

This fall, member Cameron Kuntz, his parents Doug and Angie Kuntz, a few fellow scout leaders and scouts, and I worked over in the church grove on his Eagle Scout Project. Cameron decided on a project to improve the VFW memorial garden located on the corner of Grove and Unionville Streets.

The project included the removal of the old overgrown bushes and river rocks used as ground cover. The next step was to layout the new garden area, plant the new bushes, and to then install a stone border around the garden. New mulch and river rocks finished the garden area.

The VFW granite memorial and granite benches were given a thorough pressure washing, along with the bronze plaque. A new rope for the flag on the flagpole was the finishing touch to the project. **The Laurel House** is part of the Thistle Farms and Bloom community which provides sanctuary and a continuum of care to heal, empower, and employ women survivors of sex trafficking. This new location in Allentown will support pregnant survivors with 2 years of safety while they heal, deliver their child, attend parenting classes, and receive mentoring and vocational training in order to live independently.

#### **PNEC Ambassador Corner**

Hopefully many church members, during the month of November, have become aware that Union UCC is one of 127 churches of the Penn Northeast Conference [PNEC] in Pennsylvania and that the PNEC, in turn, is one of 36 Conferences in the UCC National Church and that the PNEC has initiated an Ambassador program to help congregations and members feel more connected to the Conference and the wider church.

How does the Conference & the National church work and how is Union connected to them? Union meets biannually as does the Conference while the National Church meets through Synod which recently changed to meeting every (3) years instead of every (2) years. Just as Union has a Consistory and Committees which carry out the work of Union, the Conference and the National Church have Boards, Committees and Ministries which carry out the work of the wider church.

And yes, it comes down to funding!! Union prepares an annual budget, so do the Conference and the National Church. Offerings from local congregations flow to the Conference and to the National Church. Our Church's Wider Mission [OCWM] is the encompassing funding mechanism. In addition to the basic OCWM support, there are four (4) special offerings which the Conference and the National Church use to fund their programs, mission and ministries. A goal of the Conference is for congregations to be a 5 for 5 church, meaning that they support all (5) offerings. I'm happy to say that Union is a 5 for 5 congregation as we support all (5) through individual members, the general budget and FOLG!

Our Church's Wider Mission – Basic Support - [OCWM] – Goes to the Conference and they send 10% to the National Church to support their ministries

One Great Hour of Sharing [OGHS] – Goes to the National Church to help people in crisis by providing sources of clean water, education, health care, refugee resettlement, emergency relief and disaster preparedness, to name a few

Neighbors in Need [NIN] – Goes to the National Church to support ministries of justice and compassion through advocacy efforts and justice initiatives

<u>Strengthen the Church</u> – [STC] - ½ goes to the National Church; ½ to the PNEC to support leadership development, new churches, youth ministry and innovation in existing congregations

<u>Christmas Fund</u> — this is the charitable arm of the UCC Pension Boards and it provides direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties

Our Conference has initiated a new offering – Friends of the Conference [FOC] – for those who may be able to give a little over and above their regular offering. The idea is that if each member of a congregation in the PNEC would give just one dollar [\$1.00] more than their regular offering, that would be an additional \$28,000.00 to be able to use.

That's a very basic overview of the mechanics of connection of local congregations to the Conference and the National Church. We are not only connected through our offerings; the Conference offers many events for its congregations and members. Periodically, I will be lifting up programs and ministries of the Conference which may be of interest to our church members. I look forward to helping Union members feel more connected to the Conference and the wider church.

#### Note of interest:

The PNEC held their Fall meeting in early November and I just want to update you on the Amigos de Guatemala partnership which the PNEC has in Monte Margarita that Union UCC has supported in the past. Monte Margarita is a remote mountain village miles from any medical facilities. After sending a medical team there in 2011, the Conference was determined to build a multi-use facility and clinic. The community has few vehicles, poor roads, the water is not clean, and many health issues go untreated. Although the pandemic slowed things down quite a bit, the **new building**, which includes a clinic, community room, and housing for workers **is nearly finished!** It needs pipe for water and electricity yet, but the people in Monte Margarita already use it for church meetings, small business conferences, and education!!

The team is hoping to start medical mission trips and will be looking for medical volunteers, translators and planners as well as donations for the work yet to be completed. 

This letter is from Rev. Jeffrey Mensendiek (CGMB mission coworker, Japan) Rev. Mensendiek is a member of Union UCC, we hope to see him next year when he returns to the U.S. to visit. Our Friday and Sunday Adult Classes sent Christmas cards to churches in Japan where he serves.

Dear friends,

November, 2022

Thank you for participating in the Christmas Card Project this year. We have 40 US churches writing to 80 churches and 2 church-related centers in Japan. Please find the list of US churches below. This marks the tenth year that we have joined our efforts to lift up in prayer, all of the churches in the Northeastern Conference of the Kyodan - our partner churches in and around Fukushima. This project was started after the devastating triple disaster of earthquake, tsunami and nuclear disaster which happened in March 2011. These churches have historic ties to our two denominations: the United Church of Christ (UCC), and the Disciples of Christ (DOC). Ties that go back 136 years. This Advent season, as you reach out globally through prayer and the sending of cards, I pray that God's Spirit will touch you with a renewed sense of what God's mission means in our world today.

Japanese Christians are a small minority, and often feel judged and misunderstood by the people around them. At the same time there is a lot of pressure to conform in Japanese society, so being different can cause considerable stress. In rural settings where the culture is quite conservative, it is particularly difficult to witness to the Christian faith. I have included prayer concerns for each church. In many of the prayer requests you will find a deep concern for the future survival of the church. Some churches have kindergartens and nurseries that provide the church a vital connection with the wider society. Otherwise, the Christian community can be quite insular. Though the challenges facing the church in Japan are great, I want to emphasize that connections through Christ can bring us together in a mutual relationship that enriches and strengthens the faithful. I have found that we in the US have just as much to learn from Japanese Christians as they do from us. What they need (and US churches as well) is not help but relationship. I hope that an annual relationship through prayer will be just as meaningful for churches in the US as it is for churches in Japan.

There are three additional points that I want to make as you prepare to send the Christmas cards. First, churches in Japan are small. Average membership in the Tohoku (northeast) Conference is 26 members. Some churches are very small, and some have lost membership because of the nuclear disaster. They are holding on with their life so that the small flame of faith does not go out. Second, this area has experienced countless natural disasters (earthquakes and typhoons) in the past three years. Each time this happens the old church buildings are damaged. Third, the health hazards from the nuclear disaster are only beginning to come to light. Global Ministries is committed to accompanying our partners as they minister to the people living in a post-Fukushima reality. We hope to continue to keep you informed about what is going on in and around Fukushima.




