The Chemo Bag Project:

Inspired by a patient who explained to the congregation how helpful they are, people gather periodically at Union United Church of Christ in Neffs to make chemo port pillows that patients can wrap around car seatbelts and other shoulder straps to cushion and protect the port, implanted on the upper chest, that is used to deliver their chemotherapy with infusion drugs.

Each port pillow is sewn together using a 3" long unit of non-adhesive 5/8"-3/4" wide "Velcro," fiber fill or equivalent stuffing, and clean, washable, non-stretch fabric scraps that are at least 4"x7". One church member taught sewing friends to make the pillows with their stashes of scrap fabric at home. Non-sewing friends donated supplies and asked if they could also help make the pillows.

Together, a small group of them developed an assembly line-type system in which anyone can participate in some way, with no prior experience. Even people who can't be there in person contribute to the group process by preparing at home and/or donating supplies for the group to use. One person even helped from her hospital bed! She said she was glad to have something there to distract her and make her feel useful.

At the group port pillow making sessions, leaders show people who don't sew how to prepare the materials or stuff and bag the pillows as parts of the no-stress "assembly line." Everyone has fun working together. The number of people who have helped in person has already more than tripled, since the first group convened at Union UCC in June 2025. And the number of pillows made at each gathering has more than sextupled, with 159 completed onsite at the 3rd session on September 7, 2025. All the port pillows made at Union UCC get included in the "Bag of Hope" totes that local non-profit, The Chemo Bag, delivers monthly to infusion centers throughout the Greater Lehigh Valley

area. The group organizers at Union UCC hope to be able to contribute an on-



To facilitate that goal, donations of thread for machine sewing and Velcro intended for sewing, in addition to clean fabric that measures at least 4 inches by 7 inches, sandwich baggies, and printed copies of the paper inserts that are available in the church lobby, with the directions, would be greatly appreciated. The next group session will be after services on Sunday, November 16th. Details will be in the November newsletter and weekly announcements closer to the date.

What an exciting month we have had in Preschool! Our teachers worked so hard to make our classrooms beautiful. They have been creating lesson plans and ready getting materials gathered, finding just the right things to help the students get excited about learning. They have also been preparing the preschool space for our students. Each student has a color-coded name tag where they will hang their backpack and jacket, a mailbox to write notes to each other and family, and bulletin boards welcoming them to our school!

Our students arrived on their first days with bells on! They settled right in and got to work! As the great Fred Rogers said, "Play is often talked about as if it were a relief from serious learning. But for children, play is serious learning. Play is really the work of childhood." The students have been exploring the new centers we created in our classrooms and enjoying the prompts the teachers set up for them. I have observed budding scientists, artists, mathematicians, engineers, and musicians in just a few weeks of school! As the children, teachers, and I settle in to the new school year, we are all getting to know each other, what our favorite things are, and what we like to do!

The children have been learning all about what makes each of them unique by Identifying similarities and differences between themselves and their classmates. They have also been exploring emotions, including socially acceptable ways of handling the big feelings that come up around the first days of school! In the Three-Year-Old Preschool Class, the children are learning about making choices for themselves, being away from parents, and navigating sharing toys and space with other children. In the Four-Year-Old Preschool Class, the students are focusing on themselves as part of a family unit as well as part of a school community. In PreK, our older students are learning about what it means to be a good citizen, how we can be a good friend and neighbor, and who the helpers are in our towns and cities. We will all be learning about Fire Prevention in the coming month and are hoping for a visit from one of our local fire stations. This is usually a highlight of the year for the students!

We had an exciting family event on September 18th at Rolling Hills Mini Golf. The students and families had the chance to get to know one another and enjoy some mini golf and ice cream! The 3s have a field trip to Valley Fruits and Veg planned, and we are heading to Flint Hill Farm for the first time with our Four-Year-Old Preschool classes. Pre-k is set to visit The Museum of Indian Culture this month as well, another new experience for our students. We are always looking for community connections! 




Funeral Luncheon Hosts Needed

Connie Renner (non member) passed on August 6 and services were held on August 21st.




