#### Habitat for Humanity of the Lehigh Valley

The mission of Habitat for Humanity of the Lehigh Valley is to provide hardworking families with simple, decent, affordable housing. Their mission is not a hand out, it is a hand up. They work in partnership with families to help them secure a better place to live and raise their families.

Families partner with Habitat by contributing at least 250 hours of sweat equity during the building of their home, or another Habitat home. Habitat families work side by side with local volunteers in all the trades needed during the construction of their home. Once settled into their home, they pay an affordable mortgage and take responsibility of their home.

Since 1989, Habitat has built 131 homes for families in the Lehigh Valley

#### Jubilee Breakfast program

The Jubilee Breakfast Ministry at Zion's Reformed Church in Allentown serves about 65 breakfasts to those who need a meal each Thursday, Friday, and Saturday during the coldest months of the year, November through April. This is a shared mission with several churches and community organizations. Donations are an important part of being able to provide a hot and hearty breakfast with warm hospitality. With the increased cost of for supplies and ingredients your donation is more important than ever and allows the organizers to buy food in bulk and to buy the items most needed.




# BLANKET SUNDAY/SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY

Thank you to everyone who supported the month long mission collections for Blanket Sunday and Souper Bowl Sunday. Union UCC is on its way to hitting the goal of collecting over \$2,000 for Blanket Sunday through Church World Services. Each donation goes along way in bringing comfort and warmth to families in need after a natural disaster, or other circumstances. Church World Services provided over 70,000 blankets around the world in 2022.

Souper Bowl collections of over 350 cans of soup were provided to the Northern Lehigh Food Bank, and over \$500 was raised for Souper Bowl of Caring through Lehigh Conference of Churches. These donations continue our fight for hunger, providing nourishment and love to local families.

While we highlight these missions during the month of February, the work of these organizations last all year long. We continue to bless them for their wonderful mission in serving families around the Lehigh Valley and the World.








#### Steering Without Oars Leadership Planning Team from Pastor Kris

# FamilyPromise

•Mission: to assist families with children experiencing or about to experience homelessness find or retain affordable housing, and gain sustainable, financial stability.

•**Partners:** The mission is carried out by a network of 15 host congregations and many other community resources working together to meet the immediate, basic needs of displaced families and assist them to build patterns that will bring long-term stability.

•Motto: We provide security, stability, and support in a judgment-free environment that recognizes that at any point, any one of us could be in their shoes.

•Impact: 74% of the families utilizing this program find stable housing after 6 to 8 weeks.



1. More families experience homelessness in the United States than in any other industrialized nation. (The Bassuk Center on Homeless and Vulnerable Children & Youth)

2. 84% of families experiencing homelessness consist of a single mother with one or more young children, and a big reason for this is that many family shelters do not accept men into their programs, causing families to separate when they become homeless. (GreenDoors.org)

3. More than 2.5 million American children – that's 1 in 30 – experience homelessness every year, and over half are under age five. (The Bassuk Center on Homeless and Vulnerable Children & Youth)

4. Family homelessness has become chronic, with families accounting for 37% of the overall homeless population and 50% of the sheltered population. (The Bassuk Center on Homeless and Vulnerable Children & Youth)

5. The most cited reason for family homelessness is lack of affordable housing. (FamilyPromise.org)

6. Almost 50% of renters pay one-third or more of their incomes on rent, and one in four renters spends more than half their income on rent. (Harvard Joint Center for Housing Studies)

7. At minimum wage, a family needs to work 2.5 full-time jobs (about 100 hours/week) to afford the average 2-bedroom rental in the U.S. (FamilyPromise.org)
