

Union United Church of Christ – Narrative Budget


The following is a summary of the church's total income and expenses for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.

Contributions, Special Offerings and Gifts



- Regular Weekly Offering are gifts received through envelopes and plate offerings and comprise half of our income (50%)
- Allocations from the Funds of Lasting Gifts (FOLG) target specific program, education, and evangelism needs per bequest guidelines and comprise an important portion of the church's total overall income (23%)
- Special Envelopes, including holiday giving, comprise 5% of our income while gifts received through the special Mission and Outreach and other mission envelopes and activities are about 10% of our income
- Miscellaneous contributions include building rent and donations, interest earnings, and other gifts and comprise 10% of our income
- Program giving includes gifts from our education programs such as Sunday School and Preschool (<1%)
- Fundraisers, although a small percentage (2%), are an important component of our income

Where our Stewardship Giving Goes



- Worship and Music in our weekly and special services comprise a significant portion of overall spending (22%)
- Christian Education provides a variety of educational programs, events and activities for all ages to learn about Christian faith and comprises 6% of overall spending
- Our Mission and Outreach giving is focused on helping those in need, both in the local community and the world. Our support includes OCWM, local mission agencies and food banks, and other mission projects (18%)
- Our Member Ministries seeks to nurture, support and connect members in a variety of programs and ministries through numerous groups and committees (13%)
- Evangelism is focused on sharing the good news of the Gospel and comprises 5% of our spending
- Stewardship includes staff time and programs focused on how best we can use our time, talent, and resources in giving back to God and the Church (7%)
- Governance and Structure includes managing our staff and participating in the PNEC (4%)
- Spending on Facilities, the church building and property, is significant at 25% of overall spending but is critical in maintaining the church, its properties, and physical possessions, along with providing for the weekly/monthly operational costs.

Labyrinth Walks – at various times, open houses to stop by and retreat mornings or evenings.


Faith on Tap – a night of God, Food, and Drink at Kornfeind's Tavern with church and community friends.

You will need a receiver pack (turn it on) and ear piece (if you don't have a hearing aid) or a t-coil cord (if you have a hearing aid that is t-coil compatible.) Plug this into the receiver. At the end of worship, please return both pieces to the table and place the receiver back into the charger. Thank you to the Schlosser Family & Funds of Lasting Gifts for supporting this effort.

Food and Toiletry Donations: You're invited to bring non perishable food and toiletry donations at anytime to help our local food bank. Place items in the shopping cart in the lobby.
