



### Pastor Kayli's Sabbatical Journey

Every five years, our pastoral staff is allowed the opportunity to get 12 weeks of sabbatical time. This is a time of rest and spiritual rejuvenation. Last summer, I took my first 4 weeks of sabbatical, and this May & July I will finish out my time.

During my time away (May 13-June 9 & July 1-July 28) I plan to find ways to reconnect to my spiritual growth and journey. I'm hopeful to find creative outlets that will connect my desire for creativity with my spiritual well being. I'm grateful for the opportunity to rest my body, mind, and soul to be able to better serve the wonderful people of Union UCC.

### From the Property Committee

Over the past twenty years, the property committee has overseen many large repairs and improvements to the church property, usually one large project a year. Some projects are very visible to everyone, examples are the new rug in the sanctuary, the exterior painting of the church, a new slate roof to the church, and painting of classrooms. Some projects may not be so visible, but are just as important to the operation of the church property, examples are upgrades to the security system, upgrades to the chimney, upgrades to the air conditioning units.

The major project for this year is not visible, but very important to the church property. The 6,000 gallon underground oil tank, which is over 65 years old, is being refurbished to provide the church many more decades of useful service.

The property committee has been working on this project for the past two years. Boyko Petroleum of Whitehall is overseeing the project, with WCC Tank Technology Company of NY coming in to clean out the interior of the tank which includes sand blasting to clean the metal interior. After all is clean, they will spray a Polyester Blend Resin to the interior of the tank, creating a new rust free interior liner to prevent any future leaks.

Once completed, Boyko Petroleum will cover up the tank with existing ground, re-install the sidewalks, and refill the tank with oil. A three day project completed by professionals, with months of planning ahead of the project. Truly a "Dirty Job", too bad Mike Rowe could not stop for a visit.

This project is a very proactive improvement to our church property to allow for the safe storage of oil in an underground tank. The oil tank project was funded by the Funds of Lasting Gifts Endowment Fund. Thank you to the FOLG trustees and all donor families to the Funds of Lasting Gifts. We are blessed to be able to use earnings from the endowment fund to make important upgrades to the church property which will last years and decades into the future.

#### **PNEC Ambassador Corner**

One of Union's initiatives coming out of the LPT work is mental health/wellness. During our worship services on Sunday, May 26<sup>th</sup> we will be lifting up mental health. Please plan to be in worship as we acknowledge this important facet of our lives. Also, in October, Union will be hosting a Mental Health workshop, put on by the PNEConference.

### 2024 Summer Conference Meeting

"For the first time, all four Pennsylvania conferences of the UCC will be gathering for a shared Meeting on June 7-9, 2024 at The Penn Stater in State College, PA. We will have shared worship, workshops, meals and meetings as well as each conference's separate business meeting.

Below is a letter from the four PA UCC Conference Ministers **about this year's Summer Meeting:** The planning committee for the Keystone State UCC Conference Summer Meeting has been working diligently to prepare for our June 7-9 meeting. The Keystone Working Group in collaboration with the Conference Ministers have been seeking grants and additional funding to assist with the costs of the meeting.

We want you to know that YOUR attendance is vitally important to us. We need you to help us plan for the future of our conferences. Our General Minister and President, the Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson will be with us on Saturday and Sunday, and we hope you will be with us to meet her and worship with her on Sunday.

The costs for this meeting will be significantly higher than our usual conference meetings. For one thing, this is a 3-day meeting and incorporates the extensive use of technology and the Penn Stater multiple room assignments for our gathering. We do not want the cost of the event to prevent anyone from attending.

Therefore, we are increasing our scholarship funds to cover ½ the cost of the registration. The registration materials (which are forthcoming) include some links for additional hotel locations, should you choose to utilize them.

Also, we want you to know that our meetings as a Keystone Conference will likely be shorter and less costly.

Please make plans to join us in State College in June and celebrate the work we are doing together, because we believe "Together We Are Stronger."

### Pastor Carrie's Corner

As the LPT moves forward in their discussions on how we at Union can best serving our congregation and wider community, my focus has turned to mental health and well-being. I have joined the Penn Northeast Conference's Mental Health Ministry Team and will support their Mental Health Sunday initiative on May 26, I am certified in Youth Mental Health First Aid, and continue to facilitate GreifShare groups as well as community mental health and well-being events.

Here's a tip that may help parents (and all of us!): NYU social psychologist Jonathan Haidt sees anxiety and depressive disorders sharply increased after the introduction of the iPhone and Instagram with an alarming rate of *double* the suicides and self-harm in teens.

He recommends limiting or denying access to smartphones and social media, particularly in middle school. Create phone-free opportunities for social interaction among friends and family (we have lots of opportunities here!).

For younger children, he suggests making a pact with other parents to not purchase smartphones for your children. If their friend group doesn't have them, your child won't feel like the outcast. Those parents are concerned too!

And for us adults, we can be drawn into the spiral of social media just as easily. Shut down the apps, get outside, call a friend, read a book...do anything that allows freedom from the screen. Find the joy in life, not in "likes!"

- 2. The other option (or in addition to the first option) is to attend a new member gathering. This is a chance to meet with me and with other members and hear why they love their church and love to serve God here.
