Steering Without Oars Leadership Planning Team From Don Penrod shared at the Semi-Annual Meeting on June 11, 2023



Good morning! The Steering without Oars committee started meeting over a year ago and then the Leadership Planning Team (LPT) was formed and we met starting in October of 2022. Pastor Kris asked me to speak to you about our time together. I think I can condense the year into about an hour.....so buckle up and sit tight (Pause)....just kidding. My goal is to take you on a brief journey to help you better understand the work that has been done and what lies ahead for all of us.

The LPT is made up of your fellow congregants and Pastors Kris and Kayli. We have young and old members! It's what we do here...always looking for a diverse line of thought. Our focus...the core of our work boils down to how do we, as Union UCC, remain RELEVENT, ENGAGED, and GROW. Our church has been through so much in its rich history. I truly believe that our founders would be very proud of all we have accomplished and our continued growth. I'm not sure that they could have ever imagined that the church and organized religion would be at a crossroads like we are today. We are strong, but we cannot rest on our laurels. If we stop growing personally and as a church, our Savior's life and word dies with us. This bible passage sums up my thoughts: "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."—Matthew 5:14-16 (ESV) Basically, we need to BE THE LIGHT!

Let's start from the beginning. During our first meeting, we introduced the idea of an elevator speech. It centers around 3 questions: What are we doing? Why are we here? How do we tell others? It gave us a chance to put into words how we feel about our church family, this beautiful building, and our faith...to describe our pride and love of Christ. Jason Klinger, by far, had one of the best elevator speeches. Let me invite him up here to read it to you....Jason. I challenge each of you to think of your own elevator speech. It is a great way to talk about our church and the passion you have for Union UCC.

Later that day we all got to play with Playdoh. We created little works of art as individuals, but then we got to come back and work together as a table to create something new. It was a great way to get our creative juices flowing...we definitely found out that some of us should not be art teachers! We ended the day by working with Joe Kornfeind on our Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats; usually called a SWOT analysis. Strengths and Weaknesses are things we have control over, and Opportunities and Threats are stuff that we don't have control over. Somethings were placed in multiple buckets; for example, technology was an Opportunity and a Threat. A strength was we are welcoming, and a weakness was that we are a very humble organization. We got to dig deeper into the list and really look at who we are as an organization. Ultimately, it will help to guide us as we identify areas that we need to work on and look for ways to grow.

In a later meeting, our group got together to have dinner and watch The Way movie. I highly recommend that you watch it. It is truly inspirational. It's all about family and friends and how we navigate this complex world we live in. The movie is all about a real pilgrimage...walking the Camino de Santiago. In the end, Tom, the main character, learns what it means to be a citizen of the world again. You might be asking, "well what does this have to do with our church and the LPT?" As Pastor Kris alluded to earlier, we are on our own journey...a boat without oars. We could be complacent and just wither on the vine or we could continue to grow just as our forefathers wanted and as Jesus asked of us. GO be the light!

When we got together for another meeting, Pastor Kris waved a magic wand and told us to think of our dreams and God's dreams as if there was nothing in our way...the sky is the limit...it was our miracle question. There were close to 100 ideas laid out and put up on the boards. We ultimately narrowed it down to four:

- 1. Memorial Hall Renovation
- 2. Van to reach younger, older and invite diversity into our congregation,
- 3. Youth building/safe space/community center
- 4. Staffing around social worker/health care advocate/mental health

These ideas may or may not come to fruition, but it gave us a chance to dream and think about "what if". If you remember, our new addition came from a very similar activity a few years back. Exciting things can and do happen when we work together.

During our next meeting, we wanted to get grounded again, so we discussed our Mission Statement and our Core Values. From there, we looked at our plan for Ministry and Mission and how we need to update and revise some of the plan. The team delved into each group's plan and broke them apart. It was determined that some groups will need to merge or be reinvented. Each committee will be tasked with creating 2-3 new initiatives for the year and they will report back to consistory and share their progress on an on-going basis. There was a lot of great energy around these activities. We have a great foundation to build upon and expand. Change is hard and difficult, but it is necessary. A diamond is not created until a piece of coal is put under immense pressure and heat, then it is cut, grinded and polished. We are that unfinished diamond. We are using our Father's words to sculpt and polish us.

In May, the LPT worked on our WHY. Pastor Kris showed us a video clip from Michael JR—Know Your Why. Michael was talking to his audience and one of the members was a Director of Music. He asked the man to sing a verse or two of Amazing Grace. He did a really nice job. Michael then asked the guest to sing it as if he got shot in the back and like his uncle just got released from prison. When the guest sang it the second time, the hair on your body raised up. It was very powerful and moving! The WHY changed everything. This lesson was very impactful because we learned how having a WHY can drive you and keep you focused. It brings your passion to the front and helps lead you. Pastor Kris asked us what would you say if another church member asked us what we've been doing and WHY. We got together in smaller groups and wrote some ideas down and then we created a WHY statement. We shared them with the larger group and collected them for further use later. It's important to note that everyone's WHY will be different, but it will still bring us together. This diversity of thought is what makes us so special and unique. We respect each other's opinions and ideas even though they may not reflect our own thoughts and ideas. In today's society, this is something that needs to be mirrored and taught because it is almost becoming a lost art. In Matthew 7:12 (ESV), we are told, "so whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets." And in Ephesians 4:32, "be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."

On June 19th, our team will be presenting all of our work and findings to Consistory. It will be an exciting time as we continue this journey of renewal and rebirth.

Let me leave you with one last bible verse that will remind us that we need to trust God with our future: Psalm 37:3-5 "Trust in the Lord, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness. Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him, and he will act."

My ask is that you continue to be the light of his word. Come be a part of this journey! Embrace it! Engage in it! Grow with us and bring others along the way. Together we can be so much more. This church is at the center of this community and at the cross section of these roads for a reason...all roads point to us...our Savior's words and teachings are the way.

GO AND BE THE LIGHT! Amen

I am highlighting the Mental Health Ministry Team* this month. It is important to erase the stigma of mental illness and this team helps to do that. It was established to provide resources and education to pastors and congregations on a variety of mental health concerns. 1. The WISE process, Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive and Encouraging to individuals identified with mental illness, through the UCC. 2. Education around counseling guidance and resources for ongoing counseling. 3. Breaking down the silos between community services and the local church. 4. Advocating for individuals with mental health conditions. 5. Addressing veterans and moral injury. 6. Providing resources for conversation and worship, and 7. Suicide prevention education

Before Covid flipped our world upside down, we successfully host two meal packing events packing over 200,000 meals! Many people have been asking, "Are we going to bring this event back?" In the next couple months we hope to answer that question by gaging the interest so please let us know what you think. A committee has been formed to help determine whether we are able to host again next spring. Hannah Minnich, Ryleigh Minnich, Eric Minnich, Ron Snyder, Ann Koren, Everett and Eliot Lightner are all part of the committee and are hoping we can! Please reach out to anyone of us if you are interested in helping in anyway. It is quite a commitment as each meal costs \$.30 so the total fund raising comes to about \$30,000. While this can be seen as a difficult goal these meals are desperately needed. Due to COVID and inflation the amount of child that die each day from hunger related caused has increased from 6,000, when we last hosted, to now 10,000!Please let me know if you would like to help and feel we should try and take on the challenge.



Welcome to staff, Hannah and Ryleigh Minnich, who are now the sub.




HANNAH MINNICH
