Sanctuary Updates to Sound and Video This has been a big year of upgrades.

- We added a new camera in the sanctuary for our online worship experience. It's been a huge improvement both in sound and video quality.
- The sanctuary sound system was also reviewed and refreshed, adding a new wireless microphone system.
- The outdoor portable system for the grove was overhauled with new speakers and a new mixer. The old sanctuary wireless microphone system will be used for outdoor worship.

• In October two flat screens will be installed in the sanctuary so that we can add to all that we do to make worship creative, relevant, and meaningful. This will allow us to project announcements, pictures, videos, and to interact with our online community in new ways.



#### **PNEC Ambassador Corner**

The annual Fall meeting of the PNEC was held November 4<sup>th</sup>. Sixty-nine [69] of the Conference's [125] churches were represented. Besides the general business of the meeting, three o the four PA Conference Ministers and an Associate Conference Minister were present to discuss the work of the Keystone Study/Work Group [KSWG] which has been meeting to discern the future of Pennsylvania's UCC Conferences as how best to serve PA's local UCC churches. The KSWG is made up of the [4] PA Conference Ministers and [4-6] members from each of the four Conferences.

They have looked at several options as a model for the future and have decided that one Pennsylvania Conference, the Keystone Conference is the best model to fulfill the Mission "to provide better spiritual, educational, programmatic and financial support to our congregations'. They decided on their WHY, "Together We Are Stronger, the Keystone Conference". There is still much work to be done and sub-teams have been formed to delve into the Governance, Legal, Process/Administration, and Financial aspects of such a change. There was discussion and many questions were raised, some of which could be answered immediately and some of which the answers are not yet known.

The timeline moving forward involves:

Question/answer sessions within each Conference, Spring meeting of all four PA Conferences together in June to present: Draft Constitution, Staffing model, Financial information, Legal parameters and a Draft Resolution, State-wide vote, by Conference, next November 9<sup>th</sup>, Provisional Resolution for Synod by October 31, 2024, to be presented to General Synod in 2025, [if the vote is No on 11/9/2024, the Resolution to Synod will be pulled and the team's work will be done], and Be functioning as the Keystone Conference by January 1, 2026

This is a long process and has taken and is taking much thought and prayer. Please keep the process in your prayers as the KSWG moves forward. If you would like further information, you may access the Keystone website <u>https://psec.org/keystone/</u> where you will find a summary of the group's work and meeting reports. #### Sixth Street Shelter

Located in Center City Allentown, Sixth Street Shelter provides safe, short-term housing for families who are experiencing homelessness of any configuration and size, this includes mothers, fathers, girls, boys, multi- generational families, or those from the LGBTQ- community. The Sixth Street Shelter is a program of Community Action Lehigh Valley. Their goal is to assist families with secure housing through family-centered services, in-house programming, and referrals to community resources. They help guests grow as an individual and a family unit, increase academic progress, find work, find affordable housing, so they can be successful when they leave. The property has 25 private apartments, a family resource center, playground, and full-choice food pantry for residents.

#### World Central Kitchen

World Central Kitchen is a not-for-profit non-governmental organization devoted to providing meals in the wake of natural disasters. Founded in 2010 by chef Jose' Andres, its operation is to be a first responder and then to collaborate and find solutions with local chefs to solve the problem of hunger, immediately following a disaster. Since its founding, they have organized meals in the Dominican Republic, Nicaragua, Zambia, Peru, Cuba, Uganda, The Bahamas, Cambodia, Ukraine, Puerto Rico, the United States, and most recently Morocco, Turkey, Syria, and Hawaii. In August 2023, World Central Kitchen set up kitchens in Maui in relief of those in Lahaina and West Maui who lost family members, businesses and homes. They provided over 6000 meals per day with the help of volunteers.

#### From the Mission Committee:

Holy Joe's Café- Since 2006, Holy Joe's Café has been sending free coffee to US military bases around the world. Their mission is simple: serving a little bit of home to those who serve our country. From humble beginning in a church in Wallingford, Connecticut, they have grown to serve billions of cups of coffee to troops around the world. Where the troops go, they go.

"The coffee is a force multiplier for the Chaplain Corps." said Chaplain Captain Keith Manry, 36th Wing chaplain. "Every time they have a cup of coffee, they are reminded that somebody cares about them." In the last decade, Holy Joe's Café has grown immensely. They currently ship coffee and supplies to hundreds of military bases, hospitals, hangar bays, aid stations and any setting where needed. Today, thousands of free cups of coffee are served to our troops in 70 countries throughout the world.

A \$500 donation is being provided to Holy Joe's Café through your Mission Offerings.

Rolling Fork Rising - In March 2023, the city of Rolling Fork, Mississippi was struck by a mile wide EF4 tornado, with winds up to 190 miles per hour. The tornado hit the center of town, destroying more than 250 homes and taking the lives of 14 people. Rolling Fork Rising began with a vision to help rebuild homes in Rolling Fork, to provide an opportunity for renters to return as homeowners. They currently own 17 lots and 18 acres in the city limits. Construction is underway on two houses, with three more foundations poured and ready to start. Framing components are ready in a warehouse to be sent to the construction site. Their organization is similar to Habitat for Humanity, helping families to become home owners and to improve the local community. The Mission Committee and the Consistory has approved for a \$1,000 donation be provided to Rolling Fork Rising, with funding from the Funds of Lasting Gifts endowment fund.


