzzing and you find it difficult to slow down, it's OK. Don't judge it... just take another breath and "thank and excuse" for just a moment the ping-pong thoughts in your brain. That's it. Take time to settle in.

Bring to your mind's eye a place that you love. Or it could just be a scene full of the things that you love. Perhaps there is lamplight or firelight and a cat napping in the window. Maybe you are walking outside on a tree-lined path, perhaps with a canine companion. Or it could be a place whose architecture takes your breath away. You might be sitting on a beach listening to the waves or snow-shoeing on a full-moon night. Take a moment and choose one of the many places that might be coming to mind. As you see this scene, put it in slow motion and move in closer to a detail. Think of a phrase that expresses your admiration such as, "wow," or "ahhhhhh." Now imagine particles of light showering slowly upon you in this place where you are. Let this reflection of light be an anointing of joy for seeing more and more of life through the lens of the Sacred. Continue to just breathe, listen, and see with your heart.

Introduction to Scripture

Reader: The pregnancy of Mary is connected to the promise of justice and joy in the readings this week. Mary's womb becomes a sacred space for the gestation of grace that moves into, and is transforming, the world. We will ponder the spaces we inhabit at home, work, and community, asking whether they are feeding, nurturing, and reflecting the freedom and joy that is so desperately needed. Hear this first reading:



Reframing the Sacred

Leader: We too often think that something "sacred" is far away and not available to us. This Advent season, we are "reframing" the way we recognize the sacred reflected all around and through us. As we prepare to move into the world, we begin to reframe our view of the world and our circumstances, illuminating new ways of being the Christ (Anointed One) tangibly present.

Anointed to Sacred Space

[When you arrived here this morning, you received a cotton ball with olive oil on it. For those of you worshiping with us at home, please take a moment to grab a little olive oil from the kitchen or some lotion from your bathroom cabinet.]

All things were "Christified"-anointed at their creation. This week, you are invited to an anointing of your senses to seek

a depth of vision that notices the precious details around us.

As you rise in the morning, try a ritual of touching your eyes and ears, nose, lips, and hands for a brief moment (with lotion, cream, or chapstick... or without) to ready them to a deeper looking, hearing, smelling, tasting, and touching. Imagine that this ritual touch imbues your senses with a kind of superpower beyond their usual powers of observation. Imagine that your "noticer" is turned onto a high frequency and that you will experience common and usual spaces at home and work and out in your daily life in a way that brings more joy than you have felt before about those places. And then one time this week, share a visit with someone to a place that is special, that is magical to you-perhaps it is a street with houses covered in Christmas lights, or a place in nature that calms and soothes you, or a cozy place by a fire with a cup of tea or coffee. Soak in the sacred that is reflected all around you.

Benediction

Leader: When you see lights twinkle, when you catch a reflection in a mirror, when you notice the sunlight dancing on a surface or a nightlight glowing in the darkness, let these be signs that the Christ Light is revealed again and again in and through this world.

Know that your brilliant presence is pouring more Joy into a weary world.
God loved us by becoming us.
This means you are already reflecting the sacred.
