Reverse Advent Baskets



December 18, 2023, Consistory Actions:

These notes reflect items that needed action and approval by Consistory. Standing and routine items are reported by Committees and Staff throughout the newsletter. A complete copy of the Consistory minutes can be found in the church office.

Requested approvals:

Eliot Lightner presented information on Feed My Starving Children for approval to move forward with the event in March 2024. Consistory approved the event at the 100,000 meal level.

In November Church and Ministry presented a proposal for Union to become a certified Open and Affirming [O&A] church. Consistory approved moving forward with the process at their December meeting. The timeline involves Church & Ministry drafting a Covenant Statement to be reviewed by Consistory and the LPT at their January retreat with a vote for final approval at the February Consistory/LPT meeting.

All of the above were approved unanimously.
