## Welcome

### Becoming Present — the Ritual of Light

What Can I Give Him Arr. Mark Hayes

*Leader:* Welcome, friends, to this special night when we celebrate the birth of Jesus. This year in this church, we have been spending time preparing for this night by becoming more “present.” You can see we have many presents here in the sanctuary. Being surrounded by them all Advent long has helped us be inspired to be more present — to ourselves, to each other, and to God. It all started with the idea that we can spend a lot of time worrying about finding the perfect Christmas gifts. Deep down we want people in our lives to know they are special and that we love them. But sometimes we overlook the greatest gift of all... our very presence. Relationship is the most needed gift in our world. Loneliness and isolation is, according to some experts, the “pandemic of our time.” So no matter how able you are to offer gifts that the world considers “valuable,” really what we need the most is simply to “be with.” That is what one of the names for Jesus — “Emmanuel” — means: “God with us.” And this is the best gift of all.

*Reader:* We have unwrapped a present on each

The gift of hope is an essential survival tool because it reminds us that the hard times do not have the last word.

The gift of Christ's peace reminds us that we can have peace even in the midst of non-peaceful situations.

The gift of joy is not the equivalent of happiness, but rather the deep call to delight in the small things.

The gift of love is the clarion call to us as Jesus' disciples. The more love we put into the world, the better the world will be.

And tonight we celebrate the presence of the Light among us.

### **Scripture Gospel Reading Luke 2: 1-14, (15-20)**

Reader: As we have considered the presence of God, we have encountered an image that winds itself through the scriptures — that of the gentle presence of the Holy holding us close as a shepherd holds a lamb. And tonight the image of those shepherds — who know how to care deeply in each present moment with the flock — are again at the center of the story. They are the ones who first hear the Good News. And while the light initially frightens them, they run toward it, not away. Hear the story from the Gospel of Luke:

In those days, Caesar Augustus published a decree ordering a census of the whole Roman world. This first census took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All the people were instructed to go back to the towns of their birth to register. And so Joseph went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to “the city of David” — Bethlehem, in Judea, because Joseph was of the house and lineage of David; he went to register with Mary, his espoused wife, who was pregnant. While they were there, the time came for her delivery. She gave birth to her firstborn, a son; she put him in a simple cloth wrapped like a receiving blanket, and laid him in a feeding trough for cattle, because there was no room for them at the inn. There were shepherds in the area living in the fields and keeping night watch by turns over their flock. The angel of God appeared to them, and the glory of God shone around them; they were very much afraid. The angel said to them, “You have nothing to fear! I come to proclaim good news to you — news of a great joy to be shared by the whole people. Today in David’s city, a savior — the Messiah — has been born to you. Let this be a sign to you: you’ll find an infant wrapped in a simple cloth, lying in a manger.” Suddenly, there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in high heaven! And on earth, peace to those on whom God’s favor rests.” When the angels had returned to heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let’s go straight to Bethlehem and see this event that God has made known to us.” They hurried and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger; once they saw this, they reported what they had been told concerning the child. All who heard about it were astonished at the report given by the shepherds. Mary treasured all these things and reflected on them in her heart. The shepherds went away glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, just as they had been told.

*Leader:* In our time of prayers during this Advent and Christmas season, we have been taking the opportunity to practice being fully present in the moment. Mindfulness has deep roots in our Judeo-Christian tradition. The scriptures say "be still and know that I am God." Prayer is an intentional way to sink deeply into the sense of the presence of God among us.



I'd like to invite all of you into a quiet reflection on three questions, each followed by a short silence. Focusing intentionally on thoughts and memories can be a kind of prayer, bringing our lives into a conversation with the Holy. I invite you to take a deep breath and close your eyes if you are comfortable doing that.

The first question is this: Who has been a gift of presence in your life? Whose presence feels like a holy gift for you? Take a moment to see their face or faces emerge in your mind's eye like opening a gift. It may be a memory of someone or a present reality.

The second question is this: In what ways do you try to offer yourself as a gift of presence? What does it feel like when you extend your attentiveness and availability beyond yourself? What difference does it make to someone else for you to be truly present to them?

The third question is this: Is it possible that God's presence is felt more acutely in these moments when we truly tend to one another? As if you are doing last-minute shopping for just the right gift, can you imagine right now how you can, in the future, be a Gift of Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and Light — letting these gifts flow through you to someone else? It may be as simple as finding opportunities to speak an encouraging word. Or as complex as actually lifting up someone's circumstances through volunteering or donating.

**World Central Kitchen** -World Central Kitchen is a not-for-profit non-governmental organization devoted to providing meals in the wake of natural disasters. They have organized meals in the Dominican Republic, Nicaragua, Zambia, Peru, Cuba, Uganda, The Bahamas, Cambodia, Ukraine, Puerto Rico, the United States, and most recently Morocco, Turkey, Syria, and Hawaii. In August 2023, World Central Kitchen set up kitchens in Maui and provided over 6000 meals per day with the help of volunteers.

## **Holy Communion**

### **Invitation to the Table**

Leader: Everyone is welcome to this meal of love and grace. You will be served in your seats. Please wait to eat and drink until the Pastor invites you to do so.

If you are at home, we invite you to find something to eat and drink that represents communion for you.

A non-gluten option with juice is available in a prepackaged container on the bread tray. Both red wine and white grape juice are on the tray of cups. Please choose either.

Leader: We are all invited to this table of Jesus. This is one of the ways that we acknowledge the continual gift of his presence with us. We remember the rituals of his Last Supper with his disciples in which he offered a poignant invitation for all of his followers to be together at meals, break bread and lift cups, and know that we are never alone. This is the invitation now. The gift of presence — with each other and with Christ. This is the mystical union that binds us to Christ, present in this moment, and to all who have ever gathered at this table... no matter where, or when.

### **Confession and Assurance**

Leader: There are times when we have cut ourselves off from this gift of presence. We distance ourselves from the light that is ours as heirs in the family of God. It seems too

wonderful a gift. And yet the Shepherd comes to find us, leading us gently back into safety, back into care, back into relationship. In this moment, we take a deep breath, we feel our bodies relax into the right here, and right now, and we acknowledge those regrets that are best let go...

Know this... there are gifts with your name on them called "Grace," called "Forgiveness," called "Assurance." They are yours whenever you accept and open them. They are already and always there for you... you do not have to "be good enough" to get them. They are there because that is the nature of our loving God, God-with-us, Emmanuel.

Leader: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here,  
and on these gifts of bread and wine.  
Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ,  
so that we may be for the world the body of Christ,  
redeemed by his love.

By your Spirit make us one with Christ,  
one with each other,  
and one in ministry to all the world,  
until Christ comes in final victory  
and we feast at his heavenly banquet.
