The Chemo Bag Project:

On Sunday, July 20, 2025, a group of sixteen church members, neighbors and friends worked together to **complete 67 port pillows onsite in about 3 hours**. Plus, some participants took home to finish **dozens more** pieces that were cut or ready to stuff or ready to sew shut. **125 additional pillows** that people made at home were also dropped off in the church lobby. All of the pillows made at and donated via our church get included with other comfort and care items in the hundreds of Bag of Hope totes that The Chemo Bag delivers monthly to infusion centers throughout the Greater Lehigh Valley and surrounding areas. Unfortunately, there is that much ongoing need, just in our area.

Thanks, Deb, for explaining to us the benefit these pillows provide to patients with implanted chemotherapy ports and for teaching us to make the pillows. Thank you to the non-sewers who suggested that we organize group sessions in which they could help by cutting and prepping materials and bagging and tagging completed pillows! Thank you to all the home sewers and the group session sewers for providing your tools, materials, skills and time! Thank you to everyone who donated fabric, Velcro, thread, stuffing, baggies and printed paper inserts to supply our pillow making!

Dear Friends, Family, and Church Friends,

I never thought turning 60 could feel this good!

I am overwhelmed by your support of this fundraiser to erase medical debt. **Together we raised over \$10,000!** There is \$132 million dollars of debt in Pennsylvania alone. **We have helped to erase at least \$1 million of that debt in PA!**

I cried when the first donation came in 3 months ago and I've been crying almost every day since then with each of your donations. Hard tears, knowing that so many folks are struggling right now. And, good tears, knowing that together, we are bringing some ease, peace, and joy back into people's lives.

I think we often feel that alone there's not much we can do to make a difference in the world. But together, well together, and with God's help, we can do so much more. Which is what we just did in a simple yet important way.

Check out the website https://unduemedicaldebt.org to learn more about this agency's work and to hear the powerful stories of lives transformed by support like ours. One of the biggest gifts people receive is the repair of credit scores and the improvement of economic security allowing them to rebuild their lives. Some of you shared your own stories of knowing what this kind of debt is like. I think many of us are one crisis away from knowing this could be us.

Last year 5 churches in Bethlehem did this fundraiser. They raised \$25,000 and erased \$3 million dollars of debt. For just a moment, they erased ALL of the medical debt at that time that existed in the Lehigh Valley.

I wonder if the churches in our area would want to work together to make an even bigger impact on this concern and issue in the future? It's something to think about and pray about. Could we do even more together?

Thank you for joining me in honoring the life we live and the faith we walk with your incredible and powerful gift of presence, faith, hope, and love.
