A chemo port pillow is a small pillow that a patient can Velcro around a car seatbelt or other shoulder strap to cushion and protect the port, typically implanted on the upper chest, used to deliver chemotherapy drugs.

FUNDS OF LASTINGS GIFTS (FOLG)

Our church as been financially blessed by the generous donations from its members. We are able to pay our bills and make generous donations through our mission giving locally and around the world. But did you know that 20% of the operating budget is supported by the Funds of Lasting Gifts?

The Funds of Lasting Gifts is a collection of funds intended to preserve long-range financial reserves in keeping with the faith commitment opportunities before the congregation. FOLG provides a way to donate funds from one's accumulated assets (stocks, bonds, property, insurance, cash) whether it be through a will, a life income or trust arrangement, or direct giving. The funds are aligned with the values and interest of those making the donations, supporting the operating budget for items such as music, property, mission, education and more.

There are five elected Trustees and Treasurer who oversee the funds within the FOLG, following the guidelines of an Endowment Policy Statement. They meet Quarterly with the church's Investment Management Company, Raymond James, to review the investments and results as well as the overall financial details of income and fund disbursement.

Dear Friends, Family, and Church Friends,

I never thought turning 60 could feel this good!

I am overwhelmed by your support of this fundraiser to erase medical debt. Together we raised over \$10,000! There is \$132 million dollars of debt in Pennsylvania alone. We have helped to erase at least \$1 million of that debt in PA!

I cried when the first donation came in 3 months ago and I've been crying almost every day since then with each of your donations. Hard tears, knowing that so many folks are struggling right now. And, good tears, knowing that together, we are bringing some ease, peace, and joy back into people's lives.

I think we often feel that alone there's not much we can do to make a difference in the world. But together, well together, and with God's help, we can do so much more. Which is what we just did in a simple yet important way.

Check out the website https://unduemedicaldebt.org to learn more about this agency's work and to hear the powerful stories of lives transformed by support like ours. One of the biggest gifts people receive is the repair of credit scores and the improvement of economic security allowing them to rebuild their lives. Some of you shared your own stories of knowing what this kind of debt is like. I think many of us are one crisis away from knowing this could be us.

Last year 5 churches in Bethlehem did this fundraiser. They raised \$25,000 and erased \$3 million dollars of debt. For just a moment, they erased ALL of the medical debt at that time that existed in the Lehigh Valley.

I wonder if the churches in our area would want to work together to make an even bigger impact on this concern and issue in the future? It's something to think about and pray about. Could we do even more together?

Thank you for joining me in honoring the life we live and the faith we walk with your incredible and powerful gift of presence, faith, hope, and love.

Thanks to everyone who came to the party and to everyone who donated. Thank you for all the birthday love and care for this old lady.



Keystone Conference Resolution passes at General Synod!!

With the passing of the resolution to form the new Keystone Conference, there is much to be done to be operational by January 1, 2025. Finances and Staffing are some of the big items to be addressed.

FINANCES

For 2025, congregational and Individual gifts to OCWM funds stay in the PNEC and fund our staffing, programs. And support from Congregational or Individual gifts to *Friends of PNEC* for 2025 also stay in PNEC to support conference programming.

For 2026, Congregational and Individual gifts to OCWM funds will go to the Keystone Conference for staffing, program and support; but Congregational and Individual gifts to Friends of the Association (was Conference) in 2026 will stay with PNE to provide funding for association programming and services.

Support for Committee on Ministry work in 2025 is supported by PNEC while support for Committee on Ministry work in 2026 is supported by the Keystone Conference

TRANSITIONAL STAFFING - BEGINNING IN JANUARY 2026

The new Keystone Board will consider several candidates who have experience working with local churches and have expressed interest in the *transitional* full-time ministerial positions.

The transitional staff will be contracted by the Keystone Board in the fall of 2025 beginning with the Transitional Executive Conference Minister.

That Transitional Executive Conference Minister, with the Personnel Committee and the Transitional Board will complete interviews with the transitional ordained and administrative staff so that the individuals can begin in January 2026. We anticipate 12-18 months of transition so that work can continue. After that point searches for settled staff will begin.

The administrative positions may be hired for "settled" administrative staff during the first months or year of the transition.

SETTLED STAFFING TO BEGIN SOMETIME IN 2027

There will be search committees formed for all the called positions in the Keystone Conference which include:

1. Executive Conference Minister

2. Three Regional Ministers

Leadership and Faith Formation position – part-time

These will be open searches which may include those who have served as transitional staff, but their continued employment/call is not guaranteed.


