Sanctuary Updates to Sound and Video This has been a big year of upgrades.

- We added a new camera in the sanctuary for our online worship experience. It's been a huge improvement both in sound and video quality.
- The sanctuary sound system was also reviewed and refreshed, adding a new wireless microphone system.
- The outdoor portable system for the grove was overhauled with new speakers and a new mixer. The old sanctuary wireless microphone system will be used for outdoor worship.
- In October two flat screens will be installed in the sanctuary so that we can add to all that we do to make worship creative, relevant, and meaningful. This will allow us to project announcements, pictures, videos, and to interact with our online community in new ways.

Four large boxes of men's socks and underwear were delivered to the Allentown Rescue Mission. Both missions were very impressed with our generosity during the summer months.

The annual cleaning of the gutters and inspection and repairs to the slate roof was done in J une. The lawn maintenance crew makes a weekly appearance to mow the lawn. around the church. The elevator receives maintenance on a quarterly basis.

Inside the building, our caretakers Ori a nd Shelly Handwerk have been busy all summer in cleaning all of the rooms, moving all the chairs, tables, and otherfumiture and then waxing the floors or deep cleaning the rugs. Nice shiny floors and clean rugs are ready for everyone to use this fall, and ultimately make dirty. Thanks of gratitude are in order to Ori and Shelly for their dedication in keeping our building clean.

Outside the build ing, the painting crews have been busy this past J uly and August. They are painting the exterior of the sanctuary, bell tower, and comer spires. They are also giving all of the metal railings along the stairs a thorough sanding, then painting with a primercoat and final black coat. The finished railings are looking great. This project is being funded through the Funds of Lasting Gifts endowment fund.

Finally, five new insulated Pella Windows are being installed in the lowerlevel preschool hallway. This small project is a much-needed upgrade in this area of the building. Well, that's the summer highlights of upgrades and repairs a round the Union UCC church property.

## Wider Church news:

The UCC General Synod met in Indiana 6/30-7/4 2023. This is a gathering of all the UCC's, in the US and the world, which meets every (2) years to offer up and pass resolutions, elect officers and carry out the business of the wider church. After 2025, they will meet every (3) years because of a By-laws change that passed by only one vote!
Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson was elected as General Minister \& President of the United Church of Christ. Of note is the fact that she is the first woman to be elected to lead the UCC, and not only the first woman, but the first woman of African descent! Many resolutions were passed including support for public school educators, academic freedom, \& equity efforts in schools, taking a stand against book banning, curriculum restrictions, and teacher harassment; Calling on UCC congregations to commit to harm reduction practices \& building communities of compassionate care \& partnership with people with lived experience of substance abuse. There was an update on the Racial Equity Task Force and the Youth focused on homelessness and food insecurity with hands-on activities.
