Welcome

Threshold Moment

Leader: John 20: 1-11

Reader: Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes. But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb.

Leader: During the season of Lent leading up to this moment, we have been asking ourselves if we are looking for love in all the wrong places, if we are giving our attention to the things that do not really sustain our lives and add to love in this world. This day is the culminating message from the Gospel. In the end (or is it the beginning), we find out that love always wins! All things of this world pale in comparison to what resurrection looks like in our lives. New-found meaning, purpose, attention, wholeheartedness, wellbeing, peace: these are the things that matter-the things the Teacher shows us. And no matter how many "wrong places" we've looked for love, the graves give way to the light of a new day as we learn to love as Christ loves us.

Opening Prayer

Holy and Merciful One, in this season of discernment we have come bringing our deepest longings, and our failed attempts at satisfying them. We have often looked for love, for acceptance and security, in ways that do not give life, that do not love us back.

> But as we come the Easter morning, weeping like Mary, you appear to us and you say

"Why are you weeping? For I am here, Love is here, Life is here. Arise, as I am arisen!"

ALL: We open our hearts, our minds, our souls, our vision to the ways of love created by God, embodied in Jesus, and already moving in us by the Spirit. We are forgiven, loved, and freed! Alleluia! Amen!

Peace

Leader: The love and peace of Christ be with you! People: And also with you!

Leader: I invite you to pass the love and peace of Christ to one another by greeting and welcoming each other. Remember to send some of that love and peace to those worshiping remotely

WE PROCLAIM

John 20: 11-18

Reader: We take up where we left off, with Mary standing weeping outside the tomb...

As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus.

Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher).

Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Leader: What love you have given us in your Son Jesus Christ! Your Spirit poured out through him, as he brought good news, proclaimed freedom, healed, and fed. His life of love shows us the way. His life of love delivers us from false hopes. His life, death, and resurrection offered ultimate and enduring love.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of this love in Jesus Christ, we offer our love completely as we proclaim the mystery of faith. All: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again!

Leader: God of love, pour out your love and spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the love of Christ, so that we may be for the world the love of Christ!

> By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet.
