Awe is a profound emotional response that can significantly impact our wellbeing and perception of the world. Awe often arises from experiences that transcend our usual understanding, such as viewing vast landscapes, listening to powerful music, encountering extraordinary acts of kindness, or feeling heightened devotion and a Divine Presence connecting us all. To be a "Purveyor of Awe" is to be intentional about curating a life of spiritual depth. This has implications not only for one's own life, but also as motivation to tend to the wellbeing of others. Let us approach this Lent with awe as we explore the elements of Beauty, Wonder, Meaning, Curiosity, Delight, Connection, and Self-Giving.

A purveyor is someone who spreads or promotes a particular idea or who deals in a particular good.

Welcome to Union UCC!

Reader: 'Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb."

So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus's head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed, for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Then the disciples returned to their homes. But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb, and she saw two angels in white sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him."

When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away."

Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in

Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not touch me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Leader: We have journeyed for several weeks reminding ourselves that life and the world is full of awe. We have seen beauty, we have opened to wonder, we have searched for meaning with curiosity, we have delighted in the gifts of the Divine One, we have reconnected with each other and remembered the joy of self-giving on behalf of a better world. This morning is the most awe-filled of all. Our faith story is ultimately about the victory of life over death.

Contemporary Reading

Reader: We have been studying the work of researchers and mystics who help us understand the importance, no matter the world's circumstances, of retaining, maintaining, and developing our sense of awe. This has implications for our spiritual wellbeing and contributes to making the world a better place, inspiring us to acts of self-giving and service. In a nutshell, experiencing awe prompts people to help others as well as sustaining our own spirits.

Today's reading is from a songwriter, songs are some of the best ways to help us remember God's awe. The words are from a song from a song by Andrew Ripp called Love's Got A Way. The first verse says:

> I let go long ago Thinking I knew everything I let love in my soul Started listening to the choir sing

When I laid down all my pride Was a death that saved my life And that's how I know The darkest nights still end with the sun rise

And the second verse is:

The truth of its nature Is always give and never take It flows with that freedom Surrendering itself away Carves canyons through the stone Tells the rivers to run home And that's how I know There's a hand in mine walking this long road

The chorus sings these words: 'Cause love's got a way Of bringing healing to a heart in pain Making beauty from the ashes Breaking chains one after another Putting old lies to shame Love's got a way Of looking straight into the eyes of hate Still believing that a world can change Hold on my sisters and brothers The mountain looks too great But love's got a way

Ancient Reading

Reader: Our Holy Scriptures from the Bible are indeed ancient, but continue to have something to teach us in this time and place. Hear this ancient reading from Colossians chapter 3, verses 1 to 4 and 12 to 17.

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, 3for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. 4When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

12 As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. 13Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. 14Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. 15And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. 16Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. 17And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

The precious nature of fleeting life and time reminds us that all of it is beautifulthe joy and the heartbreak.

There is wonder here.

We are wide-eyed as we soak in Jesus' invitation, reminding us that each person is offered graceno matter who we are or what we aren't sure about.

There is meaning here.

What feels at times devoid of sense is made whole as we are reminded that our very existence has purpose before we even become aware of it.

There is curiosity here.

Jesus sometimes surprised people with his invitations, reminding us that we belong already, even and especially because we don't already have things figured out.

There is delight here.

Can you imagine being in the presence of Jesus, not just at the Last Supper, but at any table where he was present? His light is surely our delight.

There is connection here. When we gather at this table, we are reminded of connections to all times and places that people have gathered in the name of Christ.

Indeed, it was Jesus' own self-giving that prompted his words over the elements at the table, and we become a part of that self-giving story as we gather here. And so, come, come to this moment of awe. We approach the beauty, wonder, and meaning with curiosity, delight, connection, and self-giving.

Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and awe-filled thing, always and everywhere, to give thanks to you, Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth. With wonder, we muse at how you formed us in your Image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast.

You delivered us from captivity, made covenant to be our sovereign God, and spoke to us through your prophets.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so,

in remembrance of your wonder-filled acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in self-giving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, so that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

By your Spirit, seal our connection with Christ, our connection with each other, and our connection to all the world through our ministry and mission as God's people and church. **Amen.**
