We Acknowledge What's Up

You Raise Me Up

Leader: Lent is often known as a time of giving something up in order to make room in our lives for spiritual pursuits. Rather than just "giving up" in Lent, the scriptures ask us to consider all that Jesus is "up to" and all that he asks us to be up to in his name. Instead of bemoaning what we can't do, or used to do, in a culture where "measuring up" to external standards seems impossible, this Lent we will celebrate the small things that we can do right now to respond to God's call in our place, for our time.

As we begin this Lent season, we contemplate the essence and the substance of our lives. Do we spend time reaching for "must haves" that our culture says we need? Or are we

storing up the things that bring us closer to the reign of God, the good things — the treasures — that fill us and others with well-being of body, mind, and spirit?

Meditative Moment

Leader: There is assurance that God will grant mercy and restore joy. Hear what the Psalmist requests:

Have mercy on me, God, according to your faithful love! Wipe away my wrongdoings according to your great compassion! Wash me completely clean of my guilt; purify me from my sin... Create a clean heart for me, God; put a new, faithful spirit deep inside me! Please don't throw me out of your presence; please don't take your holy spirit away from me. Return the joy of your salvation to me and sustain me with a willing spirit... Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will proclaim your praise. You don't want sacrifices. If I gave an entirely burned offering, you wouldn't be pleased. A broken spirit is my sacrifice, God. You won't despise a heart, God, that is broken and crushed. (Psalm 51, excerpts)

The Word Uplifts

Scripture Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-21

Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Abba in heaven.

But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Abba who is in secret; and your Abba who sees in secret will reward you.

Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

BUILDING UP

Up to Something Good An Ash Wednesday Ritual

<u>Let My Prayers Rise Up</u> Marty Haugen

Leader: Let us sing Psalm 141 as our song of preparation for the imposition of ashes. First we will listen to our choir sing it once and then we'll repeat the refrain: Let my prayer rise up like incense before you, the lifting up of my hands as an offering to you.

Leader: The imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday is a Christian tradition implemented in the 11th century when Ash Wednesday was added to the liturgical calendar. The reference to ashes as part of a tradition of penitence was connected with wearing sackcloth in the book of Daniel. In those early days of marking Ash Wednesday, those who had been ousted from the church would wear sackcloth and ashes all through Lent until they rejoined the church on Maundy Thursday by receiving the holy meal once again with the faithful.

We don't believe in ousting people from the church. We are all in need of reconnection with Divine Love and our church is a place where mercy is the order of every day. But on Ash Wednesday we remember that we are not mythical gods. We are not perfect and we will not live forever. This year we commit to making the most out of our one, precious life by being up to something good. Rather than give something up as penitence this year, we are focusing on the little things that lift up our lives and the lives of others. Like the incense the psalmist writes about in Psalm 141, even the smallest actions of our lives can elevate us all to a higher plane of love, mercy, and justice. These, then are the treasures we must store up. Let our ashes this day remind us of how precious is our time together on this earth.
