A Story about Creativity

Luke 7:36-50 (CEB)

One of the Pharisees invited Jesus to eat with him. After he entered the Pharisee's home, he took his place at the table. Meanwhile, a woman from the city, a sinner, discovered that Jesus was dining in the Pharisee's house. She brought perfumed oil in a vase made of alabaster. Standing behind him at his feet and crying, she began to wet his feet with her tears. She wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and poured the oil on them. When the Pharisee who had invited Jesus saw what was happening, he said to himself, If this man were a prophet, he would know what kind of woman is touching him. He would know that she is a sinner.

Jesus replied, "Simon, I have something to say to you."

"Teacher, speak," he said.

"A certain lender had two debtors. One owed enough money to pay five hundred people for a day's work. The other owed enough money for fifty. When they couldn't pay, the lender forgave the debts of them both. Which of them will love him more?"

Simon replied, "I suppose the one who had the largest debt canceled."

Jesus said, "You have judged correctly."

Jesus turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? When I entered your home, you didn't give me water for my feet, but she wet my feet with tears and wiped them with her hair. You didn't greet me with a kiss, but she hasn't stopped kissing my feet since I came in. You didn't anoint my head with oil, but she has poured perfumed oil on my feet. This is why I tell you that her many sins have been forgiven; so she has shown great love. The one who is forgiven little loves little."

Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

The other table guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this person that even forgives sins?"

Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."

Video: Wild, Wild, Heart Bobby Jo Valentine

Lectio Divina

Mark 6:30-44 (NRSVUE)

Let us enter our practice in this series of the ancient Christian tradition called "lectio divina" of repeating a reading in order to understand more fully. The story of the multiplication of loaves and fishes is one that is teaching us many things about our relationship to Jesus and his call to creatively solve the problems we face. Hear this version now:

The apostles gathered around Jesus and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them.

As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things. When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; send them away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat." But he answered them, "You give them something to eat." They said to him, "Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give it to them to eat?" And he said to them, "How many loaves have you? Go and see." When they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish."

Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and blessed and broke the loaves and gave them to his disciples to set before the people, and he divided the two fish among them all. And all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.

Ritual of Offering: The Nest

Rev. Kathi McShane, the theologian-in-residence of The Changemaker Initiative, says this:

"Change happens in small ways. It takes indirect paths. It happens locally, among small groups of people who care about a problem, sometimes just one or two people working together. It doesn't face a big problem head-on; it pokes tiny holes at it from the edge, where the resistance is softer, where something small can change without taking on the whole, thorny problem."

In this third week of focusing on being Changemakers in the tradition of Jesus, we call upon our creativity with ease, not with anxiety. We don't have to come up with a grand scheme to obliterate injustice, no matter how much we wish we could. We are thinking of things that could make a small, ordinary, but important difference in our community, in people's lives. Again, these ideas are gestating as they wait to hatch someday. As we continue playing with this metaphor of tending the nest, what is continuing to develop in your imagination? What is one next, small step you can take—an experiment in changemaking that you can try and learn from?


